As County Executive of Jackson County, Missouri, I enthusiastically support the petition for authority from the Missouri Public Service Commission to extend the geographical boundaries of Trigen-Kansas City's service territory to permit delivery of Trigen district steam service to Truman Medical Center ("Truman") and environs.

As have many institutions that rely on public support to provide vital services, Truman has been adversely affected by the high cost and volatility of energy supply in recent years. This effect has resulted in the possibility of higher costs to Kansas City and Jackson County taxpayers. Also, saving Truman significant dollars can only serve to enhance the delivery of adequate care to those who depend upon Truman, including the County's needlest citizens. Further, the highest standard of reliability of energy supply is no less a concern for a major medical facility such as Truman.

The managers of the Truman Medical Center have determined that Trigen steam supply can significantly reduce Truman's energy cost, freeing up much-needed funds and resources for the hospital's primary mission of providing quality care. The availability of Trigen district steam will also provide an independent, redundant supply of steam for critical heating and process uses, greatly enhancing reliability of supply. This too is a prerequisite to Truman's ability to deliver a high standard of patient care.

I urge the Commission to make every effort to speed the consideration of Trigen's application to a positive conclusion. The Commission is of course aware that the addition of a significant customer to Trigen's system can only benefit those existing utility customers that the Commission serves. This additional revenue stream and resulting contribution to Trigen's fixed cost recovery will better the lot of Trigen's overall customer base. These customers include numerous City, County, State and Federal buildings.

Ultimately, speedy approval greatly benefits the citizens of Jackson County. In addition to the above, there are economic development advantages to be realized by enhanced customer energy choice. It is up to the Commission to see to it that realization of these advantages is not unduly delayed.
