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pleading here next Wednesday?

MR. COOPER: Judge, this is Dean Cooper.

I think in order to do that, we're going to need a little bit more I guess instruction or information from you and/or the Commission in terms of what it is we're rehearing. During the Commission's agenda meeting, we heard the chairman say he thought we were rehearing I think just the 8614 issue. The order of course doesn't give any guidance one way or the other. You know, in the underlying substantive order from the Commission it was addressing, you know, at a minimum whether the Commission had the authority to do anything, so can it. And then once it got past that, it addressed the issue of taking the action that had been requested.

So I guess I'm kind of unsure how to put together a procedural schedule without knowing what it is we're rehearing or what the Commission wants reheard.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: Well, Mr. Cooper, thank you. And I'll -- I will happily entertain any thoughts from other counsel. I'm walking into this case as a new judge and kind of unaware of what's going on, to complicate matters because of a rehearing statute, so I don't think I'm going to be a

whole lot of help. But I'm certainly happy to, you 1 2 know, entertain any thoughts that counsel may have. And obviously if you need more time, I'm not going to 3 impose a week deadline on you if you think, you know, 4 5 you're scratching your heads and you're not sure how 6 to proceed. If you need more time, that's perfectly 7 fine with me. And I don't know. I'm happy to throw 8 it open to counsel or if other counsel are unsure, I'm happy to just kind of leave things hanging and 9 we'll figure it out later. 10 11 MS. SCHULTZ: Judge, this is Sue Schultz

on behalf of DCM. Our client has requested an expedited schedule in this matter because this is causing a delay in the development which is causing huge carrying costs for my client. And previously the Commission has been very — they were very generous in moving the proceeding along, so I would request that, to the extent at all possible, we continue to do that.

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JUDGE PRIDGIN: I understand, and I appreciate your voicing your client's concerns.

Thank you. Like I said, I don't know that I'm going to be very helpful. Could I -- could I see if parties are amenable to filing some sort of pleading in a week, whether it be a procedural schedule or

some sort of motion for clarification on what the Commission wants from you? I mean, I want to keep this moving as quickly as I can without interfering with your negotiations or your strategy.

MR. WILLIAMS: Judge, this is Nathan Williams with the Office of Public Counsel. I did not make an entry of appearance, but my address is the same as Ms. Van Gerpen's.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: Okay.

MR. WILLIAMS: Since you're walking into this case cold, maybe you're not familiar with the background. The parties did a stipulation of facts, presented arguments. The Commission issued its report and order. And then Public Counsel filed an application for rehearing which the Commission granted but did not explicate at all as to what it found in what the application raised that it viewed the cause to give rehearing.

I'm not sure that there needs to be any more actual record developed. I'm kind of like the other parties, at a loss as to just what it is the Commission's looking for.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Williams, thank you.

And that's fair enough. I mean, and I don't want to
tell the parties how to practice, but if you feel

like you need more guidance from the Commission, 1 2 you're certainly welcome to file a motion saying, Hey, what is it that you want reheard, what is it 3 4 that you want from us. And then I can go to the 5 Commission and try to get an answer for you. 6 I'm not hearing any responses from counsel, and I don't necessarily need any. I'm just 7 8 trying to do what I can for you, which I'm afraid 9 isn't much. I suppose I will simply --10 MS. SCHULTZ: This is Sue Schultz again. 11 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Yes, ma'am. Go ahead. 12 MS. SCHULTZ: Perhaps with the others, 13 pardon me since I'm not as versed in practicing for this form as the others probably are, but would it be 14 15 appropriate to file a joint motion, other counsel, 16 you know, as soon as we can here to request a clarification since we all seem to have the same 17 18 struggle? 19 JUDGE PRIDGIN: I think that's perfectly 20 appropriate, yes. And if that's -- I mean, and I may 21 disconnect and go off the call and let you talk, you 22 know, without me around. But that, to me that sounds 23 like that's where the parties want to go and it looks 24 like I should be expecting some sort of motion or 2.5 joint motion from the parties asking for a Commission

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clarification pretty quickly. If there's anyone who
