ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

Effective Date: September 4, 2009

On June 5,¹ GB & Associates, L.L.C., (“GB”) filed a formal complaint pursuant to Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.070 against Kansas City Power and Light Company (“KCPL”). On June 8, the Commission issued a notice of deficiency for GB’s failure to have appropriate legal representation. As of today’s date, 90 days has elapsed from the day GB filed its complaint, and GB has taken no action to correct the deficiency or any other action to further prosecute its complaint.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(2) provides that: “Cases may be dismissed for lack of prosecution if no action has occurred in the case for ninety (90) days and no party has filed a pleading requesting a continuance beyond that time.” GB will be directed to show cause why its complaint should not be dismissed.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. No later than September 14, 2009, GB & Associates, L.L.C. shall show cause why the Commission should not dismiss its complaint.
2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
