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JUDGE PRIDGIN: Good evening. This is the local public hearing for Raytown Water Company, Case Number WR2005-0052. The purpose of this hearing is to hear customers' comments on the proposed rate increase.

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If you have specific questions or service complaints, I would ask you to see staff members, and I believe you have already probably met them. If you are with the staff or office of public counsel, if you could please raise your hand for folks who may want to ask you questions. Thank you very much.

If you want to testify, you'll need to sign up. I have a sign-up sheet up here, and I have a witness who has already volunteered to testify.

If you are wanting to say something today and you forget, you can always contact staff or the office of public counsel after the hearing.

Let me give you phone numbers if you're interested. If you want to contact staff, you can reach them at 573-751-3234. And the office of the public counsel you may reach at 573-751-4857 When we get started, we will be on the record. I'll ask you to spell your name for the

court reporter and speak clearly. I'll ask that

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1 only one person speaks at a time. 2 Does anyone have any questions before we 3 get started? All right. Seeing none, we will begin 4 the local public hearing. The Missouri Public Service Commission has 5 6 set this time for local hearing in case WR2005-0052 7 in which Raytown Water Company seeks to implement a 8 rate increase. The Missouri Public Service 9 Commission regulates the rates charged by 10 investor-owned utility companies in Missouri to 11 ensure that those rates are just and reasonable. 12 The commission also regulates the quality of service 13 and safety of the operations of investor-owned 14 utilities. 15 The commission is made up of five 16 commissioners, one of whom is here this evening. 17 The commissioners are appointed by the governor to 18 fix terms and confirmed by the senate. The 19 commissioners employ a staff of engineers, 20 accountants, attorneys, financial analysts, and 21 other specialists in the field of utility 22 regulation. 23 I'm a regulatory law I'm Ron Pridgin. 24 judge for the Missouri Public Service Commission, 25 and I will preside over this evening's hearing.

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With me today is Commissioner Murray. Also, staff 1 2 counsel, Cliff Snodgrass, and from the office of 3 public counsel, Ruth O'Neill. 4 This is an official hearing of the Missouri 5 Public Service Commission, and the statements and testimony of witnesses will be recorded by the court 6 7 reporter and must be given under oath. All of the commissioners will have a chance to read all of your 8 9 remarks. 10 The purpose of this hearing is to hear from 11 you on the subject of the proposed rate increase. 12 The company will not present witnesses and will not 13 answer your questions on the record. This is your 14 chance to testify and your remarks will be made an 15 official part of the record of this case. 16 I will call the name of each witness who 17 has signed up. I will call you in the order in 18 which you signed up. When I call your name, please 19 come forward and stand at the witness lectern. 20 Please spell your name for the court reporter so she 21 can put it in the record correctly. 22 I will ask you a couple of preliminary 23 questions, such as your name and address, and you 24 can then make your statement. There then may be 25 questions from the commissioner or from me. And

