## ORDER DIRECTING NOTICE

The Missouri Public Service Commission is sending tax revenue impact information as the statutes require:

The commission shall send a copy of all information obtained by it as to what, if any, impact such sale . . . will have on the tax revenues of various political subdivisions to the county clerk of each county in which any portion of a political subdivision which will be affected by such disposition is located. [<sup>1</sup>]

Staff's recommendation<sup>2</sup> states that the sale of U.S. Water Company's system to the City of Lexington, Missouri, will have an impact on tax revenues. The Commission will also set a deadline for any affected political subdivision to file an application to intervene.

### THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Commission's Data Center shall transmit this order, with a copy of the *Staff Recommendation*, to the county clerk of Lafayette County.

2. Any political subdivision that will be affected by the sale of U.S. Water Company's system to the City of Lexington, Missouri, may file an application to intervene no later than October 1, 2010.
