4	A.	I am employed by the Office of the Public Counsel of the State of Missouri (OPC or Public
5		Counsel) as a Public Utility Accountant I.
6	Q.	PLEASE DESCRIBE YOUR EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND.
7	A.	I graduated from Central Missouri State University in Warrensburg, Missouri, with a Bachelor of
8		Science in Business Administration, major in Accounting, in May, 1993.
9	Q.	WHAT IS THE NATURE OF YOUR CURRENT DUTIES WITH THE OFFICE OF
10		THE PUBLIC COUNSEL?
11	A.	Under the direction of the Chief Public Utility Accountant, I am responsible for performing audit
12		and examinations of the books and records of public utilities operating within the state of Missouri.

15	A.	Yes. Please refer to Schedule KKB-1, attached to this direct testimony, for a listing of cases in

which I have previously submitted testimony.

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### Q. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR DIRECT TESTIMONY?

- A. The purpose of my direct testimony is to express the Public Counsel's position regarding Environmental Utilities, LLC's (Environmental or Company) application for permission, approval, and a certificate of public convenience and necessity to install, own, acquire, construct, operate, control, manage and maintain a water system for the public area of unincorporated Camden County, Missouri known as Golden Glade Subdivision (Golden Glade).
- Q. DOES PUBLIC COUNSEL HAVE CONCERNS ABOUT WHETHER THE MISSOURI
  PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION (COMMISSION) SHOULD GRANT A
  CERTIFICATE IN THIS CASE?
- A. Yes.

#### Q. WHAT ARE THOSE CONCERNS?

A. One of the owners of Environmental Utilities, LLC is Greg Williams who is also part owner of Osage Water Company (Osage Water). In recent years, Public Counsel and the Missouri Public Service Commission Staff (Staff) have experienced difficulties in monitoring the business operation of Osage Water. In addition, Osage Water's manner of operation has generated many customer complaints. Therefore, Public Counsel recommends proceeding with caution in considering this application.

- Yes, the houses are either served by the central water system currently or are served by singlefamily wells. With these residents already having water service the imposing of the pre-conditions should not adversely effect the water customers.
- **IMPOSE** DOES COUNSEL BELIEVE COMMISION SHOULD CONDITIONS **ENVIRONMENTAL** UTILTIES, BEFORE THE COMPANY GRANTED SERVE THE GOLDEN GLADE SUBDIVISON?
- Α. Yes. Public Counsel has a list of conditions that the Company should be required to comply with before obtaining the certificate to serve. This list is attached as Schedule KKB-2. These conditions will ensure proper record keeping by the Company, thus making auditing of the Company's books more efficient when the Company's seeks to increase rates. This will assist in achieving effective and prompt regulation.
- Q. THE PUBLIC COUNSEL RECOMMENDING ANY OPERATING THE COMPANY MUST COMPLY COMMISSION WITH IF GRANTS THE CERTIFICATE?
- Yes, Public Counsel believes the Company should continue to utilize the pre-certificate conditions A. listed on Schedule KKB-2 and also comply with the operating conditions listed on Schedule KKB-3.

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WHETHER OTHER OF ENVIRONMENTAL UTILITES MAY AFFECT THE OPERATION OF THE NEW UTILITY?

TO

- Yes. Greg Williams has an ownership interest in a number of related businesses. A.
- Q. EXPLAIN THE MANY AFFILIATED ENTITIES GREG WILLIAMS, THE CO-OWNER OF ENVIRONMENTAL UTILITES, ARE INTERMINGLED WITH THE COMPANY.
- A. Mr. Williams, the co-owner of Environmental Utilities, LLC is representing Environmental Utilities as legal counsel in the application case. He is also the developer of the subdivision in which Environmental is requesting to provide water service to in this Application. The Company has stated in Debra Williams's testimony that Environmental Utilities may serve the Eagle Woods subdivision, which is currently being served by Osage Water Company. Mr. Williams is a coowner of Osage Water Company. Also, as a previously discussed Mr. Williams is currently serving as a director of the Golden Glade Land Owners Association, which will lease the water system from

Mr. Williams if this certificate of convenience and necessity is not granted. Public Counsel believes the Commission should take steps to prevent transactions between these business entities from unfairly increasing customer rates.

