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0296 PROCEEDINGS 1 2 JUDGE RUTH: Let's go on the record. 3 Good afternoon. My name is Vicky Ruth, and I'm the 4 regulatory law judge assigned to this case. Today's 5 date is September 29th, 2005, and it's a few minutes 6 after 2:00. We are here for a conference in Case TO-2003-0257 in the matter of the request from the 7 8 customers in the Rockaway Beach exchange for an 9 expanded calling scope to make toll-free calls to 10 Branson. 11 This conference was scheduled to give 12 the parties an opportunity to discuss the case, 13 including what the next procedural steps will be. 14 The conference actually started at 1:30. Due to 15 technical difficulties, we were not able to 16 immediately go on the record. And present for that 17 conference were the parties, myself and Commissioner 18 Robert Clayton. It was my understanding that at that 19 time the parties preferred to address a few matters 20 off the record rather than waiting until the court 21 reporter was available. Is that your understanding 22 also, parties? 23 MR. DORITY: Would you like us to enter 24 our appearances, Judge? Would that be helpful? 25 JUDGE RUTH: Yes, enter your appearance

0297 and then note whether, number one, if there's 1 2 anything you want to add or restate from the 3 conference that we had or if you had any concerns 4 about the procedure that we just followed. 5 And Mr. Poston, I'll start with you. 6 MR. POSTON: Marc Poston for the staff 7 and the Commission, and I have no concerns, and I do 8 agree that we had agreed to go off the record and 9 continue discussions. 10 MR. DORITY: Thank you, Judge. 11 Appearing on behalf of CenturyTel of Missouri, LLC, 12 Larry Dority, Fischer & Dority, P.C. Our address is 13 101 Madison Street, Suite 400, Jefferson City, 14 Missouri 65101, and participating with me today are 15 Arthur Martinez and Becky Powell of Century-Tel of 16 Missouri. 17 MR. DANDINO: Michael Dandino, Office of the Public Counsel, Post Office Box 2230, Jefferson 18 19 City, Missouri, 65102, representing the Office of Public Counsel and the public. Barbara Meisenheimer 20 is also attending this meeting, this hearing with me. 21 22 Public counsel has no objections and no concerns 23 about the procedure the Commission followed in this 24 matter.

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MR. DORITY: And I need to state the

0298 1 same thing, your Honor. I'm sorry I neglected to do 2 that. Century-Tel does not have any concerns or 3 objections to the process that we employed today. 4 JUDGE RUTH: Okay. I had originally 5 asked the parties to file a notice indicating that 6 you had no objection to the procedure, but since we 7 have handled that on the record, that won't be 8 necessary. 9 Mr. Poston, did you have something else? 10 MR. POSTON: I just wanted to add that 11 William Voight was here for staff and participating 12 in the conference. 13 JUDGE RUTH: Okay. Thank you. Now, during the off-the-record portion, somebody mentioned 14 15 that it might be helpful for the Commission to have 16 another similar or longer conference, more of a 17 give-and-take discussion, and it's my understanding 18 that the parties may have been thinking about an 19 off-the-record conference where all parties are 20 present. 21 If that is something that the parties 22 want to do, you may want to get together and even 23 discuss some dates and file a motion with the 24 Commission offering them some dates when you might be 25 available for such thing.

0299 1 Again, that's a suggestion, not a 2 requirement. And let me ask the parties if you have 3 any procedural or substantive matters that you want 4 to discuss on the record at this time. It was my 5 intention just to have the brief prehearing 6 conference type information. 7 If Commissioner Clayton had any 8 questions, we were going to allow him to address 9 those, and then we would go off the record for you to 10 have your regular prehearing conference. We've gone 11 a little bit out of order, but I want to give you an 12 opportunity then to address whatever you wanted on 13 the record. Mr. Poston? 14 MR. POSTON: Thank you, Judge. I have 15 nothing else to add. 16 JUDGE RUTH: Mr. Dority? 17 MR. DORITY: I have nothing else, your 18 Honor. Again, we appreciated the opportunity to have 19 the discussions that preceded this on-the-record portion, and we very much would like to participate 20 in additional discussions, and I think that would be 21 22 very helpful before we try to formulate a specific 23 procedural schedule in this matter. 24 MR. DANDINO: And I would agree with 25 Mr. Dority on that matter.

0300 1 JUDGE RUTH: All right. I don't have 2 anything further. I was trying to remember if a date 3 had been set for a procedural schedule. 4 MR. DORITY: I don't believe so, Judge. 5 I think this was the only matter. 6 JUDGE RUTH: No, you're right. It looks 7 like the order scheduling the conference just set a 8 date for the conference. So I will ask that staff, 9 if you would file a status report within ten days of 10 this meeting indicating whether or not the parties 11 are ready to look at procedural schedules, or if 12 instead, the parties file a motion for some type of 13 off-the-record discussion, then your status report 14 would not be necessary. 15 But I want to know that something is 16 coming since we do not have a procedural schedule 17 set. I'll either know that it's time for me to set 18 one or the parties will file something letting me 19 know that instead you want an off-the-record 20 discussion conference. 21 MR. DANDINO: Your Honor, maybe we could 22 have a little more than ten days. I have a feeling 23 the next couple of weeks are gonna be pretty well 24 filled up, and I don't know if we'll have an 25 opportunity to get with the parties to work out

0301 1 something. 2 JUDGE RUTH: Would three weeks work? 3 MR. DANDINO: Fifteen, 20 days, 4 something like that. 5 JUDGE RUTH: I was going to say, if we 6 make it three weeks from now, would that be good? 7 MR. DANDINO: Oh, it would be excellent. MR. DORITY: And, Judge, could I ask 8 9 respectfully, would it be possible for you to perhaps 10 visit with particularly Commissioner Clayton to see 11 what his availability might be, or is that premature? 12 I know it's the chicken or the egg. 13 JUDGE RUTH: No. I certainly could. In 14 fact, if anybody wants to go with me upstairs after 15 the on-the-record conference, we can check with his 16 DPA. She will give suggestions, but they're not 17 guarantees, because by the time you file anything, he 18 could have scheduled some type of meeting. 19 MR. DORITY: I mean, I just think his 20 schedule is probably driving our opportunity to get 21 back together again. I think you've heard from us 22 collectively that we all think it's a good idea, and 23 if that's okay with you --24 JUDGE RUTH: No, that sounds fine. I 25 would suggest that anyone who's interested come with

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    me upstairs. We'll talk to Dana Parish and try to
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    get some -- at least a rough idea of when he might be
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    available.
