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- 3 IDENTIFICATION BY THE REPORTER.)
- 4 JUDGE DIPPELL: This is Case No.
- 5 EO-2000-630, in the Matter of the Joint Application
- of Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE and Lewis
- 7 County Rural Electric Cooperative for Approval of a
- 8 Written Territorial Agreement Designating the
- 9 Boundaries of Each Electric Service Supplier Within
- 10 Portions of Lewis, Clark, Shelby, Knox, Adair,
- 11 Schuyler, Scotland and Marion Counties in
- 12 Missouri.
- 13 My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm the
- 14 Regulatory Law Judge. And at this time I would
- 15 like to take oral entries of appearance beginning
- 16 with AmerenUE.
- MR. BOBNAR: Thank you, your Honor.
- 18 William B. Bobnar, with Ameren Services Company,
- 19 appearing on behalf of Union Electric Company which
- is doing business as AmerenUE.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Lewis County?
- MR. SCOTT: Thank you, your Honor. Victor
- 23 Scott, with the law firm Andereck, Evans, Milne,
- 24 Peace and Johnson, representing Lewis County
- 25 Electric Cooperative.

- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Staff?
- 2 MR. FREY: Thank you, your Honor. Dennis
- 3 L. Frey, representing the Staff of the Missouri
- 4 Public Service Commission.
- 5 JUDGE DIPPELL: And Office of the Public
- 6 Counsel?
- 7 MS. COOK: Thank you, your Honor. Shannon
- 8 Cook, on behalf of the Office of the Public Counsel
- 9 and the Public.
- 10 JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. Then we'll
- 11 basically proceed with opening statements, and then
- 12 I'll let you bring up any witnesses you may have
- 13 for questions.
- Can we begin with AmerenUE?
- MR. BOBNAR: Thank you, your Honor, and
- 16 may it please the Commission. My name is William
- 17 Bobnar. I am the attorney for Union Electric
- 18 Company in this case.
- Today we're here for the hearing in
- 20 Case No. EO-2000-630, which involves a Territorial
- 21 Agreement between AmerenUE and Lewis County
- 22 Electric Cooperative. AmerenUE's sole witness in
- 23 this case is Mr. Ronald Loesch, the district
- 24 manager who negotiated the Territorial Agreement on
- 25 AmerenUE's behalf.

- 1 First, a little background. The parties
- 2 entered into the Territorial Agreement on March 30,
- 3 2000. This Territorial Agreement designates
- 4 exclusive service areas for AmerenUE and Lewis
- 5 County Electric Cooperative in Lewis, Clark,
- 6 Shelby, Knox, Adair, Schuyler, Scotland and Marion
- 7 Counties in Missouri.
- 8 The exclusive service area of AmerenUE
- 9 includes all of Schuyler County. Both suppliers
- 10 have exclusive service areas in Lewis, Clark,
- 11 Shelby, Knox, Adair, Scotland and Marion Counties,
- 12 and these services areas are described by meets and
- bounds in Exhibit 2, the Territorial Agreement.
- 14 After the effective date of the agreement,
- 15 each party will have the exclusive right to furnish
- 16 electric service to all new structures located in
- 17 its exclusive service area.
- 18 Further, each party will have the right to
- 19 serve those existing structures, which is serving
- on the effective date of the agreement, wherever
- 21 those structures are located. The Territorial
- 22 Agreement does not require the exchange of any
- 23 customers or electric facilities.
- On April 7, 2000, AmerenUE and Lewis filed
- 25 the joint application coercing the Commission to

