On October 4, 2005, a number of small rural carriers¹ filed a petition for arbitration with the Missouri Public Service Commission pursuant to the Telecommunications Act of 1996, requesting that the Commission arbitrate unresolved issues with Cingular Wireless.

As Cingular is a party to the agreement, the Commission finds that Cingular is necessary and indispensable to a resolution of this matter and shall be made a party. The Commission will direct the Data Center to provide notice of this petition to Cingular, and Cingular shall be permitted to file a response to the petition with any additional information it chooses to provide.

Furthermore, finding that there is a need to protect confidential information, the Commission will issue its standard protect order. The Commission has previously
