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

- 5. On or about May 16, 2005, after good faith negotiations, Choctaw and T-Mobile executed a Traffic Termination Agreement ("Agreement") for the state of Missouri pursuant to the terms of the Act (see Agreement, Attachment I).
- 6. Pursuant to the Act, Choctaw hereby submits this Agreement for approval by the Commission.
- 7. The Agreement complies fully with Section 252(e) of the Act because the Agreement is consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity and does not discriminate against any telecommunications carrier. The Agreement consists of 20 pages.
- 8. There are no outstanding issues between Choctaw and T-Mobile that need the assistance of mediation or arbitration.
