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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- 2 JUDGE DIPPELL: Missouri Public Service
- 3 Commission has set this time for a local hearing in Case
- 4 No. WR-2010-0131 in which Missouri American Water Company
- 5 seeks to implement a general rate increase. I'm Nancy
- 6 Dippell. I'm a regulatory law judge who works for the
- 7 commission, and my job tonight is to facilitate this
- 8 hearing to take public comments.
- 9 With me tonight is the chairman, Robert
- 10 Clayton, of the Public Service Commission. And
- 11 Mr. Chairman, would you like to make some opening remarks?
- 12 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Thank you. Thank you,
- 13 Judge. My name is Robert Clayton. I'm chairman of the
- 14 Missouri Public Service Commission. We're a five-member
- 15 commission. We have five commissioners from different
- 16 parts of the state of Missouri, and we are all venturing
- 17 out, taking part in the local public hearing process that
- 18 is going on throughout the state. Last night we were in
- 19 Riverside, Missouri. We're here tonight in Warrensburg.
- 20 Tomorrow we're in St. Louis. And I'm not sure where
- 21 Thursday is, and then next week we keep going.
- I am here tonight to hear the comments that
- 23 you have and to participate in a little bit of the
- 24 discussion that has been going on. I wanted to make you
- 25 aware that if you would like to testify, we have a court

- 1 reporter who is here. She will take down the comments, and
- 2 then all the commissioners have an opportunity to read the
- 3 transcript that goes with that.
- 4 As you can see, we're also web casting, and we
- 5 have some folks participating from Jefferson City. Part of
- 6 the reason for that is that we had a completely different
- 7 case unrelated to this one taking place in our Jefferson
- 8 City hearing room, so we have a number of different things
- 9 that are going on, and we try to accommodate as many people
- 10 as possible.
- 11 So I want to thank you for taking the time to
- 12 come out tonight. We are trying some new things on these
- 13 local public hearings, trying to make sure that we're
- 14 providing information that is helpful so that the public
- 15 has an opportunity to understand what we do at the
- 16 commission, how we make decisions, and how you can provide
- 17 input on many of those decisions.
- 18 So having said that, I want to thank you for
- 19 being here. Please take advantage of our staff if you have
- 20 particular issues, or if you want to meet with the company,
- 21 we can help facilitate those discussions, and I look
- 22 forward to your comments. Thank you for being here.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you. If you were
- 24 present for the question and answer session, which I think
- 25 all of you were, you were introduced to some of the members

- 1 of our staff who are here. And as the chairman said, we're
- 2 more than happy to meet with you if you have questions that
- 3 didn't get answered.
- 4 Also I want to make you aware that we are
- 5 having the hearing transcribed so that the other
- 6 commissioners can read the comments and so forth. And in
- 7 addition, it's being -- this hearing is being recorded as
- 8 well as being broadcast over the video. It will be
- 9 recorded, and then the video will be placed on our website.
- 10 We have a website which has all of our hearings and the
- 11 commissioners' general agenda meetings.
- 12 I wanted to thank Central Missouri University
- 13 for letting us use their facility this evening, and just
- 14 state that the comments and statements here tonight really
- 15 aren't associated with the university. They've just been
- 16 kind enough to provide with us a location.
- 17 This is an official hearing of the Missouri
- 18 Public Service Commission, and we'll take the statements
- 19 and testimony under oath or affirmation. The purpose is to
- 20 receive your comments, and the company's not here to
- 21 present witnesses tonight. We will have an evidentiary
- 22 hearing later in the process where it's more like a trial
- 23 and the company will be presenting their witnesses, staff
- 24 and then the other parties will also present witnesses at
- 25 that time.

- 1 As I call your name, if you would come up.
- 2 This is a little odd arrangement, but if you could come up
- 3 and stand at the podium if you're able, and I will ask you
- 4 to take an oath or affirm, and then you can give your name.
- 5 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Is that where the
- 6 camera is?
- 7 JUDGE DIPPELL: The camera is actually
- 8 back here. See, that's why we are asking you to stand up
- 9 here. So with that, I'm going to let the attorneys make
- 10 their entries of appearance. I'm going to begin with
- 11 Office of the Public Counsel, who is the public advocate
- 12 before the Public Service Commission. Ms. Baker would you
- 13 like to make your entry of appearance?
- MS. BAKER: Thank you very much.
- 15 Christina Baker, P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri,
- 16 65102, appearing on behalf of the Office of the Public
- 17 Counsel.
- 18 JUDGE DIPPELL: And Mr. England, would you
- 19 like to make your appearance?
- 20 MR. ENGLAND: Thank you, Judge. Let the
- 21 record reflect the appearance of W.R. England, appearing on
- 22 behalf of the water company. My address in Jefferson City
- 23 is Post Office Box 456, zip code 65102.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And for staff?
- 25 MS. LEWIS: My name is Rachel Lewis,

- 1 appearing for the staff of the Public Service Commission.
- 2 My address is P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And are there any other
- 4 attorneys that need to make an entry? All right then. We
- 5 can go ahead and begin with our first witness, Cindy
- 6 Collier.
- 7 CINDY COLLIER,
- 8 produced, sworn and examined, testifies and says:
- 9 MS. COLLIER: I'm an alderman in the City
- 10 of Brunswick, and I'd like to submit into the evidence a
- 11 packet of petition signatures of Missouri American Water
- 12 Company customers. And the petition is titled, We the
- 13 Undersigned Customers of the Missouri American Water
- 14 Company, Brunswick, Missouri, are Strongly Opposed to the
- 15 Recently Requested Rate Increase Submitted to the Public
- 16 Service Commission. And there's a few comments in there
- 17 also.
- 18 And then visually I'd like to -- I don't want
- 19 to submit to the evidence bank. I would like for the
- 20 pertinent people to see it tonight.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Okay.
- 22 MS. COLLIER: The quality that we have to
- 23 sustain.
- 24 JUDGE DIPPELL: Can you explain to us what
- 25 you're holding there?

