## STATE OF MISSOURI PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

At a Session of the Public Service Commission held at its office in Jefferson City on the 28th day of December, 1994.

In the matter of the Joint Application of GTE Midwest Incorporated and Northeast Missouri Rural Telephone Company and Modern Telecommunications Company for authority to sell, purchase, and transfer telephone properties and assets related to the telephone exchanges of Memphis, Union-ville and Queen City in the state of Missouri, and for authority to encumber assets necessary to finance the proposed transaction.

## ORDER CONCERNING APPLICATION

On October 26, 1994, GTE Midwest Incorporated (GTE) and Northeast Missouri Rural Telephone Company (Northeast) and Modern Telecommunications Company (Modern) (also collectively referred to as Joint Applicants) filed a joint Application for Commission approval of the acquisition by Modern of part of GTE's franchise, facilities and system, pursuant to §392.300, RSMo Supp. 1993. Modern apparently intends to offer local exchange service in the place of GTE by virtue of the acquisition. However, Modern does not possess the requisite Certificate of Service Authority and has not applied for approval of such a certificate, either separately or within this docket. Assuming that Modern is permitted to complete the acquisition of a portion of GTE's system, Modern could not provide telecommunication services in Missouri absent a Commission approved Certificate of Service Authority. See, eg., §392.410, RSMo Supp. 1993.

In order to obtain a Certificate of Service Authority, Modern must either file a separate application requesting a Certificate of Service Authority or must amend the joint Application to reflect the inclusion of

Modern's request seeking a Certificate of Service Authority within this docket. Modern must also comply with the requirements of 4 CSR 240-2.060(2).

The Commission finds that absent an application for a Certificate of Service Authority the Commission may review the necessity of proceeding with this case inasmuch as it appears to be an application for authority which cannot be granted as the application is now filed.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Modern Telecommunications Company file an application for Certificate of Service Authority describing the type of service it seeks to offer and comply with 4 CSR 240-2.060(2) or, in the alternative, show cause why the application in this case should not be dismissed.
  - 2. That this order shall become effective on the date hereof.
