- 3 p.m.)
- 4 JUDGE STEARLEY: Good evening. This
- 5 evening is Thursday, April 16th, 2009. The
- 6 Missouri Public Service Commission has set this
- 7 time for a local public hearing in case number WR-
- 8 2009-0098, in which Raytown Water Company seeks to
- 9 implement a general rate increase for its water
- 10 service in Missouri.
- 11 My name is Harold Stearley and I'm the
- 12 Regulatory Law Judge that will preside over
- 13 tonight's hearing. With me this evening is
- 14 Chairman Clayton.
- This is an official hearing of the
- 16 Missouri Public Service Commission and the
- 17 statements and testimony of the witnesses will be
- 18 recorded by a court reporter and must be given
- 19 under oath. All of the Commissioners, even if
- 20 they're not present tonight, will be reviewing your
- 21 remarks and your testimony will be part of the
- 22 official record in this case.
- I have been presented with a witness
- 24 list, and I will be calling the names of the people
- 25 who have signed up on our list, and I will ask you

- 1 to come forward to the podium. I will have you
- 2 state and spell your name for our court reporter so
- 3 it can be recorded correctly, and then I may ask
- 4 you a couple of preliminary statements, and you may
- 5 give your testimony. After that, the attorneys
- 6 that are here representing parties tonight may have
- 7 some questions for you, and the Chairman may have
- 8 some questions for you or I might, as well, so
- 9 please remain at the podium until all our questions
- 10 have been asked.
- Does anyone have any questions about
- 12 the procedure we're going to follow tonight?
- 13 Seeing none, we will begin with the entry of
- 14 appearance by counsel for the parties, starting
- 15 with the Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- 16 Commission.
- 17 MR. DEARMONT: My name is Eric Dearmont,
- 18 on behalf of Staff, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City,
- 19 Missouri 65102.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr.
- 21 Dearmont. Office of the Public Counsel?
- MR. POSTON: Thank you. Marc Poston,
- 23 appearing for the Office of Public Counsel, P.O.
- 24 Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Poston.

- 1 Is there counsel present for Raytown Water Company?
- 2 MR. CLEVENGER: No. Neal Clevenger,
- 3 General Manager of Raytown Water Company, 9820 East
- 4 63rd.
- 5 JUDGE STEARLEY: Alright. Are you an
- 6 attorney, Mr. Clevenger?
- 7 MR. CLEVENGER: No. I'm just
- JUDGE STEARLEY: That's alright. I'm
- 9 glad to see the company's represented, but I wanted
- 10 to be sure, we were needing entries from attorneys.
- MR. CLEVENGER: No attorney is present.
- 12 JUDGE STEARLEY: Alright, thank you very
- 13 much. Chairman Clayton, would you like to make any
- 14 opening remarks?
- 15 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Let's hear it from
- 16 the witness.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Alright, very well. I
- 18 have a witness list with one name, thus far, a Mr.
- 19 Roy Escue. Did I pronounce that correctly?
- 20 MR. ESCUE: It's Ray, sir.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Ray, I'm sorry.
- MR. ESCUE: Yes, sir.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: And if you will please
- 24 come forward and spell your name for our court
- 25 reporter?

- 1 MR. ESCUE: R-A-Y-M-O-N-D, E-S-C-U-E.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: And Mr. Escue, are you
- 3 a customer of Raytown Water Company?
- 4 MR. ESCUE: Yes, sir.
- 5 JUDGE STEARLEY: Alright. You may
- 6 proceed with your comments. Hold on one moment. I
- 7 do need to swear you in.
- 8 MR. ESCUE: Yes, sir.
- 9 RAYMOND ESCUE, being sworn-in by Judge
- 10 Stearley, testified as follows,
- JUDGE STEARLEY: You may proceed.
- 12 MR. ESCUE: About my comments, first
- off, I should say that I've been a customer from
- 14 since October of 99. I've had nothing but good
- 15 service with Raytown Water Company, people are
- 16 friendly and I usually don't have any problems and
- 17 when I pay my bill, I don't have any problems.
- 18 They take good care of me.
- 19 However, my one question is, or
- 20 comment, is that at this time, since you've decided
- 21 to raise taxes in Raytown, KCP&L is raising taxes,
- 22 the economy is hurting, and would this be better
- 23 off set aside for another year or two until we see
- 24 how the economy is going? I know that they have
- 25 things that they want to do, but at the same time,

- 1 the people of Raytown and actually the people in
- 2 America are hurting too. That's probably it.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Alright, then. Well,
- 4 we appreciate your comments. Let me ask of
- 5 counsel, Mr. Dearmont, have any questions?
- 6 MR. DEARMONT: No.
- 7 JUDGE STEARLEY: Is there anyone around
- 8 here? If you want to go right now, you, by all
- 9 means
- 10 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Mind if I ask some
- 11 questions, Judge?
- 12 JUDGE STEARLEY: Please go right ahead.
- 13 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Mr. Escue, thank you
- 14 very much for coming out tonight. You made some
- 15 comments starting off and I'd like you to elaborate
- 16 just a little bit on them. When you said the
- 17 service was good, do you mean that the water
- 18 pressure is good, taste is good, smells good, all
- 19 of that?
- 20 MR. ESCUE: I have no problems with
- 21 that, sir.
- 22 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: And you said the
- 23 people are friendly. Do you deal with the folks at
- 24 Raytown Water very often?
- 25 MR. ESCUE: Whenever I used to I pay

1 online right now, but when I used to go into the

- 2 office and pay my bill, the people were very
- 3 friendly, very nice to work with. I had no
- 4 problems.
- 5 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Have you ever had any
- 6 problems that they've had to fix for you?
- 7 MR. ESCUE: No, sir.
- 8 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: No, alright. How
- 9 about billing issues? Do the bills come in timely
- 10 or you've got plenty of time?
- 11 MR. ESCUE: Yes.
- 12 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: And no errors on
- 13 them?
- MR. ESCUE: No, sir.
- 15 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: I can't say I've ever
- 16 had such positive testimony ever on service from a
- 17 utility before. It's crazy to hear.
- MR. ESCUE: It's a no-brainer, I mean.
- 19 They just send you the bill, pay the bill.
- 20 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: I don't think I have
- 21 any other questions. I appreciate you coming out
- 22 tonight.
- MR. ESCUE: Yes, sir.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Mr. Dearmont, any
- 25 follow up?

- 18 I'm not sure I don't know the company officials
- 19 from just regular customers of Raytown Water, but
- 20 I do want to thank the Staff of the Company coming
- 21 out tonight, making time. I think these local
- 22 public hearings are very important.
- 23 Raytown Water, I think, is our second
- 24 largest water company in the State, and that this
- 25 case is following through with, I don't know, it's
