## **NOTICE CLOSING CASE**

Issue Date: May 31, 2006

In 2004, the Missouri Public Service Commission granted KLM Telephone Company a two-year suspension of the Federal Communications Commission's local number portability rules for wireline-to-wireless LNP. Although this case was closed, KLM filed on May 16, 2006, a status report informing the Commission that the FCC's intermodal LNP rules were stayed, reversed, and remanded to the FCC by the U.S. District Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit for companies such as KLM. KLM's filing reopened the case. KLM stated that it will file another status report as the matter develops.

Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.80(15) requires that responsive pleadings be filed within ten days. No party has filed a response to KLM's status report. Although KLM may file a second status report, the Commission will not hold this matter open pending such report. The Commission will therefore close this case.
