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- 2 RLJ WOODRUFF: This is the prehearing
- 3 conference in Case No. WO-2004-0116.
- 4 And we'll begin by taking entries of appearance
- 5 from Missouri American.
- 6 MR. ENGLAND: Thank you, Your Honor.
- 7 Let the record reflect the appearance of
- 8 W. R. England and David Abernathy on behalf of the
- 9 applicant, Missouri-American Water Company.
- 10 RLJ WOODRUFF: And for Staff.
- 11 MR. KRUEGER: Keith R. Krueger for the Staff of
- 12 the Missouri Public Service Commission. My address is P.
- O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102.
- 14 RLJ WOODRUFF: Public Counsel.
- MS. O'NEILL: Good morning, Judge.
- 16 Ruth O'Neill for the Office of the Public
- 17 Counsel. Our mailing address is P. O. Box 2230,
- 18 Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- 19 RLJ WOODRUFF: And for Missouri Energy Group.
- 20 MS. LANGENDECKERT: Lisa Langendeckert
- 21 representing the Missouri Energy Group. Address is
- 22 720 Olive Street, 24th Floor, St. Louis, Missouri 63101.
- 23 And I'd also like to enter the appearance of
- 24 Robert Johnson.
- 25 RLJ WOODRUFF: And is Mr. Johnson there with

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- 1 you?
- 2 MS. LANGENDECKERT: He is not with me
- 3 presently, but he will also be participating in this
- 4 case.
- 5 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- Just so the record is clear, Ms. Langendeckert
- 7 is participating by telephone today and is not currently
- 8 in the room, so the record is clear on that.
- 9 For Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers.
- 10 MS. VUYLSTEKE: Diana Vuylsteke of the firm
- 11 Bryan Cave LLC, 211 North Broadway, Suite 3600,
- 12 St. Louis, Missouri 63102, also participating by
- 13 telephone.
- 14 RLJ WOODRUFF: Thank you.
- 15 All right. I believe that is all of the
- 16 parties.
- I called you all today to come in today on
- 18 short notice because we do have what, according to the
- 19 schedule, is an on-the-record presentation scheduled for
- 20 Friday. And as this case has developed, it's become
- 21 apparent that there are significant disagreements amongst
- 22 the parties as to the amount that Missouri-American
- should be allowed to establish for their infrastructure
- 24 system replacement surcharge. They are about \$2 million
- 25 apart, I believe.

1	Therefore, it appears that the Commission is
2	going to have to be issuing what is, in essence, a report
3	and order on this case, and so that that on-the-record
4	presentation is going to take on more of the
5	characteristics of a full-blown hearing.
6	So I wanted to come in today so we can discuss
7	exactly how we're going to need to proceed on Friday, who
8	witnesses will be and so forth.
9	Of course, the Commission needs to have
10	sufficient law and facts in order to make a decision, and
11	from my perspective, I need to have sufficient law and
12	facts in order to write a decision that may have to stand
13	up to appeal to a higher court.
14	So I'm going to start by asking Missouri-
15	American to explain what witnesses they anticipate having
16	on Friday and what they're going to be addressing.
17	MR. ENGLAND: Your Honor, you've answered one

necessary, yes.

MR. ENGLAND: If that's the case, I think we would probably utilize Mr. Ed Grubb as our witness. I'm not aware of anyone else that would be our witness at

of the questions I was going to pose to you, and that is,

you do anticipate taking evidence and having witnesses on

- 1 this time.
- 2 Although there doesn't appear to be an issue
- 3 with respect to the prudence of the investments, but if
- 4 there is some questions regarding the investments
- 5 themselves, we might have to bring Mr. Frank Kartmann in.
- 6 Hopefully, we'll determine that in the context of the
- 7 prehearing conference today.
- 8 RLJ WOODRUFF: That was Kartmann?
- 9 MR. ENGLAND: K-a-r-t-m-a-n-n.
- 10 RLJ WOODRUFF: Now, one thing I've noticed
- 11 that's not really been discussed by anybody in the
- various reports that have been filed is exactly what
- 13 these investments are.
- 14 And that's something Mr. Kartmann would have to
- 15 address? Not necessarily whether or not there is an
- issue of their prudence, just to what they are, so I have
- some facts to put in my report and order.
- 18 MR. ENGLAND: They are explained in the
- 19 verified application, which we would anticipate making an
- 20 exhibit for purposes of this case.
- 21 Generally they fall into two categories: the
- 22 infrastructure replacements themselves, and as I
- 23 understand, facility relocations caused by governmental
- 24 bodies such as the Highway Department, those two general.
- Now, the specific items are actually listed in

- 1 the attachments to the verified application.
- 2 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay. All right.
- 3 And what is Mr. Grubb's title?
- 4 MR. ENGLAND: I'll let you know in just a
- 5 second.
- 6 Director of Rates and Revenues.
- 7 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- 8 Is that Mr. Grubb back there?
- 9 MR. ENGLAND: That's correct.
- MR. GRUBB: Yes.
- 11 RLJ WOODRUFF: Good morning, sir.
- 12 And he would be able to address the issues that
- have been raised by the other parties?
- 14 MR. ENGLAND: We anticipate so, yes, at least
- 15 the issues that have been identified in the preliminary
- list of issues that were filed yesterday.
- 17 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- 18 All right. Anything else you want to add,
- 19 Mr. England?
- MR. ENGLAND: I don't think so.
- 21 Thank you.
- 22 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay. Move over to Staff then.
- 23 MR. KRUEGER: I think, Your Honor -- I believe
- that the Staff's only witness would be Steve Rackers.
- 25 It's possible that Dale Johansen may also testify, but I

