# ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF, GIVING NOTICE OF CONTESTED CASE, DELEGATING AUTHORITY, AND SCHEDULING AN EVIDENTIARY HEARING

Issue Date: January 4, 2023

Effective Date: January 4, 2023

On December 21, 2022, Confluence Rivers Utility Operating Company, Inc. (Confluence or "the Company") filed proposed tariffs to produce an additional \$1,286,748 in annual water revenues from 26 water service areas and an additional \$1,862,116 in annual sewer revenues from 39 sewer service areas. Individual rate changes proposed by the Company differ from water to sewer and by service area because of the variety of rates currently in use. The tariffs have a proposed effective date of January 20, 2023.

# A. Suspension of Tariff

Section 393.150 RSMo (2016), authorizes the Commission to suspend the effective date of proposed tariffs for 120 days, plus an additional six months to allow for a hearing. To provide sufficient time to determine if Confluence's proposed tariffs are just

and reasonable,<sup>1</sup> the Commission will suspend the tariffs for 120 days beyond their effective date. The Commission's experience demonstrates that a full hearing cannot be concluded within 120 days, so the Commission will suspend the tariffs for an additional six months.<sup>2</sup>

### B. Notice of Contested Case

Suspension of the tariff may occur only pending a "full" hearing and decision on the tariff's propriety.<sup>3</sup> The provision for a full pre-decision hearing signifies that this action is now a "contested case."<sup>4</sup> A contested case is a formal hearing procedure, but it allows for waiver of procedural formalities and a decision without a hearing,<sup>5</sup> including by stipulation and agreement.<sup>6</sup> The Commission's discovery regulations may be found at 20 CSR 4240-2.090.

### C. Delegation as to Discovery

The Commission may delegate any adjudicative authority to the regulatory law judge assigned to this action.<sup>7</sup> To ensure that all discovery disputes are ruled upon expeditiously, the Commission will delegate its authority to the regulatory law judge assigned to this action to rule on discovery disputes raised at the discovery conferences and to rule on all motions to compel discovery.

### THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The proposed tariffs, Tracking Nos. YW-2023-0113 and YS-2023-0114, filed by Confluence are suspended for 120 days from January 20, 2023, to May 20, 2023, plus six months thereafter, until November 20, 2023.

2. The regulatory law judge assigned to this action shall have full authority to rule on any discovery dispute, including any motion to compel, and may make any such ruling at a discovery conference.

3. The evidentiary hearing is scheduled for July 31 through August 11, 2023.

4. The evidentiary hearing shall be held at the Commission's office at the Governor Office Building, Room 310, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City, Missouri, and will begin each day at 9:00 a.m. This building meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act. 5. This order shall be effective when issued.
