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1 | The following proceedings began at 6:15 p.m.:

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JUDGE KEELING: Good evening. Let's go on the record. First I'd ask everyone to mute themselves unless they're speaking. That will cut down on the noise level and prevent audio feedback. If you don't have a mute button or if you can't find it, I believe that *6 will also mute and unmute your phone, if that's what you're working with.

Today is May 23rd, 2023. The time is 6:15 p.m. My name is Ross Keeling. I am a regulatory law judge with the Missouri Public Service Commission and I'll preside over this hearing.

The Commission has set this time for a local public hearing in Case No. WR-2023-0344, which is captioned as In the Matter of the Application of a Rate Increase of Raytown Water Company. The Commission has scheduled this local public hearing to give members of the public a chance to comment about Raytown Water Company's application.

The Missouri Public Service Commission regulates the rates charged by public utility companies in Missouri to ensure that those rates are just and reasonable. The Commission also regulates the quality of service and safety of the operations of public utilities.

Raytown Water Company is a public utility
under the Missouri Statutes and as such is subject to
regulation by the Commission. The Commission is
currently made up of four Commissioners. The
Commissioners are appointed by the Governor to fixed
terms and confirmed by the Senate.

The Commissioners employ a staff of engineers, accountants, attorneys, financial analysts and other specialists in the field of utility regulation.