- 1 think it will probably only be Mr. Rackers.
- 2 RLJ WOODRUFF: And Mr. Rackers is the Staff
- 3 person that prepared these reports that the Staff has
- 4 filed?
- 5 MR. KRUEGER: Yes, he is.
- 6 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- 7 And if Mr. Johansen were to testify, what would
- 8 he address?
- 9 MR. KRUEGER: Right now I can't anticipate
- 10 anything other than possibly the nature of the
- infrastructure system replacements and whether they
- 12 qualify, possibly also rate design.
- 13 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- Is that an issue in this case at this point?
- 15 MR. KRUEGER: Well, there is -- I believe there
- 16 is still a question about whether the surcharge should be
- applied only to usage or whether it should be based on
- 18 usage and the customer service as well.
- 19 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- 20 And for Public Counsel.
- 21 MS. O'NEILL: We will not have any witnesses.
- 22 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- 23 And for the Missouri Energy Group?
- 24 MS. LANGENDECKERT: Billie LaConte from the
- 25 organization of Drazen Consulting will be there on Friday

- and will answer any questions relating to our response to
- 2 the Staff's -- the MAWC reply of the Missouri-American
- 3 Water request.
- 4 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- 5 And for the Missouri Industrial Energy
- 6 Consumers.
- 7 MS. VUYLSTEKE: We will have Mike Gorman from
- 8 the firm of Brubaker & Associates as our witness, and he
- 9 will testify.
- 10 RLJ WOODRUFF: What was that name again?
- 11 MS. VUYLSTEKE: Mike Gorman, G-o-r-m-a-n.
- MS. WOODRUFF: Okay.
- And what is his specialty?
- 14 MS. VUYLSTEKE: He is a consultant in the area
- of utility rate design and regulation.
- 16 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- MS. VUYLSTEKE: Is that what you asked, what
- 18 his specialty was?
- 19 RLJ WOODRUFF: Yes, that's what I asked.
- MS. VUYLSTEKE: Sorry.
- 21 RLJ WOODRUFF: Now, it appears based on the
- list of issues that was filed yesterday, that these
- 23 issues tend to be based on interpretation of the recently
- 24 passed statute.
- Is that what everyone would agree upon?

- 1 MR. ENGLAND: Correct.
- 2 MS. O'NEILL: Yes, I think so.
- 3 MR. KRUEGER: Yes, I believe so.
- 4 MS. LANGENDECKERT: Yes, Your Honor.
- 5 RLJ WOODRUFF: Are there any factual issues
- 6 that need to be resolved by the Commission?
- 7 MR. ENGLAND: It's difficult to say,
- 8 Your Honor. I think a lot of it may be more
- 9 interpretive, but maybe we can flush that out further in
- 10 the prehearing conference this morning.
- 11 RLJ WOODRUFF: Okay.
- 12 I would certainly appreciate that if you could.
- I will expect you to discuss this today, as
- 14 Mr. England indicated, to possibly flush out some issues
- 15 here, maybe resolve some things.
- 16 I'm going to ask you to give me a report when
- you've completed that. We won't do that on the record.
- 18 But if you want to hand write out something and bring it
- 19 up to me.
- MR. ENGLAND: Okay.
- 21 RLJ WOODRUFF: It does not need to be filed
- officially with the Commission. Just get it to me, and
- 23 that way I can pass it on to the Commissioners tomorrow
- in agenda.
- 25 Any other matters that anyone wants to take up

- 1 while we're on the record?
- 2 MR. KRUEGER: I guess I'm maybe interested in
- 3 knowing what you anticipate as the procedure that will be
- 4 followed.
- I assumed that the Company's witnesses will
- 6 testify first, followed by the usual cross-examination
- 7 and then --
- 8 RLJ WOODRUFF: -- questions from the Bench,
- 9 yes.
- 10 I would anticipate it would be as you
- 11 indicated, the Company witnesses go first, followed by
- 12 Staff, Public Counsel and the interveners.
- 13 If you want to do it in a different order than
- 14 that, just let me know.
- MR. ENGLAND: Your Honor, I have no problem
- with that order, but I would like the opportunity to
- 17 close --
- 18 RLJ WOODRUFF: Sure.
- 19 MR. ENGLAND: -- depending on the testimony
- 20 that is elicited from the closing witnesses.
- 21 RLJ WOODRUFF: And I would anticipate that the
- 22 parties would offer opening statements, and I think
- 23 probably closing statements would be appropriate as well.
- 24 We can discuss this more on Friday after we see
- 25 how things go, but I'm going to anticipate at least one

1	round of briefs, probably only one, and for that reason I
2	think a closing statement would be helpful for all of the
3	parties, to be sure of what positions the parties are
4	taking for the hearing. And, you know, we'll finalize
5	that on Friday.
6	Any other matters that anyone wants to bring
7	up?
8	All right.
9	With that, then, the on-the-record portion of
10	this prehearing conference is adjourned.
11	Thank you all very much.
12	WHEREUPON, the on-the-record portion of the
13	Prehearing Conference was concluded.
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
