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- JUDGE STEARLEY: Good morning.
- 3 today's Thursday, September 13th, 2007, and we
- 4 are here for a prehearing conference in the matter
- 5 of the application of Innsbrook Utilities, LLC, for
- 6 Certificate of Convenience and Necessity
- 7 Authorizing it to Own, Operate, Control, Manage,
- 8 Improve, and Maintain a Water and Sewer System for
- 9 the Public, Located in an Incorporated Area of
- 10 Warren County, Missouri, Case No. WA-2008-0018,
- 11 et al.
- 12 My name is Harold Stearley. I'm the
- 13 presiding officer over this matter. The court
- 14 reporter this morning is Pam Fick. And we'll
- 15 begin by taking oral entries of appearance,
- 16 beginning with Innsbrook.
- 17 MR. LUMLEY: Good morning, Judge.

- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Lumley.

- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Stewart.
- 7 Staff of the Missouri Public Service

- 9 MR. KRUEGER: Keith R. Krueger for the

- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Krueger.
- 14 And the Office of the Public Counsel.
- MS. BAKER: Thank you, your Honor.
- 16 Christina Baker, Assistant Public Counsel, P.O. Box
- 17 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, appearing on
- 18 behalf of the Office of Public Counsel and the
- 19 ratepayers.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Thank you,
- 21 Ms. Baker.
- 22 Are there any preliminary matters we
- 23 need to take up at this point in time?
- 24 (NO RESPONSE.)
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Hearing none,

- 1 Mr. Stewart, let me ask a question. On your
- 2 application to intervene, you had indicated that
- 3 the service territory at Innsbrook was seeking a
- 4 certificate for wholly within your water district.
- 5 MR. STEWART: That's my understanding.
- 6 One of -- I might just advise the bench that we have
- 7 been in discussions regarding some of those
- 8 territorial boundaries, and I suspect that we'll
- 9 continue to be discussing that today.
- 10 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. So I'm assuming
- 11 at this point it's not totally clear, or at least it
- 12 remains in dispute factually as to where those
- 13 boundaries may cross or overlap?
- 14 MR. STEWART: Well, generally
- 15 speaking, the district -- I -- again, I don't have
- 16 the maps in front of me, but generally speaking, the
- 17 district has a very large court-approved service
- 18 territory.
- 19 Exactly where those lines fall with
- 20 respect to their requested certificated area, I think
- 21 we're trying to sort through that. But that's one of
- 22 the issues we're talking about.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. And the only
- 24 reason I was asking for clarification is I was
- 25 trying to pinpoint if we're looking at just simply

- 1 legal issues in this matter, in which case the
- 2 commissioners determined it's really not in the
- 3 public interest to have hearings if there's no
- 4 factual matters in dispute; we're just looking
- 5 at legal issues.
- But it sounds like the parties have
- 7 a little work to do to figure out exactly where
- 8 the territories are and if there's some legal
- 9 barriers here in terms of the application for
- 10 certificate.
- So I guess there's no other preliminary
- 12 matters we need to take up. I did ask for a
- 13 procedural schedule to be filed by next week.
- 14 However, if the parties are in
- 15 discussions and they are reaching some kind of
- 16 an agreement or there's another route that they
- 17 want to go, then you're certainly free to file a
- 18 status report instead on September 20th just to
- 19 advise the Commission of where the parties are at
- 20 with this.
- 21 Anything else we need to take up at
- 22 this time?
- 23 (NO RESPONSE.)
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Very well. We
- 25 will go ahead and end the on-the-record portion of

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the prehearing conference and I'll leave you-all
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    to your discussions. Thank you all very much.
