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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- 2 JUDGE JONES: Let's go ahead and go on the
- 3 record. This is Case No. TT-1010-0109, in the matter of
- 4 Time Warner Cable Information Service (Missouri), LLC's
- 5 proposed tariff revisions. My name is Kennard Jones. I'm
- 6 the judge assigned to this matter.
- 7 At this time we will take entries of
- 8 appearances, beginning with Time Warner.
- 9 MR. STEINER: Yes, your Honor. Let the
- 10 record reflect the appearance of Roger W. Steiner with the
- 11 law firm of Sonnenschein, Nath & Rosenthal. Our address
- 12 is 4520 Main Street, Suite 1100, Kansas City, Missouri
- 13 64111. And I'd also like to enter appearance on behalf of
- 14 Lisa Gilbreath and Mark Johnson. Lisa's with me today,
- 15 but Mark Johnson might be involved in this matter as it
- 16 goes forward.
- 17 JUDGE JONES: Okay. And from the Office of
- 18 the Public Counsel?
- 19 MR. DANDINO: Thank you, your Honor.
- 20 Michael Dandino, Chief Legal Advisor, Missouri Office of
- 21 Public Counsel, Post Office Box 2230, Jefferson City,
- 22 Missouri 65102, representing the Office of Public Counsel
- 23 and the public.
- 24 JUDGE JONES: And from the Staff of the
- 25 Commission?

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1 MS. DALE: Colleen M. Dale, Post Office Box
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- 2 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, on behalf of the
- 3 Staff of the Public Service Commission.
- 4 JUDGE JONES: Okay. As you all know, this
- 5 is an opportunity for you to get together and discuss this
- 6 case to see if it can't be resolved and, if not, how we
- 7 should proceed thereafter.
- 8 There was one concern I wanted to lay out
- 9 initially. In Staff's motion to suspend, they seem to
- 10 indicate that Time Warner could request a waiver of the
- 11 specific statutory requirement that they offer basic local
- 12 teleco service as a separate and distinct service. Are
- 13 you-all in agreement on that, that if you request the
- 14 waiver, the Commission can grant it?
- 15 MR. STEINER: Your Honor, I don't believe
- 16 we can request waiver of a statute.
- JUDGE JONES: Okay.
- 18 MR. STEINER: But I'd like to talk to Staff
- 19 further about that. I think it's been dealt with in other
- 20 cases, an earlier case this year. So I'm not sure if
- 21 waiver is the right language, but we probably will be
- 22 discussing that further.
- JUDGE JONES: All right. Mr. Dandino, you
- 24 sounded like you wanted to say something.
- 25 MR. DANDINO: I don't -- at this point I

1 don't think they can waive that requirement. I quess it's

- 2 a local basic service.
- 3 JUDGE JONES: Okay. Did you want to chime
- 4 in for Staff?
- 5 MS. DALE: Let me say that probably the
- 6 more appropriate word than waiver would be forbearance on
- 7 the part of the Commission.
- 8 JUDGE JONES: Okay. And the last thing I
- 9 wanted to touch on is, the allegation was that there was
- 10 no offering of basic local service in the tariff. Is
- 11 that, in fact, true?
- 12 MR. STEINER: I think as the tariff stands
- 13 now, there is, but in the revised tariff, there's not. Do
- 14 you agree with that, Cully?
- 15 MS. DALE: Yes. The proposed tariff is the
- one that does not have basic local as a separate and
- 17 distinct service.
- 18 JUDGE JONES: Okay. Now, you said your
- 19 current tariff does provide that?
- 20 MR. STEINER: That's right.
- 21 JUDGE JONES: And does the proposed tariff
- 22 change that particular tariff page in the standing tariff?
- MR. STEINER: Yes, it would.
- JUDGE JONES: All right. Those are the
- 25 only concerns I had. Does anyone have any questions for

- 1 me while we're on the record?
- 2 MR. STEINER: Your Honor, this -- we're
- 3 going to speak today, and the deadline's coming up.
- 4 Especially if the court wants -- Commission wants to have
- 5 a hearing, we would probably go ahead and extend the
- 6 effective date further on this tariff depending on what
- 7 happens today. Does anyone see a problem with that?
- 8 MS. DALE: Staff's okay with that.
- 9 MR. DANDINO: No problem.
- 10 MR. STEINER: Okay. Just because the
- 11 date's coming up pretty quick.
- 12 JUDGE JONES: If you do that, then I will
- 13 probably just issue a notice in response, just so that the
- 14 record's clear that the tariff date has been extended.
- 15 Beyond the November 8th date, is that what you mean?
- 16 MR. STEINER: That's what I mean, your
- 17 Honor.
- 18 JUDGE JONES: All right. Are there any
- 19 other concerns that need to be discussed on the record?
- 20 Hearing none, then we're off the record and I'll leave
- 21 you-all to yourselves.
- 22 WHEREUPON, the recorded portion of the
- 23 prehearing conference was concluded.
