- 2 (WHEREUPON, the public hearing began
- 3 at 7:05 p.m.)
- 4 JUDGE BURTON: We're on the record in
- 5 the matter of the application of Ridge Creek Water
- 6 Company, LLC for a certificate of convenience and
- 7 necessity authorizing it to construct, install,
- 8 own, operate, control, manage and maintain a water
- 9 system for the public located in an unincorporated
- 10 area in Pulaski County, Missouri. This is File
- 11 No. WA-2015-0182.
- Good evening, everyone. My name is
- 13 Kim Burton. I'm a Regulatory Law Judge with the
- 14 Missouri Public Service Commission. I don't have
- 15 the microphone on right now, so just raise your
- 16 hands if you can't hear me or if you have any
- 17 difficulties hearing me.
- 18 Right now, I'm here on behalf of the
- 19 Commission. Everything that will be offered as
- 20 testimony will be part of the record and will be
- 21 reviewed by the five Commissioners later. And you
- 22 see this lovely lady over here that is transcribing
- 23 everything that is going to be stated.
- Now, what will happen is I have a
- 25 list of two individuals who have printed your name.

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- 1 I know you've already had the Q and A session, but
- 2 if you'd like to, I'd ask you to please come up
- 3 here to the podium and I will swear you in. I'll
- 4 take your testimony. I might have some questions
- 5 for you. If not, I would ask that you please stay
- 6 up at the podium because all of the attorneys
- 7 present will have an opportunity to ask you a
- 8 question.
- 9 Now, I know they probably already
- 10 answered some questions you might have had
- 11 previously, but this way the Commission will have
- 12 an opportunity to review and ensure that everything
- 13 is answered on the record. So please stay up at
- 14 the podium until I excuse you.
- Now, I know we just have two people
- 16 up here who have identified themselves as possibly
- 17 wanting to testify today. Now, perhaps all of your
- 18 questions were answered during the question and
- 19 answer session. If so, you don't have to testify.
- 20 But if for some reason your name isn't on here,
- 21 I'll see if you want to testify and you'll have an
- 22 opportunity to come up afterwards.
- Now, at this time I'm going to go
- 24 ahead and have the parties enter their appearance
- 25 for the record, and we'll start with the

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- 1 representatives for Ridge Creek Water Company, LLC.
- 2 MR. COMLEY: Good evening, Judge
- 3 Burton. Let the record reflect the entry of
- 4 Mark W. Comley of Newman, Comley & Ruth on behalf
- 5 of Ridge Creek Water Company, LLC.
- JUDGE BURTON: Thank you, Mr. Comley.
- 7 And on behalf of the Staff of the Missouri Public
- 8 Service Commission?
- 9 MS. MUETH: Marcella Mueth.
- 10 JUDGE BURTON: And on behalf of the
- 11 Office of the Public Counsel?
- MS. BAKER: Thank you. Christina
- 13 Baker, P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri
- 14 65109, appearing on behalf of the Office of the
- 15 Public Counsel and the customers.
- JUDGE BURTON: Thank you. And the
- 17 Missouri Department of Natural Resources?
- 18 MS. FOLTA: Thais Folta, T-h-a-i-s,
- 19 Folta, F-o-l-t-a, attorney with the Attorney
- 20 General's Office, here on behalf of DNR.
- 21 JUDGE BURTON: All right. Thank you.
- 22 At this time I would ask James Laderer to please
- 23 step forward. Now, would you please raise your
- 24 right hand.
- 25 (Witness sworn.)

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- 1 JUDGE BURTON: Would you please state
- 2 your name and spell it for the record.
- 3 MR. LADERER: James Laderer,
- J-a-m-e-s, L-a-d-e-r-e-r.
- JUDGE BURTON: All right. Thank you.
- 6 MR. LADERER: You're welcome. Ma'am,
- 7 earlier, a few years ago, we got a letter stating
- 8 that Ridge Creek had installed water meters, and
- 9 according to their letter, they realized that it
- 10 was going to be too cost prohibitive for them to
- 11 operate this.
- Now, one of the things that I have an
- issue with is, it seems to me that they're going
- 14 to -- they would stand to lose money because my
- 15 typical water bill when I was in North Carolina was
- 16 between 20 and \$24. Now I'm paying a flat fee of
- 17 \$33 a month.
- Now, I understand it'd probably
- 19 fluctuate a little bit, different areas, different
- 20 states. However, a \$13 uptick is quite
- 21 significant. And if they have already installed
- 22 all of this equipment, they should be utilizing
- 23 this equipment.
- 24 And one of the things that's also
- 25 hurting us is because I've been over a year without