- Q. IS PUBLIC COUNSEL CONCERNED OVER THE AFFILATED TRANSACTIONS
  THAT ARE OCCURING AND THAT WILL OCCUR BETWEEN THE COMPANY AND
  THE OTHER ENTITIES MR. WILLIAMS OWNS?
- A. Yes. Public Counsel believes the Company needs to provide very detailed documentation for all of the affiliated transactions. This documentation should detail what services were performed, the exact dates when these services were performed, and if appropriate, the allocation of the cost between business entities.
- Q. DOES PUBLIC COUNSEL HAVE A CONCERN WITH THE PROPOSED TARIFF SHEET NO. 31?
  - Yes, specifically rule 16 (see attached Schedule KKB-4). Public Counsel believes if Environmental Utilities wants to serve an area outside of the Golden Glade Service territory and believes serving another customer or group of customers is beneficial to the Company, then the Company should bear the financial risk of applying for a certificate of convenience and necessity. The potential customer(s) should not have to underwrite the Company's cost of obtaining a certificate. Rule 16 should not be allowed in the Company's tariffs.

- In lieu of a local public hearing, Public Counsel requests that the Company send this letter to each of the current residents in Golden Glade Subdivision informing the residents of Environmental's application. Public Counsel requests that the Commission give the residents ample time to express their views concerning this application before the certificate of convenience and necessity is granted. Public Counsel is not requesting a local public hearing because approximately a dozen current customers will be affected by the Commission's decision.
- DOES THIS CONCLUDE YOUR REBUTTAL TESTIMONY?

### PRE-CERTICATE CONDITIONS

Create a separate customer advances account.

Create a separate contributions in aid of construction (CIAC) account.

Record plant on balance sheet at original cost based on MPSC approved USOA guidelines

Record accumulated depreciation reserve associated with MPSC original cost plant balances on balance sheet.

Create a plant held for future use account.

Create separate revenue sub-accounts within the income water billing account for each class of water customer (i.e., wholesale, residential and commercial,).

Create separate revenue account to record miscellaneous or other revenues.

Develop a continuing property records system to control and monitor tangible properties.

Develop a cost allocation system based on reasonable standards to distribute shared or common costs among the William's various businesses and/or companies.

Develop a log sheet to track, charge, and record personal use of company owned equipment by employees and owners and use of company owned equipment by other entities.

Develop a log to track, charge and record time spent working for Environmental Utilities, Osage Water Company, and any other entity.

Balances for Account 301, Organization and Account 302, Franchises and Consents must be reviewed by Staff and Public Counsel before the certificate can be granted.

### **OPERATING CONDITIONS**

Track all costs for every capital project. This recommendation inherently includes the premise that Environmental Utilities should develop criteria (threshold dollar levels and/or qualitative job standards) in accordance with the Uniform System of Accounts to determine whether a cost is to be recorded as an expense item or whether it requires capitalization.

Record each journal entry entered in the financial records with a full description of the service and service provider, invoice number, payment check number, and amount. If an item is an allocation of paid by an entity other than the utility include a descriptive notation identifying as such.

The Company will ensure that service to condominium developments in the future will be predicated upon the installation of meters for each individual condominium unit in such developments.

Bills for services that the Company provides under contract management agreements in systems not regulated by the Commission will not be rendered under the name 'Environmental Utilities."

## Rules and Regulations Governing the Rendering of Water Service

## RULE 16 SERVICE REQUESTS REQUIRING COMMISSION APPROVAL

- (a) This rule shall apply to requests for service from the owners of properties located outside the area(s) for which the Company has been granted a certificate of convenience and necessity by the Missouri Public Service Commission.
- (b) In addition to complying with Rule 14 with respect to main extensions and Rule 15 with respect to plant capacity expansions, the Applicant Requesting service for a property located outside the Company's service area shall also tender, in advance, a sum representing the Company's estimate of the cost, including a reasonable attorney's fee and the Company's administrative expenses and engineering fees, of obtaining the approval of the Missouri Public Service Commission of a certificate of convenience and necessity to provide the service requested to an area including the property for which service is requested.
- (c) A written contract shall be executed by the Applicant and the Company under the terms and conditions of which the Applicant shall bear all costs and risks associated with obtaining a certificate of convenience and necessity.
- (d) If an application for a certificate is opposed by the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, the Office of Public Counsel, or any Intervenor, the Company may, at its option, dismiss the Application without further obligation to the Applicant, or may request that the Applicant deposit additional funds to cover the anticipated costs of a contested certificate case before the Commission. The Applicant may, at its option, elect to withdraw its request for service in lieu of depositing said additional funds.
- (e) If an application is granted an a certificate of convenience and necessity is issued by the Missouri Public Service Commission, the Company shall reimburse to the Applicant the portion of the cost of obtaining said certificate which is approved by the Missouri Public Service Commission for addition to the Company's rate base within one (1) year after the date of the Commission's Order approving said addition to rate base.