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1 please do not leave the witness area until you are 2 excused. 3 There may be someone who wishes to testify, but, because of religious faith, cannot take an 4 5 oath. If so, please tell me when I ask you to be 6 sworn so that I may affirm your testimony instead. 7 Does anyone have any questions about the procedure? All right. Seeing none, this begins the 8 public hearing on case WR2005-0052 in the matter of 9 10 the request of Raytown Water Company for a rate 11 increase pursuant to the commission's small company 12 rate increase procedure. 13 Will counsel make their entries of 14 appearance, beginning with staff, please. 15 MR. SNODGRASS: Good evening, Your Honor. 16 My name is Cliff Snodgrass. I represent the 17 interest of the staff of the Missouri Public Service 18 Commission. And my general business address is 19 Suite 800, Governor's Office Building, Jefferson 20 City, Missouri. 21 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Snodgrass, thank you. 22 On behalf of the office of the public counsel, 23 please. 24 MS. MR. DAVIS: 7 I can shortly. If you would, please, JUDGE PRIDGIN: 8 approach the witness lectern and raise your right 9 10 hand to be sworn, sir. (The oath was administered by Judge 11 Pridgin.) 12 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Thank you very much, Mr. 13 Just a couple of questions for you. 14 Davis. EXAMINATION 15 16 BY JUDGE PRIDGIN: Would you please state and spell your name for the 17 Q. 18 record, sir. Justin W. Davis. J-u-s-t-i-n, D-a-v-i-s. 19 Α. And your address, please, sir? 20 Q, 7219 Crisp Avenue. 21 Α. Is that here in Raytown? 22 Q. 23 Α. Raytown, Missouri, 64133. And are you currently a customer of Raytown Water 24 0. 25 Company? 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1	A. Yes, sir.
2	Q. Anything you would like to say, sir?
3	A. I have just been in correspondence since we were
4	informed as citizens of this increase, and I just
5	want to express my support for the commission's
6	findings.
7	JUDGE PRIDGIN: All right. Mr. Davis, let
8	me see if we have any questions just briefly.
9	Commissioner Murray, any questions for Mr. Davis?
10	EXAMINATION
11	BY COMMISSIONER MURRAY:
12	Q. How long have you been a customer of Raytown Water
13	Company?
14	A. Paying myself, four years.
15	Q. And have you been pleased with the service?
16	A. We have not had any difficulties.
17	Q. Did I understand correctly that you are here in
18	support of what has been proposed?
19	A. On behalf of the commission, the lower totals that
20	you found through your audit, yes, I'm in support of
21	that.
22	COMMISSIONER MURRAY: Thank you.
23	JUDGE PRIDGIN: And I think, just to
24	clarify it, Mr. Davis, are you testifying that you
25	support the agreement that the staff of the
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commission and the company have reached? 1 2 THE WITNESS: I am not aware of the 3 agreement. I am only aware of what the findings in your report show. The city was asking for a little 4 5 over 600,000, and your audit showed about 250,000 was necessary. That is all I'm aware of at this 6 7 moment. JUDGE PRIDGIN: And I think we're saying 8 9 the same thing. I just wanted to clarify for the 10 record what it was you were saying. 11 Counsel, any questions for Mr. Davis? 12 EXAMINATION BY MR. SNODGRASS: 13 Briefly, sir, I assume you -- did you read the blue 140. 15 informational sheet when you came in this evening? 16 Yes, sir. Α. 17 It indicates that the agreement worked out between Q. 18 the staff and the company amounted to a \$273,757 rate increase? 19 20 Yes, sir. Α. Is that the figure that you support here this 21 Q. 22 evening? 23 That is the figure I support. Α. MR. SNODGRASS: That's all the questions I 24 25 have. Thank you. JOHN M. 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1	JUDGE PRIDGIN: Ms. O'Neill?
2	EXAMINATION
3	BY MS. O'NEILL:
4	Q. Mr. Davis, thanks for coming. We had a little bit
5	of conversation earlier, and I just wanted to know
6	whether you had an opinion about the proposal for a
7	surcharge on the bills in addition to the rest of
8	the rate increase.
9	A. I'm not informed of all the details. I have trust
10	that the two commissions, through their findings,
11	will probably come up with, like on the other
12	number, a different number. And I would, once
13	again, support the commission's or the two
14	commissions' findings over what our water company
15	here locally is requesting.
16	MS. O'NEILL: Thank you. No further
17	questions.
18	JUDGE PRIDGIN: Thank you. Mr. Davis, I
19	don't have any further questions for you. Thank you
20	very much for your attendance and for your
21	testimony, sir. You may be excused. Thank you.
22	THE WITNESS: Thank you.
23	JUDGE PRIDGIN: I don't see anybody else
24	who has signed up to testify. Does anyone else wish
25	to testify this evening?
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1 Seeing no further witnesses, Commissioner 2 Murray, is there anything you would like to add? 3 COMMISSIONER MURRAY: No. I'm pleased that 4 we at least had one person who wanted testify, 5 because we are interested in hearing what the people 6 who are customers of the water company have to say, 7 so thank you very much. 8 JUDGE PRIDGIN: I would certainly echo the 9 commissioner's comments, and I appreciate, Mr. 10Davis, your testimony and everyone else's attendance 11 this evening. Anything further from counsel? 12 MS. O'NEILL: No, Your Honor. 13 MR. SNODGRASS: Nothing from staff, Judge. JUDGE PRIDGIN: Seeing nothing further, if 14 15 there are no further questions. 16 MR. DAVIS: I have already been up there, 17 but I have one comment to make. I think a lot of 18 people would have preferred a little more disclosure 19 prior to the construction. I think there is 20 probably -- they were planning, of course, before 21 the groundbreaking to go ahead and change the mains. 22 And I think, just so the citizens could have been 23 informed, you know, nine to eight months ahead of 24 time instead of a month or two ahead of time when 25 they planned on implementing it. I think the

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citizens would appreciate disclosure when they are 1 2 planning things, not after they have already 3 accomplished what they planned. JUDGE PRIDGIN: Mr. Davis, thank you. 4 And 5 based on your further testimony, let me double-check 6 and see if we have any further questions, first from 7 the commissioner. 8 COMMISSIONER MURRAY: I don't believe so, 9 thank you. JUDGE PRIDGIN: And from counsel? 10 11 MR. SNODGRASS: None from staff, Judge. 12 MS. O'NEILL: No, Judge. 13 JUDGE PRIDGIN: Thank you. If there is 14 anything further? 15 Hearing nothing further, that will conclude 16 this local public hearing. Thank you very much for 17 your attendance this evening.