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- 1 a water bill -- or correction, a sewer bill or
- 2 anything like that. The sewer district had to
- 3 charge me on the -- what the DNR says that they
- 4 have to charge me. Now, that right there comes out
- 5 to about another \$65 or so. So approximately every
- 6 month I pay \$100 for water and sewer.
- 7 If these meters were in place and the
- 8 sewer district could see how much water I was
- 9 actually using, they too could properly bill me
- 10 instead of me having to pay an exorbitant amount of
- 11 money each month for water and sewer.
- 12 So I would like to offer in this
- 13 letter.
- JUDGE BURTON: Okay. It's got two
- 15 pages, correct?
- MR. LADERER: Yes, ma'am.
- 17 JUDGE BURTON: I'm going to give the
- 18 attorneys an opportunity to review this if you
- 19 would like.
- 20 MR. LADERER: That was the one
- 21 stating about the water meters. And the second
- 22 one, and many of the other residents also received
- 23 it, is the one for the billing that we haven't been
- 24 billed for for nine months. And we weren't going
- 25 to pay because we didn't receive a bill. Every

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- 1 other utility or creditor that we have every month
- 2 we receive a bill or quarterly or however it's
- 3 established, and we pay those. Well, without
- 4 having an actual invoice or something to prove
- 5 where our money is going to, we didn't feel
- 6 comfortable actually paying the quarterly fees.
- 7 And now, Ms. Stoner has sent out a
- 8 letter stating that, you know, she was behind
- 9 sending out the bills, which was perfectly fine,
- 10 and that she wanted us to pay it, and that's
- 11 perfectly fine as well because we were using the
- 12 water.
- However, in here she said that she
- 14 wanted the first bill due pretty much upon receipt
- of the bill, and then the one for the following
- 16 quarter two weeks later, and the following quarter
- 17 another two weeks later, which comes out to
- 18 approximately \$300. So within four to six weeks,
- 19 an outlay of \$300 just for water.
- 20 And on the Facebook page for our
- 21 neighborhood, she had said that we had until the
- 22 July billing period to have this paid. So I'd also
- 23 like to offer up this as well, ma'am.
- I guess my chief concern and
- 25 complaint is that the inconsistency of the billing,

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- 1 the higher prices that we have to pay, some of us
- 2 have to pay to the sewer district. And also
- 3 Ms. Stoner claims that the water was tested for
- 4 potability and drinkability June of last year. So
- 5 all these wells are not getting properly tested for
- 6 drinking water.
- 7 I have a three-year-old and a
- 8 ten-month-old at home. So obviously my concerns
- 9 are quite high. Is the water that I'm using to
- 10 prepare our food and give to my children and bathe
- 11 my children in actually safe for me and my entire
- 12 family? And these things are not, in my opinion,
- 13 being properly addressed.
- 14 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Thank you. I
- 15 have a few questions for you.
- MR. LADERER: Yes, ma'am.
- 17 JUDGE BURTON: First of all, where do
- 18 you reside?
- 19 MR. LADERER: I live at 18730 Lynn
- 20 Lane.
- 21 JUDGE BURTON: And that's -- is that
- 22 in a certain subdivision?
- 23 MR. LADERER: It's in the Ridge Creek
- 24 Subdivision, ma'am.
- JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Now, you

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- 1 identified -- I'm going to go ahead and, for the
- 2 parties to know -- hold on one second. We're going
- 3 to mark the first exhibit, the Ridge Creek
- 4 development later dated November 30th, 2013 as
- 5 LPH-1. And I believe that the attorney for Staff
- 6 is still reviewing the second item that was
- 7 produced by Mr. Laderer, and I'm going to have that
- 8 marked as LPH-2.
- 9 So it's the Ridge Creek residence in
- 10 the Ridge Creek Subdivision whenever you state that
- 11 the individuals we didn't -- weren't going to pay
- 12 because you got the letter late; is that correct?
- MR. LADERER: No, no. Me, my wife
- 14 and I. So yes, it was just my household. It was a
- 15 decision that we made. I'm not speaking for any
- 16 other residents of the neighborhood.
- 17 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. I just wanted
- 18 to check and see.
- MR. LADERER: Yes, ma'am.
- JUDGE BURTON: Okay. I think those
- 21 are all the questions I have for you right now, but
- 22 hold on one moment, please.
- 23 Have the attorneys had an opportunity
- 24 to review the exhibits? Are there any objections
- 25 to the admission of Exhibits LPH-1 and LPH-2?

