## ORDER DIRECTING NOTICE, ESTABLISHING INTERVENTION DEADLINE, AND DIRECTING FILING

On December 7, 2005, Southwestern Bell Telephone, L.P., doing business as AT&T Missouri, filed its Application seeking review and reversal of the decision of the North American Numbering Plan Administrator (NANPA), NeuStar, Inc., to withhold nine blocks of 1,000 numbers that AT&T Missouri asserts it needs to provide service to the General Services Administration (GSA), an agency of the government of the United States.

In its Application, AT&T Missouri states that GSA requested ten consecutive 1,000 blocks of Direct Inward Dial ("DID") numbers on behalf of the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency, another federal entity, which is located in St. Louis, Missouri. GSA specifically requested consecutive numbers in the in the 314 NPA with an NXX code of 676. AT&T Missouri states that it has one 1,000 block of numbers with the 314 NPA with an NXX code of 676; specifically, it has the numbers 314-676-0000 through 314-676-0999 available for use. AT&T Missouri requests that the Commission grant it the remaining nine 1,000 blocks in the 314-676 block of numbers from the pool because AT&T Missouri is unable to meet GSA's request from the numbers available in its Creve Coeur rate center.

On November 17, 2005, AT&T Missouri submitted a Thousands-Block Application Form for the 314-676-1000-9999 blocks necessary to meet GSA's request. NANPA denied AT&T Missouri's application on the grounds that AT&T Missouri had not met Missouri's utilization criteria – this Commission has adopted the FCC's utilization requirement of 75% as set forth in 47 C.F.R. Section 52.15 (h).

A carrier may challenge a resource denial before the appropriate state regulatory commission, which may choose to reaffirm or overturn NANPA's decision.<sup>1</sup> Thus this Commission has jurisdiction over this matter.

As part of its application, AT&T Missouri seeks expedited treatment. Therein, AT&T Missouri requests that the Commission act on its application in ten business days. In support of this request, AT&T Missouri states that the GSA wants service to be in place by February 3, 2006. In order to meet that deadline, AT&T Missouri needs the Commission's decision as soon as possible so that it will have sufficient lead time to program its switch. The Commission will resolve this matter as expeditiously as it can.

The Commission finds that proper persons should be allowed seven days from the date of issuance of this order to file a request for intervention. The Commission will direct its Data Center to send a copy of this order to each certificated basic local exchange telecommunications company operating in Missouri. In addition, the Data Center will send a copy of this order to the NANPA. Finally, the Commission will direct its Staff to review AT&T Missouri's filing and to file a Memorandum and Recommendation.
