

REBUTTAL TESTIMONY

Q. Please state your name and business address.

A. My name is Michelle A. Bocklage, and my business address is Missouri Public Service Commission, P. O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.

Q. What is your present position at the Missouri Public Service Commission (“Commission”)?

A. I am a Rate & Tariff Examiner II in the Energy Unit of the Regulatory Review Division of the Commission Staff (“Staff”).

Q. Please state your educational background.

A. I have a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Columbia College, Columbia, Missouri.

Q. Please describe the experience you have had with regard to public utilities.

A. As a Rate & Tariff Examiner II, my primary responsibility is to review and make recommendations regarding electric utility demand-side management (“DSM”) program tariff sheets and electric utility fuel adjustment clause tariff sheets. Prior to joining the Energy Unit in January 2011, I was employed by the Commission as a Consumer Services Specialist for approximately 11 years. As a Consumer Services Specialist, I was responsible for investigating formal and informal customer complaints to ensure compliance with the Commission’s rules and regulations.

1 Q. Would you please summarize the purpose of your rebuttal testimony?

2 A. The purpose of my rebuttal testimony is to identify and discuss Staff's
3 concerns regarding the proposed tariff sheets,¹ filed as Schedule ADD-13 to the direct
4 testimony of Allen Dennis, witness for KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company
5 ("GMO" or "Company").

6 Staff makes the following recommendations concerning GMO's proposed tariff sheets
7 for its DSM programs:

- 8 1. The Commission reject the tariff sheets GMO filed with its application;
- 9 2. The Commission order GMO to file tariff sheets that comply with its
10 Commission-approved DSM programs and Commission-approved demand-
11 side programs investment mechanism ("DSIM") following the completion of
12 this case and prior to GMO's implementation of such programs and investment
13 mechanism, as agreed in the Jointly Proposed Procedural Schedule filed on
14 January 30, 2012; and
- 15 3. The Commission direct GMO to include in the compliance tariff sheets the
16 following:
 - 17 • Additional language relating to Rule 4 CSR 240-20.094(6)(J);
 - 18 • Additional language relating to Rule 4 CSR 240-20.094(7);
 - 19 • The amount of the incentive and/or rebate associated with each
20 demand-side measure for each DSM program;

¹ All proposed tariff sheets are for DSM programs, except for tariff sheets with Original Sheet Nos. 139, 140, 141, 142 and 143, which are for the proposed DSIM.

- Information regarding the marketing strategy that identifies the methods GMO intends to utilize to market each proposed program to customers;
- Description of the relationship of each DSM program to each other DSM program within GMO's tariff sheets to indicate whether or not programs can be combined to maximize the incentives and/or rebates;
- Annual energy and demand savings targets for each DSM program; and
- Identification of the Commission-approved Missouri Energy Efficiency Investment Act of 2009 ("MEEIA") DSM programs within the title section of each tariff sheet to prevent confusion regarding which programs are MEEIA programs.

Q. GMO filed tariff sheets where it proposes that programs be "frozen." Does Staff have any concerns with them?

A. Yes. In Allen D. Dennis' testimony, page 5, he refers to "Schedule ADD-13: New tariffs for GMO's existing and new DSM programs." After reviewing Schedule ADD-13, Staff found that GMO filed both "original" and "frozen" tariff sheets for programs that are currently in effect. In an effort to phase out the current programs in effect, GMO proposes to revise the current tariff sheets with language indicating the programs are "frozen"—meaning only existing participants could continue in the programs.

As a result of discussions with GMO staff members, Staff understands that GMO intends to utilize the "frozen" tariff sheets as a means to meet the obligations already approved under the current tariff sheets. GMO anticipates it will withdraw the "frozen" revised tariff sheets in approximately six (6) months. In order to include some of the current

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1 programs in the MEEIA filing, GMO also filed new “original” tariff sheets for Commission
2 approval of programs as part of its MEEIA filing. This could result in some programs having
3 two sets of tariff sheets in effect at the same time, which could lead to confusion as to which
4 programs are available to customers under MEEIA. Therefore, Staff recommends that GMO
5 revise the titles of the proposed MEEIA programs so that they are easily identifiable within its
6 tariff. For example, the Energy Star New Homes program filed as part of MEEIA could
7 simply be modified to include the acronym “MEEIA” within the program title to identify it as
8 a program the Commission has approved under MEEIA.

