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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	JUDGE HOPKINS: This is January 26th, 1999;
3	Bill Hopkins. We're here on SC-99-134 and SC-99-135
4	prehearings.
5	If you'd go around the table and make your
6	entries of appearance for the court reporter, please,
7	and also I want to make sure that you file these
8	entries of appearance. Go ahead.
9	MR. STUEVEN: David Stueven on behalf of
10	Staff. My address is 360 P.O. Box 360, Jefferson
11	City, Missouri 65102.
12	MS. COOK: Shannon Cook for Public Counsel
13	and the Public, P.O. Box 7800, Jefferson City,
14	Missouri 65102-7800.
15	JUDGE HOPKINS: Okay. The company, which is
16	Imperial Utility Corporation, the Respondent in
17	SC-99-134, is not here. The company, which is House
18	Springs Sewer Company in SC-99-135, is not here.
19	We've heard nothing from the attorney. We've heard
20	nothing from the company.
21	So I'll just go ahead and ask Staff what it

is you're wanting to accomplish in both of these
cases.

MR. STUEVEN: Okay. First of all, in

SC-99-134, there is a change in the assessments on

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- 1 fiscal year '99. The total amount listed in the
- 2 Complaint is \$66,692.86. The Commission has changed
- 3 the assessments for '99. That amount should be
- 4 \$55,325.72. And the balance due as of 12/29/98 would
- 5 be \$27,662.86.
- JUDGE HOPKINS: Did you file a correction?
- 7 MR. STUEVEN: I'll file a change, yeah. And
- 8 there's also a similar change in the House Springs
- 9 complaint, 99-135, just so everyone's currently
- 10 working off the same numbers. The amount for House
- 11 Springs for fiscal year '99 for the year should be
- 12 \$22,786.77, and the assessments due as of 12/29/98
- 13 would have been \$11,393.38.
- 14 JUDGE HOPKINS: It's my understanding that
- both of these companies are in receivership.
- MR. STUEVEN: Yes. And also Imperial
- 17 Utility Corporation is a docketed case for sale of
- 18 assets. That case is SM-99-287.
- 19 JUDGE HOPKINS: Is that where you would plan
- 20 to get this money from these people?
- MR. STUEVEN: Yes. And there have been
- 22 informal discussions with the company in reference to
- 23 getting funds from the sale to pay off the
- 24 assessments.
- 25 JUDGE HOPKINS: Will there be enough funds

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1	to pay off those assessments? Do you know?
2	MR. STUEVEN: Yes.
3	JUDGE HOPKINS: There will be?
4	MR. STUEVEN: Right. The sticking point as
5	far as I can tell right now on this is we'd like them
6	to well, let me go back, step back a couple steps
7	here.
8	In SC-96-427 the Commission treated both
9	Imperial Utility Corporation and House Springs Sewer
10	Company as one entity for ratemaking purposes, and in
11	that rate case they took into account the assessments
12	that would be paid by both companies in setting the
13	rates.
14	Both companies shortly after this went into
15	effect stopped paying their assessments. What we
16	would like them to do, since Imperial Utility
17	Corporation is almost sold or getting close to being
18	sold, that they would pay both assessments out of that
19	sale, and that's what we were hoping to work out
20	today, but
21	JUDGE HOPKINS: You don't have any idea when
22	this sale will take place?
23	MS. COOK: The last I heard, they wanted to

MR. STUEVEN: Right. They were required to 5

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close yesterday.

- 1 place an advertisement in the local weekly newspaper.
- 2 If that has been -- there was no time frame on it.
- 3 MS. COOK: They said as soon as you can.
- Well, this paper runs every week, and so they could
- 5 only put it in -- they figured out the other day that
- 6 the soonest they could get it in would be another week
- 7 and a half or something because of the way the
- 8 deadlines for the paper ran, and so --
- 9 MR. STUEVEN: I would assume that the
- 10 Commission probably wouldn't move forward on it until
- 11 a couple weeks at least after the announcement in the
- 12 paper, I would guess. That I don't know. There's not
- been a deadline set on that right now.
- 14 But I would assume that it would go
- 15 within -- if everything goes smoothly, it would go
- within the next 30 to 45 days.
- MS. COOK: Oh, I don't have -- I don't even
- 18 know if it's going to take place at all for sure.
- 19 MR. STUEVEN: Well, yeah. I mean, it could
- 20 always fall through, but my guess would be the 30 to
- 21 45 days time frame on that, though that may be
- 22 optimistic depending on what happens with the public
- 23 notice. That's if everything goes smoothly.
- JUDGE HOPKINS: Okay. On SC-99-240, which
- 25 this isn't really a prehearing on that case, but I

1	just wanted to let you know that I asked this same
2	attorney to file a responsive pleading on that. He
3	hasn't filed one.
4	I'm going to check on these two cases that
5	we're doing today, 134 and 135, in about 45 days to
6	see if that sale has taken place.
7	Is there anything else that needs to go on
8	the record? Thank you. We're off the record.
9	WHEREUPON, the recorded portion of the
10	prehearing conference was concluded.
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
