JOINT APPLICATION

COMES NOW Union Electric Company ("UE") and Macon Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("Cooperative"), hereinafter referred to collectively as "Applicants", and for their Joint Application to the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission"), pursuant to Section 394.312 RSMo. (1994), for an order approving Applicants' Territorial Agreement and approving a change in electric suppliers, state as follows:

1. The Applicants - UE is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Missouri and has its principal office at 1901 Chouteau Avenue, St. Louis, Missouri 63103. It is an electrical corporation subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission engaged in the sale and distribution of electricity in portions of Missouri, including Macon, Randolph, Monroe, Shelby, Adair, Linn, Knox, Sullivan, and Chariton Counties.

Cooperative is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Missouri and has its principal office at Business Highway 36 East, Macon, Missouri 63552. It is a Chapter 394 cooperative corporation engaged in the distribution of electric energy and service to its members within Macon, Randolph, Monroe, Shelby, Adair, Linn, Knox, Sullivan, and Chariton Counties, in Missouri.

3. The Territorial Agreement - Subject to the terms and conditions of an agreement between UE and Cooperative ("Territorial Agreement"), a copy of which is attached to this Application and made a part hereof as Attachment A, Applicants have specifically designated boundaries defining the exclusive electric service area of UE and Cooperative in all or portions of Macon, Randolph, Monroe, Shelby, Adair, Linn, Knox, Sullivan, and Chariton Counties. These boundaries are particularly described in the Territorial Agreement. A metes and bounds description of the exclusive electric service area of Cooperative established by the Territorial Agreement and a map (comparable to

Highway Department maps and drawn on a half-inch per mile scale) depicting that service area are part of Attachment A and are incorporated into this Application and made a part hereof for all purposes. The exclusive electric service area of UE is described as all of certain counties except for the areas designated as the exclusive service area of Cooperative in those counties.

The Territorial Agreement will require both UE and Cooperative to transfer property, a description of which, including any franchises, permits or operating rights is contained in Attachment A.

Other terms and conditions of the Territorial Agreement are similar to those in territorial agreements between UE and other rural electric cooperatives. Specifically, the case-by-case addendum term in the Territorial Agreement is identical to the language approved in Case No. EO-95-400.

- 4. Resolutions of the Boards of Directors A certified copy of the resolution of the Board of Directors of Cooperative authorizing the consummation of the transaction contemplated by this Joint Application is attached hereto as Attachment B and made a part hereof for all purposes. A certified copy of the resolution of the Board of Directors of UE authorizing the consummation of the transaction contemplated by this Joint Application is attached hereto as Attachment C and made a part hereof for all purposes.
- 5. Articles of Incorporation UE has previously filed a certified copy of its
 Restated Articles of Incorporation (as evidence that it is a corporation in good standing)
 in a case entitled "In the matter of the Application of Union Electric Company for a
 Variance from the Provisions of Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-14 to Meet the Unregulated
 Competition in a Subdivision in the City of Linn, Osage County, Missouri." A certified

copy of Cooperatives's Articles of Incorporation is attached hereto as Attachment D and made a part hereof for all purposes.

- 6. Tax Impact Statement A Tax Impact Statement as required by Section 393.190, RSMo. (1994) and 4 CSR 240-2.060(3)(E), is attached hereto as Attachment E.
- 7. Authority to Serve in Proposed Areas UE will need a certificate of public convenience and necessity for those areas which are presently served by Cooperative and pursuant to the Agreement UE proposes to serve. UE will file an application for a certificate of public convenience and necessity for these areas at a later date. The Cooperative has statutory authority in the areas it proposes to serve.
- 8. Other Electrical Suppliers The following is a list of electric suppliers operating in the area covered by the Territorial Agreement:

The following is a list of cities operating municipally-owned utilities within the area covered by the Territorial Agreement: Marceline, Macon, LaPlata, Shelbina, Milan, Linneous, Paris, Monroe City, and Honeywell.

9. Other Findings and Orders Required by the Commission - In addition to approving the Territorial Agreement, UE and Cooperative will require the Commission to issue either findings or orders on the following matters:

A. UE will still have occasion to construct, operate and maintain facilities in the electric service territory of the Cooperative as described in the Territorial Agreement. UE will also continue to have service responsibilities beyond the boundaries of the Territorial Agreement unaffected by its terms. In general, UE will need the authority to construct, operate and maintain facilities through the electric service area of Cooperative. In particular, UE requires a finding of the Commission that the Territorial Agreement will not impair the Company's existing certificates of public convenience and necessity except as specifically limited by the Agreement.

- B. Applicants will also require an Order of the Commission granting them the authority to switch suppliers of electric service for those customers to be exchanged pursuant to the Territorial Agreement. Lists of customers to be exchanged by UE and Cooperative are attached hereto as Attachments F and G, respectively.
- C. The exchange of customers will require each Applicant to final bill its customers prior to being transferred to the other Applicant. As a new customer of the other Applicant, the transferred customer will have no incentive to pay the final bill.

 Therefore, the Applicants request the Commission waive the application of 4 CSR 240-13.010 et al. ("the Billing Practices Rule") and authorize the Applicants to disconnect the service of any customer who fails to pay the final bill of the other Applicant.
- D. UE will also require an Order of the Commission granting it the authority to transfer certain property in accordance with the terms of this Agreement to Cooperative.

- 10. Agreement Is in the Public Interest The Territorial Agreement is in the public interest because it establishes exclusive service territories for UE and Cooperative by exchanging certain electric facilities and customers. The establishment of exclusive service territories will eliminate duplication of electric service facilities, concentrate the electric service territories of the parties, increase economic efficiencies, and benefit the public safety and aesthetics of the community. The proposed transfer of assets aids UE and Cooperative in obtaining the benefits discussed above. The Territorial Agreement will also allow electric service customers to know with certainty the supplier of their electric service.
- Directors of Cooperative, UE and Cooperative mailed notices to all consumers proposed to be transferred to a new supplier pursuant to this proposed Agreement. Copies of these notices and accompanying informational brochures are attached hereto as Attachment H. In addition UE and Cooperative held public meetings in Macon at the Long Branch Restaurant on May 13, 1996, Moberly at the Ramada Inn on May 14, 1996, Bucklin at the Bucklin School on May 15, 1996, and Shelbyville at the Moonshiners Building on May 16, 1996. A total of seventy-six (76) consumers attended the four meetings and made comments on the proposed agreement. Forty (40) consumers were Cooperative members who would be transferred to UE and thirty-six (36) were UE customers who would be transferred to Cooperative. Attached is a summary, marked Attachment I, of the comments made by consumers attending the public meetings and the responses of UE and Cooperative to the issues and concerns raised by these consumers.

12. Fees - The Commission's fee required by 4 CSR 240-21.010 is submitted herewith.

WHEREFORE, Applicants respectfully request that the Public Service Commission of Missouri issue its Order:

- A. Finding the designated electric service areas to be not detrimental to the public interest and approving the Territorial Agreement;
- B. Authorizing Applicants to perform in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Agreement, Attachment A to the Joint Application;
- C. Finding that the Territorial Agreement shall not impair UE's certificates of convenience and necessity except as specifically limited by the Agreement;
- D. Waiving the Commission's Billing Practices Rule and allowing the Applicants to disconnect electric service to a customer who fails to pay the final bill of the other Applicant;
- E. Granting Applicants the authority to change electric service providers for certain customers pursuant to the terms of the Territorial Agreement; and
- F. Granting Applicants the authority to transfer certain property pursuant to the terms of the Territorial Agreement.
