2	JUDGE GRAHAM: Let's go on the record. All
3	right. This is Paul Graham speaking. I'm the
4	Regulatory Law Judge in this case. This case has been
5	set for a Procedural Conference today, March 20, 2020.
6	By this case, I mean Case WC-2020-0181. The style of
7	this case is Linda Beecham vs. Missouri-American Water.
8	And at this time I'm going to ask the parties to enter
9	their appearance. Ms. Beecham, can you hear me?
10	MS. BEECHAM: I can hear you.
11	JUDGE GRAHAM: Ms. Beecham, would you simply
12	state your full name for the record?
13	MS. BEECHAM: My full name is Linda Beecham.
14	It's B-e-e-c-h-a-m.
15	JUDGE GRAHAM: All right. Thank you very
16	much. And Ms. Hernandez, can you hear me?
17	MS. HERNANDEZ: Yes, sir.
18	JUDGE GRAHAM: Would you go ahead and enter
19	your appearance on behalf of MAWC?
20	MS. HERNANDEZ: Yes. This is Jennifer
21	Hernandez with the law firm of Brydon Swearengen and
22	England. Our address is 312 East Capitol Avenue, Post
23	Office Box 456, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, and I'm
24	appearing today on behalf of Missouri-American Water
25	Company.

1	JUDGE GRAHAM: Thank you very much, Ms.
2	Hernandez. Before I go on and have staff or anyone else
3	enter their appearances, is Timothy, is it Luft or Luft?
4	MS. HERNANDEZ: Luft. It's just myself today.
5	He has entered his appearance as an attorney of record
6	as well.
7	JUDGE GRAHAM: Okay. Thank you very much.
8	That answers my question. And would staff go ahead and
9	enter its appearance?
10	MS. BRETZ: Karen Bretz for staff of the
11	Missouri Public Service Commission, and I believe the
12	court reporter has my information.
13	JUDGE GRAHAM: All right. Thank you very,
14	very much. Are there any preliminary or other matters
15	that I need to address or the Commission needs to
16	address before we go off the record?
17	Well, I'm anticipating, what is going to be
18	the position with respect to prefiled testimony or is
19	that something you'll just hash out and present in a
20	proposed procedural order?
21	MR. BRETZ: That's what I was thinking we
22	would do is talk about it.
23	JUDGE GRAHAM: It might be a little too soon to
24	say. I do anticipate, though, that this hearing I
25	think the chances are very, very great that this hearing

is going to occur in the same way that we're conducting this hearing this morning, hopefully not with our individual cell phones. Keeping that in mind, the parties may move to do prefiled testimony, and the problem that I see with that is that Ms. Beecham is without an attorney. She's pro se. And so how we are going to handle her direct examination if we're going to have to do this remotely is perhaps something you will want to address in this conference.

Likewise, I've read through this file and as usual it strikes me that I think this is about an excessive billing allegation and so it's probably going to be or possibly going to be record intensive. And so I would invite you all to discuss the nature and extent of prefiled exhibits, because I don't want to get the Commission into a situation necessarily where we're hashing through a lot of details concerning records of bills, and so forth, remotely in a hearing where I do not have or the Commission does not have those documents immediately in front of the Commission to review them in the course of the hearing.

So I guess what I'm saying, friends, is I think you should proceed today on the presupposition that we're going to be doing this hearing remotely in all respects and that means that all testimony is going to

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be presented remotely, including exhibits and oral

     testimony, and just take that into consideration,
    please, in your procedural conference and sort of

     presuppose that that's the way the hearing is going to

     be conducted and I think we'll save a lot of
     difficulties later on. Now, I've talked about five
