The Missouri Public Service Commission has set this time for a local public hearing, which we are holding virtually in Case No. WR-2020-0344 captioned In the Matter of Missouri-American Water Company's Request for Authority to Implement a General Rate Increase for Water and Sewer Service provided in Missouri Service Areas.

The Commission has scheduled this time for a local public hearing to give the members of the public a chance to comment about Missouri-American's request.

The Commission regulates the rates charged by investor-owned public utility companies such as Missouri-American to ensure that those rates are just and reasonable. The Commission also regulates the quality of service and the safety of the operations of those public utilities.

The Commission is made up of five commissioners. The commissioners are appointed by the Governor to fixed terms and confirmed by the Senate. The commissioners also employ a staff of engineers, accountants, attorneys, financial analysts and other specialists in the field of utility regulation.

My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm a Regulatory

The Commission won't be able to answer any of your questions for this portion of the hearing. This portion is to allow your comments. The Commissioners and I will be remaining impartial until all of the evidence is presented and we've had the opportunity to hear the evidence presented at the evidentiary hearing.
