Hello,

This email is in response to the custom notice letter I recieved regarding a severe increase in rates by Aqua Missouri for the service they provide us in the Maplewood Subdivision East of Sedalia, MO.

It is my understanding that rate increases of this nature have to be justified based on improvements made to the system overall.

With that being said, I know of no improvements that have been made since Aqua Mo purchased the system. I don't doubt that they've spent money maintaining the system but, my neighbors and I know of no improvements. In addition, we recently recieved a letter stating that they were going to paint the "stack tank" which required us to spend the next three to four week drinking and cooking w/ bottled water. They've also requested that we "conserve" water and if we don't they will impose mandatory conservation efforts that can be punishable if not followed.

My question is, are they legally able to provide us w/ untreated water for 3 - 4 weeks while they paint something. What I'm paying now is supposed to be for safe, clean, treated water. Now I'm buying bottled water. Also, why would they pick the hottest time of year when water needs and uses are at an all time high to go on an "auxillary pump" and presumeably be pumping untreated water, there again to paint something. It also aggraves me that as an individual whose fortunate enough to own a swimming pool, that I have to pay what I think are already too high of rates, mostly for unused sewer, to maintane my pool. This is water that is not going through the sewer.

I have no idea what it cost to run and mainane a water system such as ours and I realize that all business need to profit. However, I dosent' really seem to me and my neighbors that were getting what we pay for as it is, much less with a rate increase of 256.27% for water and 115.84% for sewer.

We are at the mercy of you, the Office of the Public Counsel, to look out for us. We trust that you look all the issues before making your decision.