- 1 MS. COLLIER: It is a small section of
- 2 pipe from our Brunswick Nursing Home, and it is, of course,
- 3 filled with calcium deposits. So is there anyone who would
- 4 like to look at that or hold it?
- 5 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: I would.
- 6 JUDGE DIPPELL: I'm going to try to figure
- 7 out a way that we could photograph it or at least get a
- 8 good visual of it on the camera. Did you have any other
- 9 comments that you wanted to make while he's setting up the
- 10 document camera?
- MS. COLLIER: I don't believe so.
- 12 JUDGE DIPPELL: Let me go ahead then and
- 13 I'll mark your petitions. You were willing to let us take
- 14 those and as attach those to the transcript? I'll mark
- 15 those as Exhibit 1, and if you'll just give those to the
- 16 court reporter, she can attach those to the transcript.
- 17 (The reporter marked Exhibit No. 1.)
- 18 JUDGE DIPPELL: Can you tell me anything
- 19 more about the pipe?
- 20 MS. COLLIER: It is, as I said, from the
- 21 Brunswick Nursing Home, and it's just a small section of
- 22 pipe where the calcium has overtaken it. And of course,
- 23 the pipe has become useless.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Do you know when it was
- 25 collected, the pipe?

- 1 MS. COLLIER: It was approximately three
- 2 years ago.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Mr. Chairman, would you
- 4 like to ask Ms. Collier any questions?
- 5 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: I would, Judge, thank
- 6 you. Alderman Collier, regarding this pipe, obviously
- 7 there was backup or a clog in the service where the
- 8 pressure got so low somebody went in and replaced the pipe?
- 9 Is that how they came about finding this section of the
- 10 pipe?
- MS. COLLIER: Yes.
- 12 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: And was this reported
- 13 to the company?
- 14 MS. COLLIER: No, I don't believe that it
- 15 was.
- 16 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Do you believe it's the
- 17 company's fault for the calcium building up in the pipe?
- 18 Is that your understanding of the kind of diagnosis of the
- 19 problem?
- 20 MS. COLLIER: Yes, yes. I believe that
- 21 the grains of hardness in the City of Brunswick's water is
- 22 extreme and reeks havoc on --
- 23 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Have you ever had the
- 24 water tested? Has the City had the water tested?
- MS. COLLIER: Yes.

- 1 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Do you know what the
- 2 rating was?
- 3 MS. COLLIER: I know the grains of
- 4 hardness, and I'm not certain. It's 20 grains hard in the
- 5 City of Brunswick. And I'm not certain if that's the
- 6 measurement you prefer or not.
- 7 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: I think that was what
- 8 we heard last time. We heard someone mentioned 22, but 20
- 9 is similar to that.
- 10 (Off the record.)
- 11 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: I'd like to look at
- 12 that pipe, too, at some point. Thank you. What's the name
- of the nursing home?
- 14 MS. COLLIER: It's Brunswick Nursing Home.
- 15 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: And do you know, did
- 16 the nursing home ever contact the water company?
- 17 MS. COLLIER: No. I don't know if the
- 18 nursing home contacted the water company.
- 19 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Have you been advised
- 20 of things that you can do to or that the nursing home can
- 21 do to address the problem aside from contacting the water
- 22 company? Did they buy filters or anything like that.
- MS. COLLIER: A water softener was the
- 24 resolution.
- 25 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: Okay. Alderman

- 1 Collier, I think that's all the questions I have.
- 2 MS. COLLIER: I should disclose that my
- 3 father, Sam Johnson, is a plumbing contractor in Brunswick,
- 4 and that's where the section of pipe came from. It's his
- 5 possession, and I was told not to let it go.
- 6 CHAIRMAN CLAYTON: That's all right.
- 7 We're not going to make you part with your evidence there.
- 8 Thank you very much for coming.
- 9 JUDGE DIPPELL: Were there any -- before
- 10 you step down, just a moment, Ms. Collier. Were there any
- 11 questions from the attorneys in Jefferson City? Ms. Baker?
- 12 MS. BAKER: No questions. Thank you for
- 13 coming.
- MR. ENGLAND: No questions.
- 15 MS. LEWIS: No questions. Thank you for
- 16 your time.
- 17 JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you, Ms. Collier,
- 18 very much. And Ms. Collier was the only person I had
- 19 signed up on my witness list, but if anybody else would
- 20 like to give comments, just raise your hand and we'd be
- 21 happy to hear from you.
- 22 We appreciate you-all coming out this evening,
- 23 and I hope that the reason nobody wants to get up and give
- 24 comments is that you got your questions answered, and the
- 25 PSC staff was able to help in some way. So if you have

further questions, you can contact our office or the Office of the Public Counsel. And I guess that will conclude the on-record portion of the hearing, and we can go off the record. Thank you. (Proceedings adjourned.)