- 1 approve the Territorial Agreement. This joint
- 2 application was properly noticed and no party
- 3 intervened in this case. After the date of
- 4 intervention had passed AmerenUE, Lewis County and
- 5 the Staff of the Commission and the Office of the
- 6 Public Counsel entered into a Stipulation and
- 7 Agreement, which among other things recommended
- 8 that the Commission approve this Territorial
- 9 Agreement.
- 10 Today Mr. Loesch will enter that
- 11 stipulation into the record. Mr. Loesch will also
- 12 testify why the Territorial Agreement is in the
- 13 public interest. The agreement will halt a
- duplication of facilities now existing between
- AmerenUE and Lewis, and the waste of both
- 16 companies' resources associated with the
- 17 duplication. The elimination of duplication will
- 18 lessen any perceived negative impact of electric
- 19 distribution facilities on the aesthetics and the
- safety of the communities when in the area covered
- 21 by the Territorial Agreement.
- 22 With the end of destructive competition,
- 23 each electric supplier will be able to focus its
- 24 efforts more efficiently on utilizing its resources
- 25 in the area to better service customers. The

- 1 Territorial Agreement also promotes orderly
- 2 development. AmerenUE's system planning ability
- 3 will be improved, and these factors in turn will
- 4 reduce overall system costs.
- 5 Since the resulting service territories
- 6 will also be exclusive relative to the parties,
- 7 customer confusion over who is their electric
- 8 supplier will be eliminated, and the public will
- 9 have certainty on who to call for service in any
- 10 given area.
- 11 Finally, the agreement will minimize the
- 12 disputes between AmerenUE and Lewis County Electric
- 13 Cooperative, which will in turn allow AmerenUE and
- 14 Lewis to work together to improve their communities
- 15 without worrying about the legal boundaries of
- 16 their service area. Thank you, your Honor.
- 17 JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you.
- 18 Lewis County, did you have an opening
- 19 statement?
- MR. SCOTT: Very brief, your Honor.
- 21 Again, good morning and good morning
- 22 Commissioners. My name is Victor Scott. I
- 23 represent Lewis County Electric Cooperative. In
- 24 brevity, Lewis County supports the opening
- 25 statement of AmerenUE, and would only add that

- 1 Lewis County's only witness will be Mitch Keel, the
- 2 manager of Lewis County who also is very familiar
- 3 with the agreement and negotiated on behalf of
- 4 Lewis County. We will make Mr. Keel available to
- 5 the Commissioners for any questions that they may
- 6 have.
- 7 JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you.
- 8 Staff?
- 9 MR. FREY: No statement, your Honor.
- 10 Thank you.
- 11 JUDGE DIPPELL: Office of the Public
- 12 Counsel?
- MS. COOK: Thank you, your Honor. Public
- 14 Counsel agrees that this stipulation is in the
- 15 interest -- is not detrimental to the public
- interest, particularly in light of the fact that no
- 17 customers are being transferred. And would just
- 18 add that we will be sponsoring no witnesses today.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you.
- 20 And did Staff have a witness it wanted to
- 21 present to the hearing?
- MR. FREY: Yes, your Honor.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. Then we can proceed
- 24 with calling the first witness. UE?
- MR. BOBNAR: Thank you, your Honor. I

- 1 call Ronald Loesch.
- 2 (WITNESS SWORN.)
- JUDGE DIPPELL: You may proceed,
- 4 Mr. Bobnar.
- 5 MR. BOBNAR: Thank you, again, your
- 6 Honor.
- 7 RONALD LOESCH, being first duly sworn, testified as
- 8 follows:
- 9 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BOBNAR:
- 10 Q. Please state your name and business
- 11 address for the record.
- 12 A. My name is Ronald W. Loesch, P.O. Box 38,
- 13 Mexico, Missouri 65265.
- 14 Q. By whom are you employed?
- A. AmerenUE.
- 16 Q. And what is your position at AmerenUE?
- 17 A. I am UE's district manager for the Little
- 18 Dixie and Green Hills districts.
- 19 Q. Are you familiar with the subject matter
- 20 of the joint application of AmerenUE and Lewis
- 21 County Electric Cooperative in this case?
- 22 A. Yes, I am.
- 23 Q. And what was your involvement in the
- 24 Territorial Agreement?
- 25 A. I negotiated the Territorial Agreement.

