- JUDGE DIPPELL: This is Case No. ER-2002-424,
- 4 In the Matter of the Empire District Electric Company
- 5 of Joplin, Missouri, for Authority to File Tariffs
- 6 Increasing Rates for Electric Service to Customers in
- 7 the Missouri Service Area of the Company.
- 8 My name is Nancy Dippell, and I'm the
- 9 Regulatory Law Judge assigned to this case.
- 10 I'm gonna begin -- the attorneys are making
- 11 written entries of appearance, but I'm gonna go ahead
- 12 and ask you to make oral entries.
- 13 If you don't want to repeat your address and
- 14 so forth, that's fine, but I would appreciate knowing
- 15 who you're gonna represent here today.
- 16 Let's start with the Staff.
- MR. FREY: Thank you, Your Honor.
- 18 Representing the Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- 19 Commission, Eric Anderson, Bruce Bates, Robert Franson,
- 20 Keith Krueger, David Meyer, Nathan Williams, Dennis
- 21 Frey, Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri
- 22 65101.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And just to clarify that,
- 24 Mr. Frey, you're the only one that's shown -- oh, no,
- 25 Mr. Bates is here.

- 1 MR. CONRAD: Players to be named later.
- 2 JUDGE DIPPELL: The only -- only other Staff
- 3 attorney that's actually in the room right now -- well,
- 4 Mr. Anderson just walked in, too, so maybe I just
- 5 shouldn't even worry about it then.
- 6 All right, then, for Empire?
- 7 MR. SWEARENGEN: Yes. James C. Swearengen,
- 8 Gary Duffy and Dean Cooper, appearing on behalf of the
- 9 Empire District Electric Company.
- 10 Thank you.
- 11 JUDGE DIPPELL: And for the Office of Public
- 12 Counsel?
- 13 MR. COFFMAN: John B. Coffman, appearing alone
- 14 I believe, on behalf of the Office of the Public
- 15 Counsel.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And for Praxair?
- 17 MR. CONRAD: For Praxair, Your Honor, please
- 18 let the record show the appearance of Stuart W. Conrad
- 19 and possibly Jeremiah D. Finnegan later on in the
- 20 proceeding.
- 21 And we've -- or I have provided the reporter
- 22 with the name and address and all that stuff.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you.
- 24 All right. Then everything seems to be moving
- 25 along in this case. We've had lots of testimony filed.

- 1 And we still have a pending motion to
- 2 consolidate, but we're expecting that to go away if the
- 3 Commission accepts the stipulation and agreement in the
- 4 other case.
- 5 There -- are there any other pending motions
- 6 that I've overlooked?
- 7 MR. SWEARENGEN: I'm not aware of any.
- 8 MR. FREY: I don't think so.
- 9 JUDGE DIPPELL: My major question today is:
- 10 Is this going to take two weeks of hearings?
- 11 (No response.)
- 12 JUDGE DIPPELL: That's what we have it
- 13 scheduled for. We have it scheduled for beginning
- 14 October 28th going possibly through November 8th.
- 15 And you-all have brought lots of people today,
- 16 so it looks like you guys are ready to talk about
- 17 settling some of these issues and so forth.
- 18 Is there hope on that front or --
- 19 MR. SWEARENGEN: I think we'll have a better
- 20 handle later in the week as to where we are, and then
- 21 we can let you know if we think two weeks to try the
- 22 case would be necessary.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay. The reason I am
- 24 concerned is because I have a conflict on the second
- 25 week. So if this remains scheduled for two weeks, then

- 1 this case may actually be reassigned to another judge.
- 2 So I just wanted to warn you of that.
- 3 Mr. Conrad?
- 4 MR. CONRAD: Are -- are -- would you like us
- 5 to help you out or --
- 6 JUDGE DIPPELL: Well, no. No. I -- I would
- 7 prefer to remain the judge on the case. But if it
- 8 remains scheduled for two weeks, I wanted to give you
- 9 that advanced -- advanced warning.
- 10 MR. COFFMAN: Is the conflict for the entire
- 11 week?
- 12 JUDGE DIPPELL: Yes.
- 13 MR. COFFMAN: All right.
- 14 JUDGE DIPPELL: Because I would like to be
- 15 away from the office that week. And Judge Ruth has
- 16 eagerly agreed that since she handled Empire's last
- 17 rate case that she would stand in for me in that event.
- 18 But -- and since there hasn't been major
- 19 substantive issues going along in the -- in these early
- 20 parts of the -- the case, there won't be any problem
- 21 with someone else taking over before the hearing.
- 22 So is there any -- any other issues that
- 23 you-all have or questions, procedures?
- 24 (No response.)
- 25 JUDGE DIPPELL: All right. Then I will leave
