1 The following hearing began at 6:15 p.m.:

2 JUDGE SEYER: Let's go on the record. Today
3 is January 24, 2023. The time is 6:15 p.m. My name is
4 Ken Seyer. I'm a Regulatory Law Judge with the Missouri
5 Public Service Commission, and I will preside over this
6 portion of the hearing.

7 The Commission has set this time for a local
8 public hearing in File No. WR-2022-0303, which is
9 captioned as In the Matter of Missouri-American Water
10 Company's Request for Authority to Implement General
11 Rate Increase for Water and Sewer Service Provided in
12 Missouri Service Areas. The Commission has scheduled
13 this local public hearing to give members of the public
14 a chance to comment about Missouri-American Water
15 Company's request for a rate increase.

16 The Missouri Public Service Commission
17 regulates the rates charged by public utility companies
18 in Missouri to ensure that those rates are just and
19 reasonable. The Commission also regulates the quality
20 of service and safety of the operations of public
21 utilities. Missouri-American Water is a public utility
22 under Missouri Statutes and as such is subject to
23 regulation by the Commission.

24 The Commission is made up of five
25 Commissioners. The Commissioners are appointed by the

1 Governor to fixed terms and confirmed by the Senate.
2 The Commissioners employ a staff of engineers,
3 accountants, attorneys, financial analysts and other
4 specialists in the field of utility regulation.

5 With us today is Commissioner Glen Kolkmeier
6 in person, and participating via WebEx internet
7 connection is Commissioner Maida Coleman and
8 Commissioner Jason Holsman.

9 This is an official hearing of the Missouri
10 Public Service Commission and the statements and
11 testimony of witnesses will be recorded by a court
12 reporter and must be given under oath. Once the hearing
13 testimony is transcribed, the Commissioners will have
14 the opportunity to read all of the witnesses' remarks.
15 Know that the Commissioners value your comments and
16 input.

17 At this time, would any of the Commissioners
18 like to make opening remarks?

19 COMMISSIONER KOLKMEYER: Good evening. Glen
20 Kolkmeier again. I want to welcome everyone here
21 tonight to this local public hearing. We welcome your
22 comments and we do listen to what the public has to say,
23 so again thank you and welcome. Thank you, Judge.

24 JUDGE SEYER: All right. Any of the other
25 Commissioners?

1 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: Thank you, Judge. I
2 just want to echo the sentiments of Commissioner
3 Kolkmeier and appreciate everybody offering their
4 valuable opinion this evening. Thank you.

5 COMMISSIONER COLEMAN: I concur with the
6 comments made. Thank you, everyone. Thank you, Judge,
7 for conducting the hearing tonight.

8 JUDGE SEYER: Thank you, Commissioner Coleman.
9 There are attorneys here tonight representing the
10 parties in this matter. For the record, would each of
11 you identify yourselves and spell your name for the
12 court reporter and state which party you're
13 representing.

14 MR. LUFT: Thank you, Judge. Tim Luft,
15 L-u-f-t, on behalf of Missouri-American Water, 727 Craig
16 Road, St. Louis, Missouri 63141.

17 JUDGE SEYER: All right. Thank you.

18 MS. VanGERPEN: Lindsay VanGerpen, which is
19 V-a-n-G-e-r-p-e-n, on behalf of the Office of the Public
20 Counsel, and our address is 200 Madison Street,
21 Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.

22 MS. BRETZ: Karen Bretz for Staff of the
23 Commission, B-r-e-t-z, and our address is 200 Madison
24 Street, 8th Floor, Jefferson City, 65101.

25 MR. COFFMAN: Good evening. John Coffman with

1 the Consumers Council of Missouri, 871 Tuxedo Boulevard,
2 St. Louis, Missouri 63119, here representing the
3 Consumers Council of Missouri.

4 JUDGE SEYER: Okay. Thank you. The way this
5 portion of the hearing will proceed tonight will be to
6 call the names of anyone who has signed up to speak in
7 the order that they have signed up. When I call your
8 name, please step up to the microphone. But before you
9 speak, I will place you under oath and ask you to state
10 and spell your name and then you can offer your comments
11 to the Commission.

12 So we actually -- I am seeing just one name on
13 the list and is it Ms. Weigum? Okay. If you wouldn't
14 mind, would you step up to the microphone, please. All
15 right. Would you go ahead and state and spell your
16 name?

17 MS. WEIGUM: My name is Virginia Weigum,
18 W-e-i-g-u-m, and I have been a resident of St. Joseph
19 for approximately 50 years. I am a senior. Would
20 anybody like to see my driver's license?

21 JUDGE SEYER: No.

22 MS. WEIGUM: I am a senior citizen, and I do
23 live on fixed income.

24 JUDGE SEYER: Before you testify any further,
25 let me place you under oath, please. Would you raise

1 your right hand, please. Thank you. Do you swear or
2 affirm that the testimony you're about to give in this
3 hearing is the truth, the whole truth and nothing but
4 the truth?

5 MS. WEIGUM: Yes.

6 JUDGE SEYER: Do you need to adjust that
7 microphone? I'm just asking.

8 MS. WEIGUM: It's fine.

9 JUDGE SEYER: Then go ahead. You can proceed
10 with your comments.

11 VIRGINIA WEIGUM,
12 having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

13 MS. WEIGUM: My comment is for seniors that
14 live on fixed income, and a great percentage of the city
15 does, I am very concerned that with everyone raising
16 their rates, food, utilities, the cost of living, that
17 it will present an additional hardship for them. And
18 I've heard terrible stories about seniors having to eat,
19 this is extreme, eating dog food and making other
20 choices. And I would think that everybody would take
21 that into consideration. I know it costs money to be a
22 business and to run your business, but please consider
23 everything. Thank you.

