On September 30, the above individuals from the MPSC and OPC were given a tour of the Energy Trade Floor at the Ameren General Office Building Headquarters at 9:00 a.m. At approximately 11:30 a.m. individuals met at the Sioux Energy Center for a tour of that facility.

Warner Baxter welcomed visitors to the Ameren Missouri Energy Trade Center. Jaime Haro explained that the Energy Trade Center is the information hub for trading energy at Ameren Missouri. He said employees monitor Ameren Missouri's system 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Employees also constantly monitor Ameren Missouri's interaction with the electric grid, and monitor how other market participants interact with the grid. The purpose of the Energy Trade

Center is to maximize off-system sales, mitigate risk and therefore reduce impact on customer rates.

Mark Birk, Keith Stuckmeyer and Steve Garner greeted the visitors at the Sioux Energy Center. Discussion was held regarding the construction of the scrubber and the additional equipment and training requirements mandatory to operate the scrubber. Visitors were then given a tour of the Sioux Energy Center and the scrubber. The tour also included viewing the operating equipment, including and the absorbers that remove the SO₂.
