ORDER FURTHER SUSPENDING TARIFFS

Case Nos. GT-95-32 and GR-95-33 have been consolidated for hearing purposes. The effective dates of the tariffs underlying these dockets, file numbers 9500014 and 9500015, have been suspended to December 6, 1994. On October 4, 1994, the Commission adopted a procedural schedule calling for an evidentiary hearing on February 14-17, 1995. In order to allow time to complete the hearing as specified in the procedural schedule proposed by the parties and adopted by the Commission, the effective dates should be suspended for an additional six months to June 6, 1995, as permitted by Section 393.150, RSMo (1986).

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**


1. That the proposed tariff submitted by Missouri Gas Energy on July 7, 1994, designed to recover transition costs in compliance with Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Order 636 be suspended for six (6) months beyond the current effective date of December 6, 1994, to June 6, 1995.

2. That the proposed tariff submitted by Missouri Gas Energy on July 7, 1994, designed to expand the availability of transportation service be suspended for six (6) months beyond the current effective date of December 6, 1994, to June 6, 1995.
