(1) In Case No. WR-2007-0216 the parties agreed to a \$29,000,000 rate increase with a \$300,000 imputation of revenue for the St. Joseph district resulting in a net increase of \$28,700,000 for water. Subsequent to the agreement the parties found a \$236,416 error in the calculation of water chemical expense. This reduced the

overall increase in water to \$28,463,584. See Report and Order and Efis item 330.

(2) In Case No. WR-2003-0500 and WC-2014-0168 Joplin received a \$350,000 rate decrease.
