Dear Public Service Commission,

I am writing in response to psc recommendation for water to my vacant lot. Please be advised I NEVER told anyone I was going to use a (SUCKER PUMP, OR BOOSTER PUMP) on my lot I never ever said that, this language was added by others not versed in plumbing. I have always asked for a one-inch meter yoke and tap. The reason is very simple in the profession; a larger diameter pipe and tap reduce line loss due to friction. That is the only reason period! A SUCKER PUMP OR BOOSTER WOULD REQUIRE ELECTRIC. I have no electric nor am I planning to put in a service to my lot or adjacent farmland. I simply want water to water plants now in. I also counted at least four vacant lots with a farmer's hydrant in use. If water would be granted to my lot I will agree to IH utilities request to NOT permanently at any time take water to my adjacent farmland. IF in the future ih utilities' expands it tariff area I could reserve the right to ask for water IF I ever chose to. THANK YOU