- 1 Q. Mr. Loesch, I'm going to hand you a
- 2 document which has been marked as Exhibit 1. Can
- 3 you please identify that document for the record?
- 4 A. Yes. This is the Territorial Agreement
- 5 between Union Electric Company doing business as
- 6 AmerenUE and Lewis County Rural Electric
- 7 Cooperative.
- 8 Q. Thank you, Mr. Loesch.
- 9 Why is this Territorial Agreement in the
- 10 public interest?
- 11 A. This is in the public interest because it
- 12 will eliminate duplication of facilities. The way
- 13 things are today without this Territorial
- 14 Agreement, you could have both utilities building
- down one side or the other side of the highway, and
- 16 each utility will be just serving half of the
- 17 customers that they potentially could serve. So
- 18 therefore, you have the duplication.
- 19 Second that comes with that is, the
- 20 reduction of O and M cost. Third, the safety of
- 21 public utility workers and the public. By not
- 22 having these duplicate facilities, there's less
- 23 chance of people getting into the power lines.
- 24 Third (sic), I think that is probably one
- of the reasons why the legislature passed the law

- 1 allowing for these territorial agreements was to
- 2 eliminate disputes between the utilities and
- 3 serving customers. Many times these disputes get
- 4 pretty heated and end up -- at least in the past,
- 5 they've ended up at the state legislature and state
- 6 officials being involved in them, so that should
- 7 eliminate those situations as well.
- 8 And I think finally, is the elimination of
- 9 customer confusion as to who is their supplier. I
- 10 can give you several examples. I will just name
- one at this point in time, but I think all of you
- 12 probably in this room know where Kingdom City is.
- 13 And one of the truck stops there was recently
- 14 without power. And it's, like, twelve o'clock at
- 15 midnight, and they call, and they don't know which
- supplier to call, so they call both suppliers for
- 17 the area. And you have two trucks arriving at
- 18 12:30. Obviously, one is a supplier and one isn't,
- 19 so that really eliminates that type of confusion as
- 20 to who serves the utility service.
- 21 Q. Thank you, Mr. Loesch. I have one more
- 22 question. I'm going to hand you another document
- that's been marked as Exhibit No. 2. Could you
- 24 please identify that for the record?
- 25 A. Yes. This is the Stipulation and

- 1 Agreement in this case that we're here for today.
- 2 Q. Thank you. I just want to make sure again
- 3 this is a Territorial Agreement that sets forth
- 4 exclusive service territories and does not require
- 5 the exchange of customers and facilities?
- 6 A. That is correct.
- 7 MR. BOBNAR: Your Honor, that's the last
- 8 of my questions. I tender -- first of all, I move
- 9 that Exhibits 1 and 2 be admitted into evidence,
- 10 and I offer Mr. Loesch for cross-examination.
- 11 JUDGE DIPPELL: All right. Would there be
- 12 any objection to Exhibit No. 1 coming into the
- 13 record?
- 14 (No response.)
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Then I'll receive it into
- 16 the record.
- 17 (EXHIBIT NO. 1 WAS RECEIVED INTO EVIDENCE
- 18 AND MADE A PART OF THE RECORD.)
- 19 JUDGE DIPPELL: Would there be any
- 20 objection to Exhibit No. 2 coming into the record?
- 21 (No response.)
- JUDGE DIPPELL: I'll also admit Exhibit
- No. 2 into the record.
- 24 (EXHIBIT NO. 2 WAS RECEIVED INTO EVIDENCE
- 25 AND MADE A PART OF THE RECORD.)

