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1 PROCEEDINGS
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- 2 JUDGE DIPPELL: This is Case No.
- 3 TT-2008-0085 in the matter of Level 3 Communications,
- 4 L.L.C.'s tariff filing to introduce new access
- 5 services.
- 6 My name is Nancy Dippell, I'm the Regulatory Law
- 7 Judge assigned to this case, and we have come here
- 8 today for a pre-hearing conference. And I'm going to
- 9 begin by asking for entries of appearance, beginning
- 10 with Staff.
- 11 MR. HAAS: Good morning, William K. Haas
- 12 appearing on behalf of the Staff of the Commission.
- 13 My address is Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City,
- 14 Missouri 65102.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Ms. Young?
- MS. YOUNG: Thank you. Appearing on behalf
- of Level 3 Communications, L.L.C., I'm Mary Ann Young
- 18 with the law firm of William D. Steinmeier, P.C., Post
- 19 Office Box 104595, Jefferson City, Missouri.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Mr. Strumberger?
- MR. STRUMBERGER: Good morning, my name is
- 22 Gregg Strumberger with Level 3 Communications. My
- 23 address is 1025 Eldorado Boulevard in Broomfield,
- 24 Colorado 80021.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Mr. Bub?

- 1 MR. BUB: Good morning, Your Honor, thank
- 2 you. This is Leo Bub with AT&T Companies,
- 3 specifically listed in our application to intervene in
- 4 this proceeding. Our address is One AT&T Center, St.
- 5 Louis, Missouri 63101.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Mr. Strumberger, I
- 7 can't recall if you submitted an entry of appearance
- 8 before in this case. Are you a Missouri attorney or
- 9 just licensed in Colorado?
- 10 MR. STRUMBERGER: Actually, Massachusetts
- 11 and District of Columbia. But I will just be
- 12 listening in today and let Ms. Young handle the
- 13 hearing.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: I'd be happy to admit you,
- 15 but there is a hundred dollar Supreme Court fee if you
- 16 make an official entry. So, we'll leave it in Ms.
- 17 Young's hands.
- 18 So, I got all excited when Mr. Dority's client
- 19 withdrew its objection --
- 20 MR. DORITY: That was not my client.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: It was Embarg, I'm sorry.
- 22 Mr. Dority is present in the room, and I was thinking
- 23 it was him.
- 24 Well, I got excited when Embarq withdrew. I
- 25 thought you all were working this all out amongst

1 yourselves, but it appears that AT&T still has some

- 2 issues.
- 3 Mr. Bub, nothing's changed with that since your
- 4 last filing, has it?
- 5 MR. BUB: Your Honor, it is correct that
- 6 there are issues between the companies. But I will
- 7 tell you that there are discussions under way on a
- 8 multi-state level to attempt to resolve, or at the
- 9 very least narrow, the issues. I don't think that has
- 10 been reflected in the proceedings, or any pleadings,
- 11 but those discussions are going on.
- 12 It's my understanding that a resolution has not
- 13 been reached at this point though. Mr. Strumberger is
- 14 probably a little closer to that than I am.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Ms. Young, you had some
- 16 procedural issues?
- MS. YOUNG: Yes. If I may, Judge.
- 18 Level 3 really does feel confident that we will be
- 19 able to resolve the questions and issues raised by the
- 20 Staff in our discussions and AT&T in the reply to
- 21 Level 3 that they filed on October 11th.
- However, because it is an issue being dealt with
- 23 on several jurisdictions, and because there were lots
- 24 of questions raised in the AT&T pleading, we would
- 25 like at this time to request some additional time

- 1 beyond the ten days to respond to that in the hopes
- 2 that that will move things forward and help explain to
- 3 AT&T the limited impact we think it will have on their
- 4 services if this tariff takes affect.
- 5 So, if we could, we'd like to have until
- 6 October 26th to respond to the AT&T pleading. And
- 7 that pushes us -- we understand -- right up against
- 8 the suspension date, which is currently October 27th.
- 9 And so we also understand there would need to be
- 10 an additional suspension. We would request that it be
- 11 only as minimal of a time as possible, probably
- 12 30 days would be adequate, we think, to try to get
- 13 some additional discussions taken care of and
- 14 hopefully get things resolved or moved forward on an
- 15 expedited basis if we need to.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: So, let me make sure I've
- 17 got this straight. You would like until October 26th
- 18 to further respond to AT&T's questions, and then the
- 19 company would be fine with a further suspension of the
- 20 tariff for approximately 30 days maybe?
- MS. YOUNG: Yes, Judge, that's correct.
- 22 JUDGE DIPPELL: Would Staff have any
- 23 problems with that plan?
- MR. HAAS: No, we don't have a problem with
- 25 allowing the extra ten days.

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1 I would point out that Staff also has some
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- 2 additional questions in to Level 3. We haven't put
- 3 our questions in the form of a pleading, but we are
- 4 looking for some additional information also.
- 5 JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay.
- And Mr. Bub, would AT&T have any objections to
- 7 either of those requests?
- 8 MR. BUB: We don't object as long as the
- 9 suspension is continued. What dates specifically
- 10 would the suspension go until?
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Well, if it was another
- 12 30 days that would be until November 27th. I haven't
- 13 looked at a calendar to see how that falls.
- MR. BUB: We are okay with that proposal,
- 15 Your Honor, we have no objection.
- 16 JUDGE DIPPELL: That suspension -- even
- 17 though it's sort of voluntary -- I will go ahead and
- 18 have the Commission issue an order doing the
- 19 suspension themselves instead of trying to mix the
- 20 company suspending with the Commission suspending. I
- 21 think it keeps it a little cleaner in the system.
- MS. YOUNG: Sounds good.
- 23 And then, I guess the other thing -- typically, at
- 24 the end of the pre-hearing you want us to file a
- 25 procedural schedule if we don't get things resolved,

- 1 and I think, from Level 3's perspective, it might make
- 2 sense to give us more time than usual -- I don't know
- 3 how much time you have at the end of the week -- and I
- 4 think it would make sense to give the parties some
- 5 time after we file our response to file the procedural
- 6 schedule.
- 7 JUDGE DIPPELL: I agree with that. And I
- 8 think what we'll do is, if things don't get worked out
- 9 to all the parties' satisfaction, then we'll postpone
- 10 a procedural schedule of any kind until, say, ten days
- 11 after the 26th, and that should give you enough time
- 12 to know whether you are headed for a settlement,
- 13 perhaps, and ask to be excused from doing that again.
- 14 All right, are there any other procedural matters
- or any other things that I need to be aware of?
- I don't see anything here. Okay, I think that's
- 17 all I have then. I'll let you all discuss further if
- 18 you need to.
- 19 This port, I believe, is open for an hour, so just
- 20 until eleven. If you need more time than that, you
- 21 can make a conference call on this phone to two
- 22 different people if you need to do that.
- MS. YOUNG: Thank you.
- MR. HAAS: Thank you.
- MR. BUB: Thank you.
