ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT WITHOUT PREJUDICE

The Missouri Public Service Commission is granting the *Motion to Dismiss* ("motion"), which Staff filed on behalf of all parties.

Mike and Carol Medlin ("the Medlins") filed the complaint, alleging billing errors, on June 7, 2010. On October 20, 2010, Staff filed the motion representing that Staff filed the motion at the other parties' request because those parties have settled this case. Because the Medlins were presenting their own case, the Commission clarified the time for filing any response to the motion. Any response to the motion was due on November 1, 2010,¹ and no party filed any response.

The Commission's regulations provide that:

A case may be dismissed for good cause found by the commission after a minimum of ten (10) days notice to all parties involved.

The minimum of ten days' notice to all parties has passed, and the Commission finds good cause to dismiss in the parties' settlement, so the Commission will grant the motion. Because the motion does not specify dismissal with prejudice, the Commission will dismiss the complaint without prejudice.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The *Motion to Dismiss* is granted and the complaint is dismissed without prejudice.

2. This order shall be effective on November 22, 2010.

3. This file shall close on November 23, 2010.
