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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- 2 JUDGE DIPPELL: This is Case Number
- 3 WC-2006-0345, Dione -- I'm not sure -- C. -- Joyner,
- 4 Complainant, versus Missouri-American Water Company,
- 5 Respondent. We're meeting here today for a telephone
- 6 conference to discuss procedural matters, and we have
- 7 a representative from Missouri-American Water on the
- 8 phone as well as members of the Staff in the room
- 9 with me.
- 10 My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm the
- 11 regulatory law judge assigned to this matter. We're
- 12 gonna begin with entries of appearance by the
- 13 attorneys, and I'll begin here with Staff.
- 14 Mr. Krueger?
- MR. KRUEGER: My name is Keith Krueger.
- 16 I'm the attorney for the Staff of the Missouri Public
- 17 Service Commission. My address is P.O. Box 360,
- 18 Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- 19 JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you. And
- 20 Ms. Sullivan?
- 21 MS. SULLIVAN: Yes. Mary Sullivan
- 22 appearing on behalf of Missouri-American Water
- 23 Company. My address is 727 Craig, C-r-a-i-g, Road,
- 24 St. Louis, Missouri 63141.
- 25 JUDGE DIPPELL: All right. And just for

- 1 purposes since this is a telephone proceeding, or
- 2 involves the telephone, anyway, I'm gonna let
- 3 Mr. Krueger introduce the Staff that's here with him
- 4 today just for the record.
- 5 MR. KRUEGER: Okay. When I made my
- 6 entry, I should have also added, Sarah Kliethermes is
- 7 a legal intern here representing the Staff. The
- 8 other Staff members that are present are Jim Merciel,
- 9 Contessa King and Gay Smith.
- 10 MS. FRED: Fred. Gay Fred.
- MR. KRUEGER: I knew you shouldn't have
- 12 done that to me.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Ms. Sullivan, are
- 14 you by yourself or did you have Staff with you that
- 15 you wanted to introduce?
- MS. SULLIVAN: I am by myself.
- 17 JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. And is Ms. Joyner
- 18 on the line?
- 19 (NO RESPONSE.)
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. We're gonna give
- 21 Ms. Joyner about five minutes to call in before we
- 22 proceed. So what I'll do is we'll just go ahead and
- 23 go off the record for a brief recess.
- 24 (A recess was taken.)
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Ms. Joyner has

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1 joined us on the phone. Ms. Joyner, would you like
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- 2 to state your name and give us your address?
- 3 MS. JOYNER: It's Dione Joyner,
- 4 D-i-o-n-e J-o-y-n-e-r. 1442 Sheridan Drive.
- 5 JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. We've come here
- 6 today to talk about how this is gonna go forward
- 7 procedurally. Basically we have a billing dispute,
- 8 and the next step would really be to take this to a
- 9 hearing before the Commission so that they can -- so
- 10 that Ms. Joyner can present whatever evidence she has
- 11 to put forth and have the Commission make a decision
- 12 about whether there's been a tariff violation or
- 13 other relief that the Commission can grant to
- 14 Ms. Joyner.
- This is also a time when you-all are
- 16 encouraged to discuss further settlement, if you'd
- 17 like, after -- after I leave. But I'd ask you to
- 18 hold that maybe until after I'm out of the room,
- 19 since I'm supposed to remain neutral and we don't
- 20 want to hear any of the specific evidence before --
- 21 before a hearing.
- 22 Let me just start with Staff and ask if
- 23 they have considered the procedure to follow here and
- 24 what kind of time frames.
- MR. KRUEGER: I really haven't. I

- 1 assumed that we'd want a live proceeding because
- 2 that's generally easier for pro se litigants to
- 3 handle, to deal with. And I don't know that we need
- 4 to do any discovery. I think that we could probably
- 5 set it for hearing pretty soon at the convenience of
- 6 the Commission.
- 7 JUDGE DIPPELL: All right. And what
- 8 about the company? Is there any reason that we
- 9 couldn't set this just as soon as the Commission's
- 10 calendar and everyone's schedules allow?
- 11 MS. SULLIVAN: Not that I'm aware of.
- 12 JUDGE DIPPELL: Ms. Joyner, do you know
- 13 of any reason or have any desire to set this sooner
- 14 or later?
- MS. JOYNER: No. Whenever it's
- 16 convenient for the Commission.
- 17 JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. Well, the
- 18 Commission's calendar is pretty booked up, but I did
- 19 bring it with me to try and find a date, and I'm
- 20 looking on the calendar to see what might be the
- 21 earliest date that we can schedule a hearing. What
- 22 about October 13th? It's a Friday.
- Ms. Joyner, would you be available on
- 24 October 13th?
- MS. JOYNER: What time?