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1	MR. COMLEY: No.	
2	MS. BAKER: No objection.	
3	MS. FOLTA: No.	
4	MS. MUETH: No.	
5	JUDGE BURTON: LPH-1 and LPH-2 will	
6	be admitted into the record.	
7	(EXHIBIT NOS. LPH-1 AND LPH-2 WERE	
8	RECEIVED INTO EVIDENCE.)	
9	JUDGE BURTON: I actually did have	
10	another question for you. You mentioned the water	
11	service from Ridge Creek. However, it looks like	
12	it's Ridge Creek Development, LLC?	
13	MR. LADERER: Yes.	
14	JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Not Ridge Creek	
15	Water Company, LLC?	
16	MR. LADERER: As far as I know,	
17	they're one and the same, ma'am.	
18	MR. COMLEY: For clarification,	
19	Judge, the Applicant is a different LLC than the	
20	development company. The assets of the water	
21	system are developed by the development company,	
22	and that's the letterhead for the development	
23	company.	
24	JUDGE BURTON: Okay. All right.	
25	Now, at this time I'm going to see if any of the	

Page 12 attorneys have any questions for you. Mr. Comley? 2 MR. COMLEY: Mr. Laderer, you were in 3 the question and answer session earlier this evening, were you not? 4 5 MR. LADERER: Yes, sir. 6 MR. COMLEY: You understand that you 7 have until July of this year to pay the bill that you referred to in your testimony? 8 9 MR. LADERER: Yes, sir. However, in the letter it states the 15th of May, I believe. 10 11 MR. COMLEY: To confirm, you 12 understand that Ms. Stoner this evening has said 13 that you have until July? 14 MR. LADERER: Yes, sir. Yes. 15 MR. COMLEY: I have no other questions. 16 17 JUDGE BURTON: Staff? MS. MUETH: No questions, your Honor. 18 19 JUDGE BURTON: DNR? 20 MS. FOLTA: Mr. Laderer, how long 21 have you lived in Ridge Creek? 22 MR. LADERER: Just over two years 23 now. MS. FOLTA: That's all. 24 25 JUDGE BURTON: OPC?

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- 1 MS. BAKER: No questions. Thank you.
- JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Thank you. I
- 3 actually do have a question for you. These are
- 4 going to be admitted into the record. So is that
- 5 okay if you don't receive it back?
- 6 MR. LADERER: Well, if I could just
- 7 receive a copy back, that would be -- I don't need
- 8 to get the original. I'd just like to have a copy.
- 9 My wife is very meticulous about this, about our
- 10 bills.
- MS. BAKER: I can make copies and
- 12 give you them.
- 13 JUDGE BURTON: That will work then.
- 14 Thank you very much. We'll make sure, as long as
- 15 Ms. Baker has your contact information.
- 16 MR. LADERER: It does not need to be
- 17 this evening.
- JUDGE BURTON: All right. Thank you.
- 19 Next up we have Brian White.
- MR. WHITE: Good evening, ma'am.
- 21 (Witness sworn.)
- JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Would you
- 23 please state your name and spell it for the record.
- MR. WHITE: Brian White, B-r-i-a-n,
- W-h-i-t-e.

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- JUDGE BURTON: Okay.
- MR. WHITE: Ma'am, I've been a
- 3 resident of Ridge Creek Development since September
- 4 2008, and from that time up until where we are
- 5 today, when I initially moved in we were paying a
- 6 flat water rate of \$28 per month for every month
- 7 with the exception of, I want to say, June, July or
- 8 August our rates was increased to \$33 a month, and
- 9 that was due to the summer, people watering grass,
- 10 kids playing in the water, whatever the case may
- 11 be.
- 12 October/November time frame of 2013
- 13 is when all the residents received the letter from
- 14 the Stoners saying that they were going to meter
- 15 all of the wells and that we would be charged a
- 16 flat rate for the first 5,000 gallons and then an
- 17 additional rate per every thousand gallons over
- 18 that. We were told that that billing was going to
- 19 start in January of 2014.
- In January of 2014, when that billing
- 21 did not start, I contacted Mr. Stoner, and he told
- 22 me that there was a glitch between the computer
- 23 system and the meters that was installed on all of
- 24 the wells. That's why they wasn't being put into
- 25 use. He also stated at that time that they were