9 Q. Has Staff reviewed GMO’s proposed tariff sheets for compliance with the
10 Commission’s MEEIA rules and for clarity?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Do they comply with the Commission’s MEEIA rules?

13 A. Additional information is needed in the tariff sheets to comply with
14 requirements of the Commission’s MEEIA rules, and for ease of use and clarification.

15 Rule 4 CSR 240-20.094(6)(J) states:

16 “A customer electing not to participate in an electric utility’s demand-side
17 programs under this section shall still be allowed to participate in interruptible
18 or curtailable rate schedules or tariffs offered by the electric utility.”

19 Therefore, all non-residential DSM program tariff sheets should clarify whether or not
20 the program is considered an interruptible or curtailable rate schedule so that customers who
21 opt out of participation in DSM programs know which programs they may participate in.

22 Rule 4 CSR 240-20.094(7) contains language excluding participation in DSM
23 programs providing monetary incentives by customers that receive tax credits “under sections
24 135.350 through 135.362, RSMo, or under sections 253.545 through 253.561, RSMo.” DSM
25 program tariff sheets should include language that explicitly explains this exclusion and a

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1 description of the method GMO intends to use to obtain an attestation from customers that
2 they have not received the referenced tax credits prior to receiving any monetary incentives
3 from the program.

4 Staff is concerned that the DSM programs tariff sheets GMO has proposed do not
5 contain important information needed to provide clarity and definition of each program,
6 information such as marketing strategy, relationship of a DSM program to any other DSM
7 program, designation whether or not programs can be combined to maximize the incentives
8 and/or rebates offered, and annual energy and demand savings targets.

9 Q. Does Staff have any concerns with the titles of the Commission-approved
10 MEEIA DSM programs in the GMO proposed tariff sheets?

11 A. Yes. Staff is concerned that customers will be confused. The titles in the tariff
12 should be clear as to whether or not each program is a Commission-approved MEEIA DSM
13 program, since some of the MEEIA DSM programs and some of the current programs are
14 very similar.

15 Q. Is the Commission required to approve DSIM tariff sheets?

16 A. Yes. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-20.093(2)(C) states “The commission shall
17 approve the establishment, continuation, or modification of a DSIM and associated tariff
18 sheets if it finds the electric utility’s approved demand-side programs are expected to result in
19 energy and demand savings and are beneficial to all customers in the customer class in which
20 the programs are proposed, regardless of whether the programs are utilized by all customers”.

21 Q. Does Staff recommend that the Commission approve GMO’s proposed DSIM
22 tariff sheets?

1 A. No. Rule 4 CSR 240-20.093(2)(C) requires that the Commission approve a
2 DSIM and associated tariff sheets. However, since Staff has recommendations concerning
3 changes to the DSIM tariff sheets and other parties to GMO's MEEIA case may have
4 recommendations concerning the DSIM, Staff recommends that the Commission initially
5 reject the filed DSIM tariff sheets and order GMO to submit DSIM compliance tariff sheets
6 following the conclusion of this case.

7 Q. What is Staff's overall recommendation regarding the tariff sheets GMO filed
8 with its application in this case?

9 A. Staff recommends that the Commission reject the tariff sheets GMO filed
10 ("frozen" and "original"), and order GMO to file proposed compliance tariff sheets following
11 the conclusion of this case that comply with the DSM programs and DSIM the Commission
12 approves in this case, which include the recommendations Staff has presented above. GMO
13 previously agreed to submit compliance tariff sheets following the conclusion of this case in
14 the Jointly Proposed Procedural Schedule filed on January 30, 2012, and prior to GMO
15 implementing such DSM programs and a DSIM² for the reasons stated previously. The tariff
