On July 13, 2007, pursuant to Section 393.170, RSMo 2000, and Commission Rules 4 CSR 240-2.060, 4 CSR 240-3.305, and 4 CSR-3.600, Innsbrook Utilities, LLC, ("Innsbrook") filed two applications (as captioned in the styles of these cases above) with the Missouri Public Service Commission. Innsbrook requests that the Commission grant it authority to own, operate, control, manage, improve and maintain a water and sewer system for the public in an incorporated area of Warren County, Missouri. Specifically, the water and sewer service is to be provided to the Village of Innsbrook, a community composed of a mixture of single family homes and recreational chalets.

On July 17, the Commission issued notice for both matters and set an intervention date of August 6. No requests for intervention were filed.

The Commission will need a recommendation from its Staff before acting on Innsbrook's applications. Therefore, the Commission will direct its Staff to file a pleading indicating when it will be able to file recommendations in these matters.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- No later than August 13, 2007, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission shall file a pleading responding to Innsbrook Utilities, LLC,'s applications for Certificates of Convenience and Necessity and state in that response when it anticipates filing its recommendations in these cases.