24 JUDGE SEYER: All right. If you don't mind,
25 would you remain at the microphone. Commissioner

1 Kolkmeier, do you have any questions for this witness?

2 COMMISSIONER KOLKMEYER: No, sir.

3 JUDGE SEYER: For the sake of the court
4 reporter, his answer is no. Commissioners Coleman or
5 Holsman, do you have any questions for this witness?

6 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: No questions, Judge.

7 COMMISSIONER COLEMAN: No questions, Judge.

8 JUDGE SEYER: Thank you, Ms. Weigum. You're
9 excused.

10 MS. WEIGUM: Thank you.

11 JUDGE SEYER: As I said, that's the only name
12 I have on the list. Is there anyone else who did not
13 sign up on the list who would like to testify tonight?
14 Go ahead.

15 MS. CULVER: My name is Daphne Culver. That
16 spelling of the last name is C-u-l-v-e-r.

17 JUDGE SEYER: Would you mind spelling your
18 first name as well?

19 MS. CULVER: It is D-a-p-h-n-e.

20 JUDGE SEYER: Thank you. Would you raise your
21 right hand to be sworn. Thank you. Do you swear or
22 affirm that the testimony you are about to give in this
23 hearing shall be the truth, the whole truth and nothing
24 but the truth?

25 MS. CULVER: I do.

1 JUDGE SEYER: Thank you. You can go ahead.

2 DAPHNE CULVER,

3 having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

4 MS. CULVER: I have a comment. With respect
5 to shareholders and profits, I do feel like it is
6 immoral and inappropriate for that life necessity to be
7 a money-making proposition. I feel that we have come to
8 a very poor place if we are looking at the necessity of
9 human life as a shareholder proposition we're trying to
10 make money from. And that is my comment.

11 JUDGE SEYER: Okay. Do any of the
12 Commissioners have any questions for Ms. Culver?

13 COMMISSIONER COLEMAN: No questions, Judge.

14 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: No questions, Judge.

15 JUDGE SEYER: All right. No questions from
16 Commissioner Kolkmeyer either. Thank you very much.

17 MS. CULVER: Thank you.

18 JUDGE SEYER: Is there -- Yes, go ahead.

19 MS. GOODRICK: So I was wondering about since
20 we pay for sewer rates also along with the water --

21 JUDGE SEYER: Well, I think I need to get you
22 under oath.

23 MS. GOODRICK: Oh, okay.

24 JUDGE SEYER: So if you'll state your name,
25 please.

1 MS. GOODRICK: Tina Goodrick.

2 JUDGE SEYER: How do you spell your last name,
3 please?

4 MS. GOODRICK: G-o-o-d-r-i-c-k.

5 JUDGE SEYER: And would you raise your right
6 hand to be sworn. Thank you. Do you swear or affirm
7 that the testimony you're about to give in this hearing
8 shall be the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the
9 truth?

10 MS. GOODRICK: Yes.

11 JUDGE SEYER: Thank you. Go ahead.

12 TINA GOODRICK,
13 having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

14 MS. GOODRICK: I don't know if this pertains
15 but we have -- we recently had you guys replace, I don't
16 know if it was you or the city, replace some of our
17 sewer lines that had rusted through and were leaking
18 into our creeks in the neighborhood, and I was wondering
19 if there are any plans on correcting the stormwater
20 drainage pipes running through the city that are
21 collapsing and causing our ground to be washed away into
22 the creeks and erode away.

23 JUDGE SEYER: Now, the Commissioners
24 themselves can't answer that kind of a question in this
25 proceeding today. They have to wait until the actual

1 rate hearing to hear evidence on those kind of matters.

2 Mr. Luft?

3 MR. LUFT: Ms. Goodrick, you were here earlier
4 when representatives of Missouri-American said we do not
5 have the sewer or the stormwater in the City of St.
6 Joseph.

7 MS. GOODRICK: Okay. Thank you.

8 JUDGE SEYER: Okay. And any questions from
9 the Commissioners? None from Commissioner Kolkmeyer.

10 COMMISSIONER COLEMAN: No questions, Judge.

11 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: No questions, Judge.

12 JUDGE SEYER: Thank you, Commissioners. Thank
13 you. Thank you for your testimony.

14 All right. Is there anyone else? All right.
15 Would any of the Commissioners like to make closing
16 remarks?

17 COMMISSIONER KOLKMEYER: Again, I just want to
18 thank everyone for coming out this evening on a cold
19 evening. We do take and listen to your comments and we
20 appreciate those that did give them. Thank you, Judge.

21 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: Judge, this is
22 Commissioner Holsman. I just want to thank everybody
23 for coming. Thank you for being there. Thank
24 Commissioner Kolkmeyer for making the trip to St. Joe
25 and thank everybody for giving their opinion.

1 COMMISSIONER COLEMAN: Thank you, Judge.

2 JUDGE SEYER: Thank you, Commissioner Coleman.

3 And I would also like to thank all the participants
4 today for their testimony. If you afterwards want to
5 add additional comments or if you know of someone who
6 could not be present tonight but would like to comment,
7 you or that person can make written comments by
8 contacting the same email address used to register for
9 this hearing which is watersewercomments@psc.mo.gov and
10 if you would like to contact the Office of the Public
11 Counsel, it is mopco -- opcservice, one word,
12 @opc.mo.gov. Thank you, Ms. VanGerpen. Or you can go
13 to the Public Service Commission website. And like I
14 said at the beginning of the hearing, the file number is
15 WR-2022-0303.

16 So if there is nothing further, this hearing
17 is now adjourned and we are off the record. Thank you.
