In addition, the Information

Office shall send notice of this Order to the publisher of each newspaper located in the proposed service area, as listed in the newspaper directory of the current Official Manual of the State of Missouri, to the members of the General Assembly representing the proposed service area, and to the property owners whose addresses were furnished by Applicant.

Furthermore, the Commission is of the opinion that a hearing should be scheduled at which time Applicant shall present its case in support of its application. The Commission is also of the opinion that, in order to facilitate the hearing process, a procedural schedule should be established, and all parties should be required to file prepared testimony and supporting or relied upon documents.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:
