 $\label{eq:JUDGE PRIDGIN: Good morning.}$ We are on the record.

This is the prehearing conference for files number WR-2022-0303 and SR-2022-0304, and these are for the file entitled -- or excuse me, the files entitled In The Matter of Missouri American Water Company's Request for Authority to Implement General Rate Increase for Water and Sewer Service Provided in Missouri Service Areas.

I am Ron Pridgin. I am the regulatory law judge assigned to preside over this prehearing conference that's being held via Webex on August 3rd, 2022, and the time is approximately 10:03 in the morning.

I would like to get entries of appearance from counsel, please, beginning with Missouri American Water Company.

DEAN COOPER: This is Dean

Cooper from the law firm of Brydon, Swearengen

& England, PC, PO Box 456, Jefferson City,

Missouri 65102 appearing on behalf of Missouri

American Water Company, and I will allow

Mr. Luft and Miss Niemeyer to make their

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entries.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right.

Thank you.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right.

Thank you, counsel.

Any entry on behalf of the commission staff?

JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right, Miss Bretz. Thank you.

Any entry on behalf of the Office of the Public Counsel?

JOHN CLIZER: John Clizer on behalf of the Office of Public Counsel, business address 200 Madison Street, Suite

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650, PO Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. Thank you. JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Clizer, thank you. And we have some applicants to intervene. I am going to go through those in no particular order, and then see if I have inadvertently skipped over anyone. Do I have an entry of appearance on behalf of Triumph Foods, LLC? JOSHUA HARDEN: Yes. This is Joshua Harden with the law firm of Collins & Jones, PC at 1010 West Foxwood Drive, Raymore, Missouri 64078, on behalf of Triumph Foods, LLC. JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Harden, thank you. Any entry on behalf of Missouri Industrial Energy Consumers? Okay. No entry. Any appearance on behalf of Sunnydale Properties? STEPHANIE BELL: Yes, Your Honor. Stephanie Bell with Ellinger &

Associates, 308 East High Street, Suite 300,

Jefferson City, Missouri, on behalf of Sunnydale Properties. Thank you.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right.

Thank you, counsel, and I just got an e-mail from Mr. Steinmeier, that he has entered his appearance via e-mail. He is not able to connect but he is watching or observing, so I will say Mr. Steinmeier has entered an appearance, and madam court reporter, let me get you his information.

It is William D. Steinmeier, last name spelled, S, as in Sam, T, as in Thomas, E-I-N, as in Nancy, M as in Mary, E-I-E-R, 2031 Tower Drive, Jefferson City, Missouri 65109. That is Mr. Steinmeier's entry.

I believe we have others. Empire

District, Miss Carter, counsel for Empire

e-mailed me and said she had not planned to

appear, so I have excused her appearance.

Any entry on behalf of Public Water Supply District #2 of Andrew County?

JAMES FISHER: Yes, Judge. On behalf of that intervenor, my name is James M. Fisher of the law firm Fisher & Dority, PC. Our address is 101 Madison Street, Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right, Mr. Fisher. Thank you.

I think I have got everyone. Have I overlooked anyone?

Okay. Let me go over a couple of things I want to talk about, and then I will see if you have anything you would like to talk about before I disconnect on my end and let you talk.

That reminds me, technology being what it is, and technology operators like me being what they are, this call should continue after I disconnect, but if some reason, it doesn't, I would suggest you have an alternative way to communicate, whether you call back into this Webex or another way. It should not happen. I just want to alert you in case it does happen, I apologize, and trust you will be able to talk some other way.

Also, for benefit of the court reporter, if you will please state your name before you make your statement, because we are not in the hearing room together, she can't see who is talking, so it may be hard for her to discern who is speaking.

I do have, I think, an unopposed motion to consolidate, which I do plan on granting. I don't recall having any objections or any comments at all, so unless somebody states otherwise, I will plan on issuing an order granting the motion to consolidate these two files.

Let me ask of Missouri American, I don't know if the time has run for all the

applications to intervene. Let me double check. I don't think it has, so Mr. Cooper or other counsel for Missouri American, I don't necessarily want you to put you on the spot if you are unable to proceed today, but if you know, do you have any objections to any of the applications to intervene?

DEAN COOPER: Judge, this is Dean Cooper. As to the timely applications to intervene, we have no objection.

As to the two that were filed out of time, I don't believe we are going to file a written objection, but we will leave that to you and the Commission as to how you want to handle this.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right, Mr. Cooper. Thank you. I appreciate that.

I think the only other thing I want to go over, I think, traditionally, I would order the parties to file a proposed procedural schedule roughly a week after today's prehearing conference.

So, does anyone see any issue with filing a schedule or competing schedules on or about August 10th?

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Okay. I am not hearing any objections on that, and I will follow-up with a written order to put into EFIS, so I will order a proposed procedural schedule or schedules on August 10th.

I also think both staff and public counsel filed pleadings on Missouri American's proposed test year and discreet adjustments and going toward -- along with the parties talking about a schedule, I would like the parties to talk about if you have any dispute on the test year and discreet adjustments that need a ruling from the Commission, and if you will so inform me also on August 10th, either in the same pleading or in a separate pleading, whichever you prefer, because I read the pleadings, there may be some alternatives that allow for some sort of middle ground where the parties can maybe work out any disputes they have. But if not, please let me know by August 10th and the Commission will rule on the disputes.

I have February 3rd -- excuse me, the weeks of February 13th and 20th blocked off for the hearing room for the evidentiary

hearing. And so, I would encourage the parties to use those weeks.

I am not going to tell you what days or weeks to ask for, but that's -- I just want to let you know, I have grabbed those weeks and was kind of working back from the operation of law date, those look like good times to schedule the hearing, but if you request -- I mean you are certainly welcome to request another time if you want.

I think the only other thing is -that I want to talk about is just a reminder
of what should be the obvious by now, but any
local public hearings or evidentiary hearings
could be completely in-person, completely
virtual or hybrid, and that may change at any
moment depending on the Commission's
preferences and depending on COVID-19.

And like I said, I am sure you already knew that. I would expect an amendment that the Commission would want to continue with a hybrid schedule going forward, but I don't know that for sure.

So, I just wanted to alert you of what should be obvious, is is that we may have

to change at a moment's notice from in-person to hybrid or to virtual.

I think that is all that I have for the parties. Is there anything that the parties want to bring to my attention before I jump off the call?

JOHN CLIZER: Your Honor, John Clizer with OPC just a couple of quick follow-up questions.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: Yes, please.

JOHN CLIZER: In a similar vein to the evidentiary hearing, is there a deadline by which you want parties to have finalized briefs prior to the operation of law date?

I know the Commission in the past has set a certain amount of time. I just need to know for scheduling purposes.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: That's a good question. I mean, that's something I would hope you would address in your proposed procedural schedule.

I would certainly want --

JOHN CLIZER: It will be --

JUDGE PRIDGIN: -- the court

reporter to expedite transcripts -- I am sorry. Go ahead.

MR. CLIZER: It certainly will be addressed, obviously. I just wanted to know if, for example, the Commission believes it needs thirty days before the operation of law date just for purposes of setting the schedule.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: I think the Commission would prefer to have an order, and a report and order noted out thirty days prior to the operation of law date, which I think would be roughly April 28th or thereabouts.

So, you know, working backwards from that, certainly we want, I think, reply briefs no later than the middle of April, maybe initial briefs, say, you know, late March, early April, however, if that gives you some sort of ballpark, Mr. Clizer, as to kind of how to plan.

DEAN COOPER: Yeah, Judge. This is Dean copper.

Real quick, I think along similar

lines to the conversation you just had with Mr. Clizer, in terms of the hearing dates, given that, if we can work towards the briefing, the completion of the reply briefs similar to what you just talked about, I took it from your earlier comments that the hearing dates that you have reserved are not necessarily -- there is no magic about those two dates if -- as long as we can get you a briefed case by thirty days out or so ahead of the operational law date.

Would that be a correct interpretation?

JUDGE PRIDGIN: I think so, and all of this is with the caveat that I -- any commissioner might -- I mean, it's unlikely, but any commissioner might veto a proposed procedural schedule saying that doesn't meet with my schedule, I want to do something else.

It's unlikely, but it's possible.

I just wanted to be sure you knew that you and

I may think we have got good dates and then I

take it to the Commission and maybe the

commissioner says, no, that doesn't work for

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me.

DEAN COOPER: Thank you, Your

Honor.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: You are You are welcome. welcome.

Anything else I can do for the parties before I drop off the call?

JOE BEDNER: Could you just repeat the proposed hearing dates again? I apologize.

JUDGE PRIDGIN: Sure. The goal would be for the Commission to vote out a report and order thirty days before the operation of law date.

So, you know, working backwards from what I think the operational law date is is May 28th. If the Commission can vote out an order roughly April 28th, and so working backwards, maybe a reply brief due anywhere from early to mid-April.

If that gives you some sort of timeframe to let you know how to try to build a schedule.

> JOE BEDNER: Thank you.

> JUDGE PRIDGIN: You are

welcome.

Anything further from the parties before I drop off the call?

Okay. Hearing nothing further, that will conclude the on-the-record portion of today's prehearing conference.
