ORDER REJECTING FILING AND CLOSING CASE

On February 3, 2009, Charter Fiberlink – Missouri, LLC filed an application as described in the above caption. Under Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.010(13) “pleadings” are defined as “any application...filed in a case.” Applications filed with the Commission must be made in compliance with Commission rules 4 CSR 240-2.040 and .080. These regulations impose numerous requirements on any application filed with the Commission. The filing made by Charter Fiberlink does not comply with many of these requirements. In particular, 4 CSR 240-2.080(1) requires that every pleading filed with the Commission be signed by an attorney authorized to practice law in Missouri. In addition, 4 CSR 240-2.080(3) requires each pleading include a statement of requested relief. Charter Fiberlink’s filing does not request relief and is not signed by an attorney.

Because the filing does not comply with the Commission rules, the Commission must reject this application. Further, the Commission will close this case. If it wishes to do so, Charter Fiberlink may file another application through an attorney in accordance with the Commission’s procedural rules.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The application for review and reversal of the North American Number Plan Thousands Block Administrator's decision filed by Charter Fiberlink – Missouri, LLC is rejected.
2. This order shall become effective on February 5, 2009.
3. This case may be closed on February 6, 2009.
