## ORDER DIRECTING FILING

The Missouri Public Service Commission is directing Staff to file a status report and noting a matter raised in some of the parties' filings.

Such filings seek a Commission order recognizing a sale or transfer of assets effective August 18, 2010. Section 393.190.1, RSMo 2000, provides:

No . . . water corporation . . . shall hereafter sell, . . . transfer, . . . or otherwise dispose of . . . any part of its . . . system . . . without having first secured from the commission an order authorizing it so to do.

Similar language appears in Section 393.170.1, RSMo 2000. Under that statute, the Missouri Court of Appeals voided a Commission order purporting to approve an application retroactively.<sup>1</sup>

Such law must figure in any discussion of the timing of authorization for the sale or transfer of assets.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. No later than April 29, 2011, the Commission's staff shall file a report on the status of the parties' negotiations.

- 2. Any proposed disposition of the application on the merits filed with the Commission shall address the timing issue described in the body of this order.
  - 3. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
