- 3 is April 24th, year 2001, Jefferson City, Missouri. There
- 4 is no operation of law date here. This is the Director of

- 4 you are a corporation, you must be represented by an
- 5 attorney.
- 6 MR. MURR: I'm not a corporation. We're an
