ORDER OF DEFAULT

Issue Date: October 4, 2005 Effective Date: October 14, 2005

On August 4, 2005, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a complaint against Franklin County Water Company, Inc. Staff stated that the company has not filed its annual reports for 2004 and 2003. Staff informed the Commission that Franklin County Water Company is a water and sewer company as defined in Section 386.020, RSMo 2000, and is therefore subject to the Commission's jurisdiction. Staff further stated that the Missouri Secretary of State's website indicates that the company is in good standing. For its relief, Staff requests that the Commission authorize its General Counsel to bring a penalty action in Circuit Court against the company under Section 386.600. The company has not responded to Staff's complaint.

Section 393.140 (6), RSMo 2000, states that any corporation failing to file its annual

report within the time prescribed by the Commission shall be liable to the state of Missouri

for \$100 per day for each day it is not timely filed. Commission rule 4 CSR 240-3.335

requires that annual reports be filed no later than April 15 of each year. Commission rule

4 CSR 240-2.070(9) allows the Commission to find in default a Respondent who does not

timely answer a complaint. Franklin County has not answered Staff's complaint. The

Commission therefore deems the averments set forth by Staff to be admitted by Franklin

County and finds the company in default. Having found Franklin County in default, the

Commission will authorize its General Counsel to bring a penalty action against the

company in Circuit Court.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That the Missouri Public Service Commission's General Counsel is authorized 1.

to bring a penalty action as set forth in the body of this order.

2. That this order shall become effective on October 14, 2005.

3. That this case may be closed on October 15, 2005.
