- JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 9 The purpose of this prehearing conference
- 10 is primarily to bring you together so that you may
- 11 devise a proposed procedural schedule. It is that
- 12 proposed procedural schedule which will be rather
- 13 different from those generally in use here with the
- 14 Commission. The Commission's purpose is to attempt
- to expedite the ACA process as much as possible
- 16 without causing complete dislocation of the
- 17 Commission's gas department, basically.
- 18 So we hope that the parties can
- 19 cooperatively take a look at that process based on
- 20 whatever it is that your particular period ends and
- 21 see what kind of slack there might be in the
- 22 process that can be taken up so that it can all be
- 23 accomplished more quickly than is the norm.
- The Commission's goal, now this is a goal,
- is to have any resulting litigation completed at

- 1 the Commission level by the end of this calendar
- 2 year. When I say that's a goal, I mean to indicate
- 3 that that may not be possible given the nature of
- 4 the circumstances surrounding your company, your
- 5 case. If that is the case, please explain those
- 6 circumstances in the joint proposed procedural
- 7 schedule that you will file. I think it's a week
- 8 from today.
- 9 In order to expedite the process, we would
- 10 like you to set dates not only for important
- 11 events, pre-litigation events in the ACA process,
- 12 and also go ahead and set dates assuming that there
- might be a contested issue that's going to require
- 14 a hearing. Go ahead and set those dates, too, so
- that they are already there, they are already on
- 16 the calendar. You can go right into that contested
- 17 case mode if it becomes necessary. Okay. I think
- 18 that will help to speed things up as well, because
- 19 you won't find yourself in that position with the
- 20 calendar already full. Okay.
- 21 To help you do that, I have brought copies
- 22 of the ALJ calendar for the rest of the year so you
- 23 can see when the rooms are available, and that will
- 24 at least save you a trip up to the ninth floor.
- 25 Do the parties have anything they want to

1	bring to my attention at this time? Okay.
2	I'm sorry that Staff's attorney hasn't
3	made it yet. I guess I might have started a little
4	early by that clock. But, you know, by the clock
5	in the other room, I started late, so who knows
6	what time it really is.
7	MR. HACK: I'm sure he'll show up.
8	JUDGE THOMPSON: I hope you will fill
9	Mr. Schwarz in on what he needs to do and where he
10	needs to be.
11	There being nothing else, we'll go ahead
12	and conclude the recorded portion of the prehearing
13	conference. This room is yours for the remainder
14	of the day. I hope you guys will be able to make
15	good progress.