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1 JUDGE DIPPELL: Well, we can talk about
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- 2 that, but probably in the morning.
- 3 MS. JOYNER: That would be fine.
- 4 JUDGE DIPPELL: Probably starting at
- 5 nine.
- 6 MS. JOYNER: Okay.
- 7 JUDGE DIPPELL: 8:30 or nine.
- 8 MS. JOYNER: Okay.
- 9 JUDGE DIPPELL: And I could make
- 10 arrangements for you to -- let's see. You live --
- 11 where do you live exactly?
- MS. JOYNER: In St. Louis, Missouri.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: You live in St. Louis?
- MS. JOYNER: Yes.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: We have an office in
- 16 Overland that has a telephone capability like video
- 17 capability. We could make arrangements for you to
- 18 go to that office if you -- if you'd prefer. And
- 19 for that matter, Missouri-American could go there
- 20 too.
- 21 MS. JOYNER: You're needing to do this
- 22 via video conference, or it's not set up the way
- 23 we're set up right now?
- JUDGE DIPPELL: We could do it by phone.
- MS. JOYNER: Okay.

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1 JUDGE DIPPELL: If everyone agrees to
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- 2 that. It's sometimes difficult if there are
- 3 documents involved.
- 4 MS. JOYNER: Okay.
- 5 JUDGE DIPPELL: But we could set a date
- 6 for everyone to exchange any documents they might
- 7 have ahead of time and set it up. So would you
- 8 prefer to have it by phone?
- 9 MS. JOYNER: Yeah, that's fine. Because
- 10 I can sit in my office, and that way it would be a
- 11 convenience for me and still be at work at the same
- 12 time.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Ms. Sullivan, would you
- 14 have any objection to a hearing being conducted by
- 15 telephone?
- Ms. Sullivan, are you still there?
- 17 MS. SULLIVAN: I'm with you. I'm just
- 18 thinking like you. I guess I usually prefer to have
- 19 everybody in a room, but we could do it by phone
- 20 instead.
- 21 JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. Would Staff have
- 22 any objection to it being conducted by telephone?
- MR. KRUEGER: No.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. Ms. Joyner, do
- 25 you have any questions for me about procedures or

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1 anything before the Commission or what -- what's
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- 2 gonna happen from here?
- 3 MS. JOYNER: No. Your Staff has done
- 4 very well of keeping me informed on how it's
- 5 explained.
- 6 JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. Good.
- 7 Ms. Sullivan, do you have any questions?
- 8 MS. SULLIVAN: No.
- 9 JUDGE DIPPELL: Anything you'd like to
- 10 add on the record?
- MS. SULLIVAN: No.
- 12 JUDGE DIPPELL: Mr. Krueger?
- MR. KRUEGER: No.
- 14 JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. Well, I don't
- 15 think there's anything else for me to do here. But
- 16 what I'm going to do is I'm gonna leave you-all on
- 17 the phone, give you an opportunity if you want to
- 18 discuss the case and any private discussions you want
- 19 to have.
- 20 And if you don't have anything, that's
- 21 fine too. But I would encourage you to reach some
- 22 compromise on this so we don't have to waste
- 23 everybody's -- well, not a waste.
- MS. JOYNER: It's not a waste.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Don't have to use

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1 everyone's time and further resources having a
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- 2 hearing.
- 3 MS. JOYNER: Is it just me and
- 4 Ms. Sullivan or who else is on the line? Who else is
- 5 on the line?
- 6 JUDGE DIPPELL: Mary Sullivan is also on
- 7 the telephone line from Missouri-American Water.
- 8 MS. JOYNER: Who?
- 9 MS. SULLIVAN: Mary Sullivan.
- 10 MS. JOYNER: Who is that?
- 11 MS. SULLIVAN: I'm the attorney for
- 12 Missouri-American.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And everyone else is
- 14 here in our offices, Staff. And when we go off the
- 15 record, I'll let them introduce themselves again so
- 16 that you know exactly who's here, all right?
- MS. JOYNER: All right.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Are there any other
- 19 questions before we conclude the on-the-record
- 20 portion of this conference?
- 21 MS. SULLIVAN: I'm sorry. Did you set
- 22 the time for the hearing on the 13th?
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Let's say 9:00. And
- 24 I'll send out a notice about that.
- 25 If there's nothing further, then we'll

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    go ahead and conclude the on-the-record portion of
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     the hearing. Thank you, and we'll go off the record.
