Northeast Missouri Rural Telephone was the recipient of two ARRA stimulus awards. A summary of these projects is as follows:

# **Green City Exchange**

- 1. Project engineering completed
- 2. 515 OSP construction contract submitted to RUS for their approval several weeks ago
- 3. Construction of the project anticipated to begin 1<sup>st</sup> quarter 2012
- 4. Construction anticipated to be completed by 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2012
- 5. Cut over anticipated to begin 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2012 and be completed by 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2013

#### Unionville Exchange

- 1. Cable placement is complete (about 300 total miles)
- 2. Splicing of fiber optic cable estimated to be 50% complete
- 3. Cut over of completed sections scheduled to start October 31, 2011
- 4. Cut over will continue through 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2011 and is anticipated to be complete 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2013