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- 1 sending a letter out saying that the monthly rate
- 2 for water was going to be a flat rate of \$33.
- 3
 I present to the court that that's
- 4 high. Although this is not my bill, this is a bill
- 5 from one of my coworkers who lives in the city of
- 6 St. Robert, that shows her water consumption or her
- 7 bill for the last month was \$22.50.
- 8 It's my opinion that the people of
- 9 Ridge Creek are being charged an exorbitant amount
- 10 of money just for the water. Our water, as
- 11 previously stated, has not been tested. Although,
- 12 you know, they say that the water was tested in
- 13 June of last year, we have no proof of that. None
- 14 of the residents have proof of that.
- The water is hard. Even running my
- 16 water through a water softener, this past weekend I
- 17 had to vacuum out all the sediment out of the
- 18 bottom of my hot water tank just to get it to
- 19 operate, and I had to replace both heating
- 20 elements.
- 21 So there's definitely water issues in
- 22 Ridge Creek that needs to be looked at, and I just
- 23 ask that the Public Service Commission holds their
- 24 feet to the fires and we get this taken care of.
- 25 That's all I had.

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- 1 MS. BURTON: All right. Well, thank
- 2 you.
- 3 MR. WHITE: I would like to present
- 4 this to the court. Again, that is a bill from one
- 5 of my coworkers.
- JUDGE BURTON: I'm going to mark this
- 7 as LPH-3. If the parties would like to review this
- 8 and state if they have any objections to the
- 9 admission.
- MS. FOLTA: No objection, your Honor.
- 11 MS. MUETH: Staff has no objection,
- 12 your Honor.
- JUDGE BURTON: All right. Thank you.
- MS. BAKER: No objection. I would
- 15 just ask that the pertinent information be
- 16 redacted.
- MR. COMLEY: Your Honor, my objection
- 18 would be if it's offered for any purpose other than
- 19 a rate comparison between the water district and a
- 20 utility company regulated by the Commission. If
- 21 it's offered for that purpose, I have no objection.
- JUDGE BURTON: Okay. We'll limit it
- 23 to that purpose, and I will make sure before it's
- 24 actually admitted into the record that any of the
- 25 private information for Mr. and Mrs. Buckley is

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1	going to be redacted from this bill.	
2	(EXHIBIT LPH-3 WAS RECEIVED INTO	
3	EVIDENCE, PENDING REDACTION OF PRIVATE	
4	INFORMATION.)	
5	MR. WHITE: Thank you.	
6	JUDGE BURTON: Are there any	
7	questions from company?	
8	MR. COMLEY: I have none.	
9	JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Staff?	
10	MS. MUETH: Just a few. Mr. White,	
11	you said that you were contacted and informed that	
12	your bill you would be receiving a notification	
13	that your bill was going to increase to \$33 a	
14	month?	
15	MR. WHITE: Yes, ma'am.	
16	MS. MUETH: Did you ever get that	
17	notification in the mail?	
18	MR. WHITE: I do not believe so, no,	
19	ma'am.	
20	MS. MUETH: Were you told when that	
21	\$33 a month rate would take effect?	
22	MR. WHITE: January of 2014, when the	
23	rates did go up.	
24	MS. MUETH: And you did begin	
25	receiving bills at that time for that \$33?	

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1	MR. WHITE: Sporadically, yes.	
2	MS. MUETH: I have no further	
3	questions.	
4	JUDGE BURTON: DNR?	
5	MS. FOLTA: No questions.	
6	JUDGE BURTON: OPC?	
7	MS. BAKER: No questions. Thank you.	
8	JUDGE BURTON: Well, thank you very	
9	much.	
10	MR. WHITE: Thank you, ma'am.	
11	JUDGE BURTON: Those are the two	
12	names that I have listed of individuals who've	
13	requested prior to the beginning of this session to	
14	testify. Are there any other individuals who would	
15	like to have some statements admitted on the record	
16	for the Commission's review?	
17	Seeing no hands, we'll go ahead and	
18	conclude today's hearing. I want to thank you all	
19	for appearing here tonight, and I hope you have a	
20	very pleasant evening. We're off the record.	
21	(WHEREUPON, the public hearing	
22	concluded at 7:22 p.m.)
