INTERVENOR'S REQUEST FOR COPY OF ASSET TRANSFER AGREEMENT AND OTHER RELATED DATA PERTAINING TO THAT AGREEMENT BETWEEN BIG ISLAND WATER & SEWER COMPANY, INC., BIG ISLAND HOMEOWNERS WATER AND SEWER ASSOCIATION, INC., AND FOLSOM RIDGE, L.L.C.

COMES NOW, Ben F. Weir, homeowner and weekend resident, 2162 Big Island Drive, Roach, MO 65787, and intervenor in the above named case and submits the following to the Commission:

- On June 16, 2006, the Big Island Water & Sewer Company, Inc. (hereinafter "Applicant") filed an application with the Missouri Public Service Commission for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity.
- 2. "Applicant" is a private investor owned commercial corporation and has been recently organized to acquire the necessary regulatory approvals to offer and provide water and sewer service to members of the public residing on and near to Big Island. According to the application, those residents currently receive service from Big Island Homeowners Water and Sewer Association, Inc., (the "Association"), an unregulated homeowner's association. It was originally organized as the Big Island Homeowners Association (the "BIHOA"). As stated in the Application, the systems are presently owned by Folsom Ridge, L.L.C. ("Folsom Ridge") a Colorado limited liability company which acquired the construction and operating permits from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources ("DNR") for these systems.

3. As stated in Paragraph 7, Page 3 of that Application, the "Applicant", the "Association" and "Folsom Ridge" have entered into an asset transfer agreement by which "Applicant" shall acquire the water and sewer business and all right, title and interest in the wells, pipes, pumps, treatment facilities, real property, interests in casements and related equipment used to provide service. The Application specifically states <u>"A copy of that agreement is available upon request."</u>

WHEREFORE, on behalf of myself and in the best interests of the other intervenors in the above named case as well as the general populace either residing on or owning property on Big Island, I hereby request that a copy of the Asset Transfer Agreement, as allowed for in the Application referenced above, and all other related data pertaining to that Agreement should be made immediately available to all interested parties, including the Commission, Staff and General and Public Counsels.

The requested documents should clarify not only who currently has ownership of the assets of the systems but also <u>when and how that</u> <u>process of ownership was transferred from the original Big Island</u> <u>Homeowners Association (BIHOA) to the newly formed "Association" and</u> <u>then back to "Folsom Ridge" so it could then be ultimately acquired by the</u> <u>"Applicant".</u>

Full disclosure of this process is definitely in the public interest and should be made available to all parties in this case.
