1	PROCEEDINGS
2	JUDGE CLARK: Why don't we go on the record
3	now. Today's date is November 21, 2018, and the current
4	time is nine o'clock a.m. We're in Room 305 of the
5	Governor Office Building. The Commission has set aside
6	this time for a Procedural Conference in the case
7	captioned as In The Matter Of The Proposed
8	Missouri-American Water Company 2nd Revised Tariff Sheet
9	No. R 65, File No. WT-2019-0054.
10	My name is John Clark. I'm the Regulatory Law
11	Judge assigned to this matter. I'm going to begin by
12	asking the attorneys to make their entries of appearance
13	starting with Missouri-American Water.
14	MR. ENGLAND: Thank you, Your Honor. Let the
15	record reflect the appearance of W.R. England with the
16	law firm of Brydon, Swearengen & England, Post Office
17	Box 456, Jefferson City, Missouri, on behalf of
18	Missouri-American Company, and I believe Tim Luft,
19	attorney for Missouri-American Water Company is also
20	participating by phone.
21	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. Mr. England, thank you.
22	Mr. Luft, were you able to hear that?
23	MR. LUFT: Barely.
24	JUDGE CLARK: I'm sorry. It's going to be
25	hard to hear. If any of the parties directly need to

1 talk, don't ask me to approach. Just come up and you're welcome to speak into the speaker phone. So I have 2 entries from Mr. England and Mr. Luft. From the 3 Commission Staff? 4 5 MR. JOHNSON: Thank you, Judge. Mark Johnson on behalf of the Staff of the Public Service Commission. 6 7 JUDGE CLARK: From the Office of the Public Counsel? 8 MR. HALL: Caleb Hall on behalf of Public 9 10 Counsel. My contact information has been provided to 11 the reporter. JUDGE CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Hall. From the 12 Home Builders Association of St. Louis and Eastern 13 14 Missouri? 15 MR. PIEPER: Yes. Chris Pieper with the law firm Blitz, Bardgett & Deutsch, 414 East Broadway, Suite 16 17 100, Columbia, Missouri, 65201. 18 JUDGE CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Pieper. And from 19 Avondale Custom Homes, LLC? 20 MS. SCHULTZ: Sue Schultz with Sandberg, Phoenix & Von Gontard. 21 22 JUDGE CLARK: Have I missed anyone? I don't 23 think so. I'm going to ask everybody to bear with me. My daughter brought home from preschool a little bit of 24 25 a cold for me. I'm not going to pretend to understand Page

1 all of this. My understanding is that a tariff was filed in relation to some changes with the tax law 2 regarding contribution and aid of construction and that 3 the Commission Staff asked to have that suspended so 4 that they could do some further investigation and they 5 subsequently submitted a recommendation. 6 7 I also received two applications to intervene that were granted from the Home Builders Association of 8 St. Louis and Eastern Missouri and from Avondale Custom 9 10 Homes LLC. I guess at this time are there any 11 preliminary matters I need to address? Seeing nothing. 12 I'm going to say that this is currently suspended until December 7 of 2018. I assume that I'll 13 14 receive another motion from Staff in regard to further suspension as necessary. 15 MR. JOHNSON: At this time we are not 16 17 anticipating doing that. 18 JUDGE CLARK: Okay. So if there's any 19 suspension at all, it's going to come from me? 20 MR. JOHNSON: Yes. JUDGE CLARK: Or from the intervenors or 21 22 another party. I want to sort out real quick what the 23 nature of the intervenors are. This is directed at the 24 Home Builders Association of St. Louis and Eastern 25 Missouri and Avondale Custom Homes. Because people file

motions for intervention for different reasons, 1 sometimes they file just because they're interested 2 3 parties and want to receive the filings and see what's going on. Sometimes they are interested in contesting 4 5 or having a part in what's going on. So since I've got you here, Mr. Pieper, from Home Builders Association of 6 7 St. Louis and Eastern Missouri, what's your interest in intervention? 8 9 MR. PIEPER: Thank you, Judge. Our interest 10 in intervention is we are directly and potentially 11 adversely impacted by any decision of the Commission regarding this tariff. I would say that the process 12 13 that has happened thus far since May with the workshop 14 and other proceedings with both Commission Staff as well as in this matter we felt the need to protect our 15 16 association's interests with respect to this change in the tax law. 17 18 JUDGE CLARK: Okay. So you see yourself not 19 as just an interested party but as an active party 20 that's contesting this? 21 MR. PIEPER: We are not contesting the tariff. We're in support of the tariff. But in order to ensure 22 23 that our interests are protected, we entered our 24 appearance and sought intervention to protect those

interests.

1	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. Are you opposing the		
2	recommendation of Staff or asking for a hearing at this		
3	point in time?		
4	MR. PIEPER: No, Your Honor. We support the		
5	recommendation of Staff. We think it's a reasonable		
6	approach to this unforeseen change in the Federal Tax		
7	Code. We've worked with Staff through the workshop		
8	process and then also in this matter to assist in their		
9	investigation, and we are in full support of the Staff's		
10	recommendation.		
11	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. Thank you. And Avondale		
12	Custom Homes, what's your intervention interest? Ms.		
13	Schultz?		
14	MS. SCHULTZ: I'm sorry. I had it on mute. I		
15	will say I could not really hear what Mr. Pieper was		
16	saying.		
L7	JUDGE CLARK: I can summarize it for you.		
18	MS. SCHULTZ: I heard a little summary. I		
19	think we're good. Thank you, Your Honor.		
20	We are interested because my client has a		
21	small development currently and a large development		
22	planned that would be greatly impacted by the treatment		
23	of the CIAC tax. So we are an active interested party.		
24	However, as this proceeding has gone along with the		
25	tariffs that Missouri-American has proposed that is Page		

currently in suspension, we do support that tariff. 1 we are not asking for any further suspension or hearing 2 3 at this point. JUDGE CLARK: Okay. That kind of settles 4 almost all the issues for me. What is the Office of 5 Public Counsel's position? 6 7 MR. HALL: At this time we are not contesting Staff's recommendation and we are not requesting a 8 9 hearing at this time. 10 JUDGE CLARK: I don't hear anybody contesting 11 this. So I'm not going to order the parties to put together a procedural schedule of any kind. And what I 12 13 will do is probably put this before the Commission to 14 see if they want to approve the tariff or not. Just for everybody's information, I'm going to 15 16 be gone next week. So this will probably not occur next 17 And the earliest that this will occur will be the week. 18 beginning of December. So it's possible, I'm going to 19 try not to, but it's possible that it might be suspended 20 another week before going before the Commission. I think I've said about everything I have to 21 22 say given that I have everybody's positions and I know 23 now that nobody is going to be filing for a hearing. 24 With that, are there any other matters that need to be

addressed by the Commission at this time?

1	Okay. I want to thank everyone for coming in,
2	and I hope I didn't waste anybody's time. I just wanted
3	to ascertain whether or not this was going to be a
4	contested case in any way or not. I hadn't received any
5	filings indicating one way or the other whether there
6	was or not. When I have parties that I don't know how
7	much experience they have before the Commission, I don't
8	necessarily want to deprive them of any rights to a
9	hearing that they may not know that they have but would
10	need to affirmatively apply for.
11	So that being said and hearing no other
12	matters, we'll go off the record and this hearing is
13	adjourned.
