3	Today's date is September 2, 2021, hearing scheduled for
4	10:00 a.m. Informally I understand that everyone is
5	here.
6	The Commission has set this time for a
7	procedural conference in the case captioned as Louis
8	DeFeo, Complainant vs. Missouri-American Water Company,
9	Respondent. The case file is WC-2021-0075. My name is
10	Paul Graham. I'm the Regulatory Law Judge in this
11	matter.
12	We'll begin by the attorneys and parties
13	making their entries of appearance. Mr. DeFeo, do you
14	want to state your name for the record and make your
15	appearance, please, just state you're here?
16	MR. DeFEO: Louis DeFeo, Complainant.
17	JUDGE GRAHAM: Good enough. I'm sorry. I
18	interrupted you. Go ahead.
19	MR. DeFEO: I just said I'm here.
20	JUDGE GRAHAM: Okay. Thank you, sir. Who is
21	here for Missouri-American Water Company?
22	MS. HERNANDEZ: Good morning, Judge. This is
23	Jennifer Hernandez and Mr. Jesse Craig. We're with the
24	law firm of Brydon, Swearengen & England, PC. The
25	court reporter has our contact information, and we are

1	representing Missouri-American Water Company today.
2	JUDGE GRAHAM: All right. Thank you very
3	much. Who is here for the Commission Staff today and
4	would they make their appearance?
5	MS. ASLIN: Casi Aslin for Commission Staff.
6	My address is 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City,
7	Missouri 65102.
8	JUDGE GRAHAM: All right. And I don't believe
9	we have anyone here for the Office of Public Counsel. I
10	believe we've gotten everybody in as a matter of record
11	now.
12	Are there any preliminary matters to be taken
13	up at this time before I turn this over to you folks to
14	confer and put together a procedural order? Any
15	preliminary matters?
16	MR. DeFEO: Judge, just for my benefit, the
17	other people are members of the staff are Curtis
18	Gateley, Sarah Fontaine? I just don't know those
19	people.
20	JUDGE GRAHAM: Is this Mr. DeFeo speaking?
21	MR. DeFEO: Yes, it is. I'm sorry.
22	JUDGE GRAHAM: That's fine. And when you
23	speak of the staff, I assume you're referring to the
24	Commission's staff?
25	MR. DeFEO: Correct. They must have been

introduced before I got on. 1 2 JUDGE GRAHAM: Well, it's like any law firm, 3 Mr. DeFeo. I guess they picked somebody to appear and 4 handle the matter in this hearing today. And if you had 5 communications with or dealt with other staff personnel, 6 Commission staff personnel, then I guess all I can say 7 is they aren't here today, but Ms. Aslin is the attorney 8 of record for the Commission Staff for the purposes of this particular procedural conference. That's who we 9 10 have. 11 Now, before I turn this over, when may I 12 expect to see a procedural, a proposed procedural order? 13 In say a week or how much time do you need? 14 MS.                MS. HERNANDEZ: Judge, this is Jennifer
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Just in response, the Company does plan to 1 Hernandez. 2 file a formal motion to dismiss, because we do believe with the Notice of Satisfaction and the credit of 3 Mr. DeFeo's account the complaint is now moot. So we 5 will be getting a motion to dismiss on file. 6 JUDGE GRAHAM: Okay. Well, since you've gone 7 ahead and moved forward discussing this matter in my 8 presence, I need to let Mr. DeFeo respond to that now if 9 Mr. DeFeo has any response at all. Do you want to say 10 anything at this time, sir? 11 MR. DeFEO: Judge, Lou DeFeo. To twist the 12 phrase, this is my first rodeo. I'm not aware of these procedural orders. Could you give me a little 13 14 background? 15 JUDGE GRAHAM: Well, I can't instruct you, of 16 course, but a complaint was filed. Hello? 17 MR. DeFEO: Just the process. 18 JUDGE GRAHAM: Right. I'm going online here. 19 Bear with me because a complaint was filed in this case 20 and you filed it. I've got to move away from one field 21 and go to another. What I'm looking for is the complaint and I'll get there. If you'll all be patient 22 23 with me a minute. 24 Just about there. Yeah, I'm looking at the complaint now. It is as I recall. Mr. DeFeo, in 25

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paragraph 5 of your complaint you alleged that the amount at issue is about \$250, but the more important issue is fairness to the customers. I quoted your complaint exactly. And the Company then -- I'm getting there again. Just a second -- on July the 13th filed a Notice of Satisfaction. And in that document -- and I'm going to open it. I do recall it -- but the Company states, I want to get it right, the Company states that it hereby provides notice that it has satisfied your complaint as of July 13, 2021, by providing a credit to you in the amount of \$250, and then the Company goes on -- well, maybe they don't go on. Yes, they do. previous paragraph the Company states Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240, so forth, states in part that the notice from the Commission, that was the notice that I sent out or the Commission sent out, at the time you filed your complaint, Mr. DeFeo, that the notice from the Commission concerning the complaint states that, quote, that the matter complained of -- the Company is to file a pleading that states the matter complained of is satisfied or that the complaint be answered and basically then within 30 days. So the options were laid on the table for the Company at that time either to answer, you know, to deny or affirm or whatever they're going to do with respect to your complaint or to make

satisfaction of your complaint.

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What's happened here is the Company alleges in this notice of July 13 that they have made satisfaction and thereby responded to the Commission. So that's procedurally where we stand, Mr. DeFeo. And what the Company has done here today, Ms. Hernandez has basically advised me at this point that they're going to file a motion to dismiss on the basis of the posture of these pleadings at this time. I don't know if you want to say 10 anything in response to them. This is a procedural 11 conference today. You need to say nothing, Mr. DeFeo. 12 You simply asked me a question about where we are 13 procedurally. I basically just summarized what I see in 14 EFIS to help you in that regard. So that's basically where we are. So I don't know if you want to say any more. I gave you an opportunity to and you asked a question. Do you have anything you want to say in response to Staff or in response to Ms. Hernandez at 19 this time?

MR. DeFEO: Yes, I do. As you read, the \$250 was not the only matter in issue, and that's enough for me to say at this point. Secondly --

JUDGE GRAHAM: That is enough. That's fine. That is fine. You basically said that not all matters in issue have been disposed of. I expect that Ms.

Hernandez and the Company will have a different view on that matter. Why don't you all -- I did not mean to step on you or curtail your statement. Were you done, Mr. DeFeo?

MR. DeFEO: Well, I actually asked two questions. I am not familiar with this procedural order or whatever. I'm not sure even the correct name that Jennifer responded they could have it within a week. Since this is my first involvement with the Public Service Commission, I would appreciate if you could give me in a nutshell what is this procedural order? I don't understand that. I'm not talking about --

Mr. DeFeo, this is starting to morph into you asking me to advise you on how things work, and there's a very, very thin line there between my telling you how things work and my advising you as an attorney, a line of course which I must not cross. I think that you can address these questions directly to Staff counsel in the procedural conference that's about to take place, and I think that you will find that they will demystify you very, very quickly because the answers are simple, but I don't really wish to go further than that because I've got to keep one hat on here. I can't wear two. And I'm the Judge in this case.