- 1 JUDGE DIPPELL: Is there any
- 2 cross-examination by Lewis County?
- 3 MR. SCOTT: None, your Honor.
- 4 JUDGE DIPPELL: Staff?
- 5 MR. FREY: No. Thank you, your Honor.
- 6 JUDGE DIPPELL: Office of the Public
- 7 Counsel?
- 8 MS. COOK: No questions. Thank you.
- 9 JUDGE DIPPELL: I don't have any questions
- 10 for you either, Mr. Loesch. You may step down.
- 11 Thank you.
- 12 (WITNESS EXCUSED.)
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Are there any further
- 14 witnesses from Ameren?
- MR. BOBNAR: No, your Honor.
- 16 JUDGE DIPPELL: And would Lewis County
- 17 like to call its first witness?
- MR. SCOTT: Please, your Honor. We call
- 19 Mitch Keel.
- 20 (WITNESS SWORN.)
- JUDGE DIPPELL: You may proceed,
- 22 Mr. Scott.
- MR. SCOTT: Thank you, your Honor.
- 24 MITCH KEEL, being first duly sworn, testified as
- 25 follows:

- 1 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. SCOTT:
- 2 Q. Would you please state your full name and
- 3 business address for the record?
- 4 A. Mitchell Keel, manager of Lewis County
- 5 Electric Cooperative, P.O. Box 68, Lewistown,
- 6 Missouri 63452.
- 7 Q. And you're employed by Lewis County
- 8 Electric Cooperative?
- 9 A. Yes, I am.
- 10 Q. What kind of organization is that?
- 11 A. Cooperative under state law.
- 12 Q. And what was your role in negotiating the
- 13 Territorial Agreement with AmerenUE?
- 14 A. Very involved in the negotiations.
- Q. Are you familiar with the Territorial
- 16 Agreement itself?
- 17 A. Yes, I am.
- 18 Q. And I'll hand you what's been marked as
- 19 Exhibit 1, and is that the Territorial Agreement
- that you negotiated?
- 21 A. Yes, it is.
- 22 Q. And do you support the terms and
- 23 conditions in that agreement?
- 24 A. Yes, I do.
- 25 Q. And did your board of directors pass a

- 1 board resolution authorizing the entrance of that
- into that agreement with AmerenUE?
- 3 A. Yes, they did.
- Q. You heard Mr. Loesch's testimony earlier
- 5 this morning, do you have anything to add to his
- 6 testimony with regards to whether or not this
- 7 agreement is in the public interest?
- 8 A. I think he did an excellent job of laying
- 9 out the parameters that we negotiated this
- 10 agreement under. I have nothing else to add.
- 11 Q. And are you familiar and do you understand
- 12 that this agreement does not affect or bind any
- other electric suppliers that are not a party to
- 14 this agreement?
- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. And at this time I'll hand you what's been
- marked as Exhibit No. 2, and ask you if you
- 18 recognize that document?
- 19 A. Yes, I do.
- 20 Q. And you support and understand that
- 21 stipulation?
- 22 A. Yes, I do.
- Q. And at this time are you asking the
- 24 Commission to approve the Territorial Agreement as
- 25 presented?

- 1 A. Yes.
- 2 MR. SCOTT: I have no further questions,
- 3 your Honor.
- 4 JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you.
- 5 Is there any cross-examination for
- 6 Mr. Keel from Staff?
- 7 MR. FREY: No. Thank you, your Honor.
- 8 JUDGE DIPPELL: Office of the Public
- 9 Counsel?
- MS. COOK: Nothing.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: AmerenUE?
- MR. BOBNAR: No. Thank you.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: You may be excused,
- 14 Mr. Keel.
- 15 (WITNESS EXCUSED.)
- 16 JUDGE DIPPELL: Unfortunately, I did
- 17 excuse Mr. Loesch, and I did have one question for
- 18 him.
- 19 And, sir, I'll just briefly recall you to
- 20 the stand, but you may stay where you are if you
- 21 would like. I just have one question.
- 22 RONALD LOESCH, being first duly sworn, testified as
- 23 follows:
- 24 QUESTIONS BY JUDGE DIPPELL:
- Q. You referred to O and M costs, and I was

