- 1. On October 8, 2002, the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") issued its *Report and Order* in the above-captioned case. Respondents seek rehearing of the Commission's *Report and Order* because it is unlawful, unjust and unreasonable on the following grounds:
- 2. The Commission's *Report and Order* is unlawful in that it fails to make adequate findings of facts and conclusions of law.
- 3. The *Report and Order* is further unlawful, unjust and unreasonable in that it is not based upon sufficient competent and substantial evidence.
- 4. The *Report and Order* of the Commission constitutes an abuse of discretion because it is in large part based upon hearsay evidence that Respondents timely objected to its admission.

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- 5. The Commission's *Report and Order* is not supported by the weight of the only competent and substantial evidence. To the extent there were deficiencies in the quality of service provided by the Company, they were directly related to the Commission's ongoing failure to allow Respondents to earn adequate revenues to operate the Company.
- 6. The Commission's *Report and Order* is unlawful insofar as it purports to assert jurisdiction over Gary L. Smith.

WHEREFORE, for all of the foregoing reasons Respondents request that the Commission rehear, reconsider and modify its *Report and Order* in a manner consistent with this Motion.
