NOTICE OF CONTESTED CASE AND ORDER DIRECTING FILINGS

The Missouri Public Service Commission is setting a deadline for the filings related to the attached complaint.

Because such filing triggers the right to a hearing,¹ the filing begins a "contested case." ² A contested case is a formal hearing procedure, but it allows for waiver of procedural formalities³ and a decision without a hearing,⁴ including by stipulation and agreement.⁵ Provisions governing discovery are at the Commission's regulation 4 CSR 240-2.090.

As an alternative to the formal evidentiary hearing procedure, the Commission offers mediation. Mediation is a voluntary process in which a neutral person assists the

parties in exploring opportunities for settlement. Upon a request for mediation, the Commission may suspend the filing date set forth in this order.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The respondent shall file an answer to the complaint no later than July 12, 2010.

2. The Commission's Staff shall conduct an investigation as to the cause of the complaint and shall file a report of its findings no later than July 26, 2010.

3. This order is effective immediately on issuance.