- 1 just going to have you clarify what O and M costs
- 2 were.
- 3 A. They are operation and maintenance costs.
- 4 Q. Thank you, sir.
- 5 JUDGE DIPPELL: Did Staff want to call its
- 6 next witness?
- 7 MR. FREY: Yes, your Honor. Staff calls
- 8 James L. Ketter.
- 9 (WITNESS SWORN.)
- 10 JUDGE DIPPELL: You may proceed, Mr. Frey.
- MR. FREY: Thank you, your Honor.
- 12 JAMES L. KETTER, being first duly sworn, testified
- 13 as follows:
- 14 DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. FREY:
- 15 Q. Sir, will you please state your name for
- 16 the record, please?
- 17 A. James L. Ketter.
- 18 Q. And, Mr. Ketter, by whom are you employed
- 19 and in what capacity?
- 20 A. I'm employed by the Missouri Public
- 21 Service Commission as an engineer in the
- 22 engineering department for the Staff.
- 23 Q. And were you involved in the investigation
- 24 and evaluation of the subject Territorial Agreement
- 25 in this case?

- 1 A. Yes.
- 2 Q. Do you have before you a copy of the
- 3 unanimous Stipulation and Agreement filed in this
- 4 case, which has been marked for purposes of
- 5 identification as Exhibit 2?
- 6 A. Yes, I do.
- 7 Q. And are you familiar with that document,
- 8 sir?
- 9 A. Yes, I am.
- 10 Q. Based upon your investigation and
- 11 evaluation, do you support that Stipulation and
- 12 Agreement?
- 13 A. Yes, I do.
- MR. FREY: Thank you, Mr. Ketter.
- 15 With that, your Honor, I would tender the
- 16 witness for cross-examination.
- 17 JUDGE DIPPELL: Is there any
- 18 cross-examination of Mr. Ketter from AmerenUE?
- MR. BOBNAR: No. Thank you, your Honor.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Lewis County?
- MR. SCOTT: None, your Honor.
- 22 JUDGE DIPPELL: Office of the Public
- 23 Counsel?
- MS. COOK: No. Thank you, your Honor.
- 25 QUESTIONS BY JUDGE DIPPELL:

- 1 Q. I just have one question, Mr. Ketter, just
- 2 to make certain that this got into the record, and
- 3 that is in your opinion, does both AmerenUE and
- 4 Lewis County have adequate facilities to make
- 5 available adequate power supplies, service and
- 6 maintenance to their customers?
- 7 A. Yes. The Territorial Agreement was
- 8 geographically couched so that they have adequate
- 9 facilities in the areas where they will have the
- 10 exclusive territory to add new customers.
- 11 Q. And are you familiar with the list of
- 12 tariffs that were filed?
- 13 A. Yes, I am.
- Q. And this is sort of a procedural matter,
- 15 but is it Staff's recommendation that those tariffs
- 16 be approved as filed or that new additional tariffs
- 17 need to be filed in this case before they are
- 18 approved?
- 19 A. I anticipated that the Commission would
- 20 order Ameren to file tariffs in compliance with any
- 21 order.
- 22 Q. In compliance with the items that were set
- out in Staff's suggestions that had been changed?
- A. Yes. There were a few clerical
- 25 Administrative kinds of errors in the illustrative

- 1 tariffs that were filed, and we outlined those in
- 2 the stipulation.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you.
- 4 Were there any additional
- 5 cross-examination questions or redirect questions
- 6 based on my questions?
- 7 MR. FREY: No, your Honor. Thank you.
- 8 JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you. You may be
- 9 excused, Mr. Ketter.
- 10 (WITNESS EXCUSED.)
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Are there any other
- 12 witnesses from Staff?
- MR. FREY: No. Thank you, your Honor.
- 14 JUDGE DIPPELL: Does Office of the Public
- 15 Counsel wish to offer a witness?
- MS. COOK: No, your Honor.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Would any of the parties
- 18 like to make remarks?
- MR. BOBNAR: No, your Honor.
- MR. FREY: No. Thank you, your Honor.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Seeing none, then we were
- going to have closing statements in lieu of
- 23 briefs. Briefs will not be necessary in this
- 24 case. And, therefore, I will conclude this
- 25 hearing. Thank you-all for your participation.

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
